From The Servant's Quarters



Fields of Hope & Dreams Community Gardens

Thanks to those parish members who followed Father Mike's request to bring produce to church last Sunday. Your sharing and donations to the Cooperating Churches of Sussex's (CCOS) food pantry was very much needed and appreciated. The food pantry still needs help, so if your home garden continues to produce extra vegetables bring them to church or drop them off at the food pantry. Last week's heat finally started to ripen the tomatoes and peppers in the Field of Hope garden.



The food pantry has been anticipating the boxes of ripened fruit that we donate around this time of year. The amount/poundage of our donations skyrockets as our donations turn from light weight green leafy vegetables to the larger and heavier produce of night shades and root crops. Harvesting, cleaning, labeling, and documenting of our larger produce goes faster on Saturday mornings too. We can easily fill a car's trunk and/or backseat with our donations.

Weather conditions are always hard to predict (a testament to the last two years) but if the past serves us well, we'll have a good six weeks of harvesting before we have to start worrying about our first frost. It's hard to image a frost after this past week's heat and humidity, but our volunteer gardeners are thinking and preparing for it. The frost, like our delayed summer heat, will eventually come sometime in later October. Until then, we will continue to do our best to provide our larger donations to the CCOS food pantry.
