

Sister tells me that it was quite frightful for several days, living in that area.

❖ Sister Angela also reminds me that we are close to the start of another semester of school for the three Tanzanian children. I need to wire \$800 to Sister Angela at the beginning of November. So I would appreciate any help anyone might offer for this next term of school. The mother of the three children, Elizabeth, is extremely grateful for all the help in giving her children the priceless opportunity for an education. And her chicken business is going well to meet their day to day needs.



❖ The last time Br. Dave from St. Ben's was here he told us of the Capuchin Apartments, about a mile from the meal program. This place for the homeless caught my imagination. I had to see it for myself. What a wonderful, dignified, and simple place for people to live who, otherwise, would be on the street. There are 32 units and always filled.

❖ One gentleman was very proud to give me a tour of his efficiency apartment. He has a fully equipped kitchen, full bath, sleeping and sitting area. It was well kept. He was embarrassed that he had a few dishes in the sink!

❖ Once a month different groups bring in a meal for the residents to share in their community room. They are thrilled to receive a basic meal of meat and potatoes! Two of our St. James families will take a supper there in early December. Others who may be interested in doing this can contact Br. Rob at roem@thecapuchins.org. The day and date of the meal is flexible.

❖ I noticed they also like to keep some small appliances on hand for the residents, such as toasters and coffee makers. If you have any extra items, the Capuchins would be most happy to receive your gifts.

❖ I was touched last week to receive the "collection" some of you put together to help me find another dog. For those of you who may be new to the parish, my faithful golden retriever, Comet had to be eutha-

nized last June because of some very aggressive tumors on his spleen. Comet was 10 years old.

❖ I read a book last year by Dean Koontz called "Trixie." Dean and his wife took in a golden retriever that was in training to be a service animal. For some reason she did not make the cut. Trixie brought great joy to the author and his wife. So that is what I'm on the lookout for - a golden retriever service dog that didn't quite make the grade.

## AN OPPORTUNITY TO SERVE (LITERALLY!) FUNERAL ACOLYTES

When a death occurs the grieving family often turns to the Church for comfort and consolation especially through the prayers and rituals of our funeral services. St. James provides an exceptional bereavement ministry at the time of a funeral – from planning the liturgy; providing personalized orders of worship; having greeters at the church to assist the family as well as to welcome guests to the visitation and the Mass; through the voices of a beautiful and faithful choir; and our funeral luncheon committee which provides nourishment and a relaxing environment after the funeral. Many individuals contribute to making the funeral service go smoothly through a ministry of love and compassion.

While the greeters, choir, and luncheon committee function as a group, there is one position that operates as a singular function and that is the funeral acolyte or server. The acolyte prepares the items used for the funeral service and Mass: lighting candles, preparing the bread and wine, having the holy water and pall in place, and generally assisting the priest during the Mass. In addition the acolyte prepares the incense used in the service. The assistance of an acolyte is essential to making a funeral service run smoothly so that everyone can participate in undistracted prayer. We are grateful to those who serve in this ministry. There are opportunities for more to serve in this ministry.

Funerals are celebrated weekday mornings or evenings, and Saturday mornings (never on Sunday.) Acolytes are always “on call” as there is no long term scheduling for funerals. Being an acolyte is indeed a special privilege and honor. It is a sacred and holy task to minister at the altar and to serve the bereaved. ## Fields of Hope & Dreams Community Garden

Although our gardens are starting to wane, we will be planting garlic for next year in a couple of weeks. The garlic “seed” is from the garlic bulbs we grew over last winter and into this past spring. We donated some garlic bulbs to the Cooperating Churches of Sussex's (CCOS) food pantry for seasoning some of the canned foods for extra flavor and saved some for planting. Garlic is a self-perpetuating crop, and like our heirloom tomatoes and some of our other vegetables, we “seed save” what we can, which helps us reduce our seed purchases each spring. And we save the best.

We are wrapping up our season with a volunteer pot luck picnic before it gets cold and starting to plan for next year's gardens. Next year will be our sixth year in operation. Of course there will still be plenty of produce to harvest before we get our first frost, around mid November, but we hope the weather remains mild for a little longer which extends our growing season. After a couple of hard frosts, there will still be plenty of garden cleanup work as we prepare the raised beds for their winter hibernation. The produce final tally of our donations to the CCOS food pantry will be reported in an upcoming November bulletin.

Although we experienced different weather this year from last, we still had some very good production from our gardens. And we had some parish members donate produce from their home gardens to help supplement our church's donations. Jennifer Waltz, the director of the CCOS food pantry is very grateful for and complimentary of our gardens and donations. Thank you for supporting our garden project another year.
