
COLLATORS:

FOOD PANTRY VOLUNTEERS

Each of the six congregations of the Cooperating Churches of Sussex is assigned a specific day each month to serve at the Sussex Food Pantry. St. James is assigned the second Saturday of each month. We have a core group of dedicated people who have served but changes in schedules occasionally limit the number of people available for these assigned Saturdays. Volunteers work from 9 a.m. to Noon on the second Saturdays. They stock shelves and help distribute food. A number of high school age youth work with their parents and find this to be a wonderful family service opportunity. The up-coming dates are: **August 10, September 14, and October 12.** About four volunteers are needed for each Saturday. Catholics Returning Home ~ Do you know someone who has left the Church? Most of us do not have to look very far to find non-practicing Catholics in our circle of family and friends. Many of us are concerned about these loved ones; however, we don't know how to help them. Obviously, most of them are searching, but how can we help them find their way home?

As baptized, practicing Catholics we have a precious gift of faith and love from the Lord that needs to be shared with our non-practicing brothers and sisters. First, we need to pray for them. Secondly, we need to extend a personal invitation to them to come home to the Catholic Church. Most nonpracticing Catholics are waiting for an invitation to return. Many mistakenly think they are excommunicated and are not welcome to return for a variety of reasons.

Many non-practicing Catholics carry a tremendous amount of guilt and misinformation about the Church so they are afraid of approaching the Church for fear of being rejected. You can make a tremendous difference in someone's life simply by reaching out to them and telling them that we miss them and would like for them to come back home to our Church family. The Two Saints (St. James and St. Mary) and a Good Shepherd cluster coupled with the St. Anthony (Menomonee Falls) and St. Agnes (Butler) cluster have a special program to help non-practicing Catholics return to the Church called **Catholics Returning Home**.
