

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Blest Art will be visiting your parish on behalf of the Christian families in Bethlehem. For centuries, the Christians and Catholics of Bethlehem have earned a living by carving olive wood religious art to sell to visiting pilgrims. Fewer pilgrims are journeying to the Holy Land today, making it difficult for Christian artisans to support their families by the dignified work of their hands in the land of Christ's birth.

Because of the lack of work, there has been a dramatic rise in Christian emigration from the Holy Land. Christians once made up more than 63% of the population in cities like Bethlehem and its surrounding villages. Now less than 1% of the people in the Holy Land are Active Christians.



Since we started in 2001 Blest Art has helped hundreds of struggling families. Mr. Jeryes Qumseya, the president, through his own experience as a master carver, has worked to make it possible for Christians in the Holy Land to maintain both their livelihood and their ancestral homes in the land of our Lord. The proceeds from Blest Art's sales also help support community programs such as schools, elderly centers, churches, and clinics.

When Blest Art visits your parish we will have hand-carved Nativity sets, statues of many sizes, crosses, rosaries, and many other pieces of beautiful olive wood religious art. Please consider purchasing a piece of art from the Holy Land to support your fellow Christians who choose to stay and protect the holy sites where Jesus himself lived. A Note from the Parish Nurse, Pam Dennis, RN:



A few weeks ago I gave you information on the shingles vaccination. This week I'd like to talk to you about another important vaccination, the Influenza vaccination. Who needs a flu shot? Everyone is the answer!

Influenza ("flu") is a contagious disease that spreads around the United States every winter, usually between October and May. According to the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), flu is caused by the influenza virus, and can be spread by coughing, sneezing and close contact. Anyone can get the flu, but the risk is highest among children.

Symptoms come on suddenly and may last several days. They can include: fever/chills, sore throat, muscle aches, fatigue, cough, headache and runny or stuffy nose. Flu can make some people much sicker than others. These people include young children, people 65 and older, pregnant women, and people with certain health conditions – such as heart, lung or kidney disease, or a weakened immune system. Flu vaccine is especially important for these people, and anyone in close contact with them. Flu can also lead to pneumonia, and make existing medical conditions worse.

Each year thousands of people in the United States die from the flu, and many more are hospitalized according to the CDC. Flu vaccine is the best protection we have from the flu. St. James Health Ministry is partnering with the local Shopko pharmacy to offer flu vaccinations before and after Masses on the **6th of October in our Great Room**. There will be a sign up sheet in the gathering space after Masses both this weekend and next, along with the consent forms and a billing information sheet. Most health insurances cover the vaccination as well as Medicare and Medicaid plans. You can call your insurance company if you are unsure.

The cost is \$25 if you will be paying for it yourself; which is a discount from the \$30 charge if you went to Shopko on your own. Preventative healthcare is what we advocate to all parishioners. Stewardship Corner

PARISH COUNCIL is a group of men and women, 18 years of age and older, chosen from the parish community by a process of discernment. The council also includes the two parish trustees and the pastor. Councilors must be active members of St James.

Their primary tasks are to work with the pastor to provide spiritual leadership, parish direction, policy development and planning to meet the needs of this parish within the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. Parish council members attend an annual council/staff retreat, and usually serve on a committee as well, being the liaison between that committee and the Parish Council. Orientation is required for anyone interested in becoming a parish council member. Time involvement is an average of 3 to 6 hours a month including the council meeting on the second Wednesday evening and All Committee night on the first Wednesday.

Pictures of our current Parish Council are on display in the north end of the gathering area by the elevator. Please stop for a moment and familiarize yourself with their names and smiling faces. Also, notice the 5 blank spots! This means the other 7 members are doing the work of 12!

St. James' gardens will be in the news! The *Catholic Herald* to be specific.



Last Saturday a photographer from their newspaper was here shooting photos of the gardens, volunteers and the produce. After that he followed one of our volunteers to the Cooperating Churches of Sussex's (CCOS) food pantry to photograph our delivery of produce to the food pantry. The photographer couldn't say when the story would be published but a free lance reporter has also been contacting some of our volunteers to obtain some of the background story of our garden project. The reporter, now along with the photographer, will be putting the story together on our community gardens. So please watch the *Catholic Herald* and look for the story in the upcoming weeks. Once our story is published, we'll try to obtain several copies to post in our Gathering Space for all to read. Hopefully our story will encourage other churches to start or expand their existing community gardens.

Unfortunately, our gardens are starting to wane due to the seasonal shortening of daylight and the cooler temperatures. Tomatoes and peppers are diminishing and our third succession of cooler weather crops (lettuce, spinach, peas, beets and carrots) have yet to start producing. And we're watching for a frost as temperatures continue to decline. The first frost usually occurs in mid October, but weather and temperatures have been anything but typical or predictable these last couple of years.
