

From The Servant's Quarters

I wonder what it would be like to die, feeling I had not achieved my purpose in life. This past week we witnessed great pageantry in celebration of a man bigger than life, who achieved much in his life. I imagine Nelson Mandela would still have liked to have accomplished even more. But it is quite a gift to the world to bring greater justice and equality to South Africa, and to witness the great spirit of reconciliation he demonstrated in uniting white and black South Africans. This bigness of heart was forged during his time of suffering 27 years in captivity.

In today's gospel, we hear of another "jailbird." John the Baptist hears of the preaching and ministry of cousin Jesus. It's not quite in the same style John used. He sends messengers to ask Jesus, "Are you 'he who is to come' or do we look for another?" Jesus responds to the messengers: "Tell John what you see and hear: the blind recover their sight, cripples walk, lepers are cured, the deaf hear, dead men are raised to life **and the poor have the good news preached to them.**"



Jesus performs the classic signs that are expected to accompany the Messiah - "He who is to come!" John can endure his prison suffering and martyrdom knowing that he did his part in "preparing the way of the Lord."

How about you and me? Could we have the same peace of mind while languishing in a prison cell, or fading from this world on our deathbed? What is our "purpose in life?" We are not Nelson nor John nor Jesus. They did what was theirs to do. What is the Almighty asking of each of us?

These Advent days we prepare for the Lord's return by waiting in silence, by listening to the voice of our Creator whispering to us how we are to bring sight and healing and new life to others. This Third Sunday of Advent is called "Rejoicing Sunday." We rejoice that our God invites us to continue participating in the saving deeds of the Messiah, "Who was, Who is, and Who is to come!"

As a kid, I loved cleaning out my closet this time of year. I eagerly made room for the new presents I would soon find under the Christmas tree! (To

this day the chastising words of my grandmother, Grace, still haunt me, "You are a greedy little thing!" Yes, I was making room for more! If you are making room for more, perhaps there are items you can share with the needy. The Capuchin Apartments can use small appliances for the residents who once were homeless. Towels and underwear are in great demand at St. Ben's for those who stop in for a refreshing shower. Or perhaps there is another need that the Lord is whispering in your heart.

"Let us walk in the light of the Lord. Let us prepare a highway for our God."

A guy asked his wife what she would like for Christmas. She answered, "Something that goes from 0 to 200 in three seconds." So he bought her a scale.

**A Note from the Parish Nurse,
Pam Dennis:**

The use of CPR, which stands for cardio pulmonary resuscitation, dates all the way back to 1740. Given properly and immediately to sudden cardiac arrest victims, CPR can save lives. In the 1960's, with the formal endorsement of CPR and the start of a program to acquaint physicians with closed-chest resuscitation, the American Heart Association became the forerunner of CPR training for the general public. Today, through its global training network of close to 300,000 instructors and more than 3500 authorized Training Centers, the AHA trains more than 12 million people annually in CPR, first aid and advanced cardiovascular life support.

We recently had a layperson CPR class for some of our staff here at St. James. The intent was to train staff in the different work areas to assist if a parishioner should need CPR. Two staff members from Christian Formation, one from the maintenance department, another staff member involved in the art and environment and the head usher were all successfully trained.

We are planning on holding another CPR training class on January 15th, a Wednesday morning, for any interested ushers. The ushers need to contact Sue Mangan if they want to attend. I'd like to offer another class in the spring to any parishioners wishing to get trained in CPR. The cost of the class is \$28.50, if any one is interested in taking the class please let me know by e-mailing or calling the Parish Nurse, Pam.

Anyone can learn CPR – and everyone should, according to the American Heart Association. Why should you learn CPR you may ask? Here are some facts: 383,000 out-of-hospital sudden cardiac arrests occur annually and 88 percent of cardiac arrests occur at home. The life you save with CPR is most likely to be someone you love: a child, a spouse, a parent or a friend. Many victims appear healthy with no known heart disease or other risk factors. Sudden cardiac arrest occurs when electrical impulses in the heart become rapid or chaotic, which causes the heart to suddenly stop beating. A heart attack occurs when the blood supply to part of the heart muscle is blocked. A heart attack may cause cardiac arrest.

Effective bystander CPR provided immediately after sudden cardiac arrest can double or triple a victim's chance of survival, but only 32 percent of cardiac victims get CPR from a bystander according to the AHA. The American Heart Association, in honor of National CPR week this past year, put out a call for all Americans to learn how to give Hands-Only CPR (this is an AHA term) by watching a simple one-minute video at www.heart.org/cpr. If you are not able to attend a class on CPR why not take a look at the Hands-Only CPR video and become empowered to help someone in need.

The Rest of the Story

Be honest, when someone says “I am pro-life”, we immediately think they are against legalized abortion, and presume they are politically conservative. End of story. But as Paul Harvey used to say, “here is the rest of the story”.

Cardinal Joseph Bernardin, the former archbishop of Chicago, was certainly pro-life. However, in contrast to the single abortion issue focused political slogan, Cardinal Bernardin was “pro-all-life”. He was best known for his teaching about what he called “the seamless garment”. Cardinal Bernardin reminded us that our church believes that all life, given all are created by God, has intrinsic value and dignity. Our belief is seamless as in continuous, whole, complete, undivided.

As Catholics, we believe that there is a seamless dignity of life connecting all life from conception to natural death. What Cardinal Bernardin refers to as the “seamless garment”, the church refers to as the Consistent Life Ethic.

In practical application, what does this mean? It means we need to be more consistent and seamless with our laws and policies. It means that we should be concerned about protection of the child in the womb, as well as the child starving from hunger and malnutrition. It means we should be looking for ways to eradicate war, and wipe out euthanasia. It means we should oppose capital punishment, and reform our prison system providing opportunities to reform lives. The list is long. The need for human dignity is great.



Something else we believe in sisters and brothers is the power of prayer. We have an opportunity to spend some time before God, in the presence of the blessed sacrament, to pray for life – all life. For the fifth year, the deacons of the Archdiocese have organized a Holy Hour for Life. Our cluster of Good Shepherd, St. James and St. Mary’s will hold one at St. James’ Historic Chapel in Menomonee Falls on Tuesday, January 21, 2014 at 6:30PM. Please consider joining us as we ask God to guide and inspire us in this important and holy work ... to assure dignity and respect for all life. Amen.
