Reflection

The final "Judgement of the Nations" in Matthew 25:31-46 has been described by some as our "Final Exam". In the story, God places his command to "love the Lord your God with all your heart, and all your soul and all your mind and to love your neighbor as yourself" into concrete terms.

In the last judgement, Jesus says the sheep will be separated from the goats, to the right and to the left, the righteous from the unrighteous. And the measuring stick he uses? How well we carried out the love of Christ by taking care of the least fortunate in our world – the outcasts, the strangers, the imprisoned, the sick and the poor. Gratitude for the mercy Christ has granted us is inseparable from the generosity we are to grant to our neighbor.

From The Servant's Quarters

◆ I was quite surprised to read in our Lenten study book, Matthew Kelly's recommendation on how to become a person of prayer. It's not rocket science, but in a nutshell, he suggests a commitment to a daily routine. And within that routine, a routine! What surprised me is that for the most part, that's how I've "evolved" over these many years.

◆ I wake up at 5:30 am WITHOUT an alarm clock! (It used to be Comet that got me going at this hour with his tongue out and panting in my face. I must be quick to add, since some of you are more recent in the parish - Comet was my golden retriever!)



◆ First I tend to the thermostat to get some heat going. Then I turn on the coffee that was prepared the night before. I fill the sink to soak the dishes from the previous day. The coffee is then ready for the first portion of my prayer time.

◆ I settle in to a little alcove in my bedroom which contains a prayer focus area. I have some mementos of Comet, a statue of St. Francis of Assisi, the San Damiano cross that was so meaningful to St. Francis, a lit candle from last year's retreat, and some memorabilia from my good friend, Fr. Ed, who died twelve years ago.

◆ I like to begin invoking the prayerful presence of St. Francis, St. Clare, and Fr. Solanus, a Capuchin in the process of canonization. I reflect on the previous day, thanking the Lord for allowing me to participate in his ministry. I commend to the Lord people that I've encountered the day before. I apologize for where I've fallen short of "being the best version of myself!" Then I ask for assistance during the new day.

◆ By then it's time for my second cup of coffee! It's now getting light out. I open the blinds and gaze out toward beautiful Lake Keesus. Such a view is very mind and heart-expanding. My favorite part is taking up my morning prayer book which gives a few psalms to pray. I linger over a phrase that struck me. I try to be open to what the Lord might be saying to my heart.

◆ Now I turn to the more ministerial side of my routine. I read the Scriptures for the morning Mass, soon to be celebrated. I read a couple reflections related to those readings. I ask the Lord to help me discover what might be helpful for the morning mass community. I consult the hymnal for an appropriate song. Then it's time for breakfast!

◆ I hope this Lent you are experiencing a routine of prayer that is nourishing for you. The first sign of a dynamic Catholic is being a person of regular prayer. May we be good students in the classroom of silence!

◆ *There was a person who sent ten puns to friends with the hope that at least one of the puns would make them laugh. No pun in ten did!*

Since the 1980's St. James has distributed a portion of its weekly income as a tithe for various outreach programs and organizations. This past week \$425 was donated to:



A NOTE FROM PAM, OUR PARISH NURSE:

In 2000, President Clinton, officially dedicated March as National Colon Awareness Month. Since then it has grown to be a rallying point for the colon cancer community where thousands of patients, survivors, caregivers and advocates throughout the country join together to spread colon cancer awareness by wearing blue, holding fundraising and education events and talking to friends and family about screening. I'd like to share some information with you all on colon cancer and screening of it.

Early detection is vital – over 90% of all cases of colon cancer can be prevented with recommended screening. Despite its high incidence, colon cancer is one of the most detectable and, if found early enough, most treatable forms of cancer. Most people with colon cancer will not know they have the condition until they are screened for it. This is because most cases have no symptoms. However, people who do experience symptoms may have the following: constipation, bleeding from the anus, or loose stool or diarrhea.

If you're 50 or older, getting a screening test for colon cancer could save your life. Here's how: colon cancer usually starts from polyps in the colon or rectum. A polyp is a growth that shouldn't be there. Over time, some polyps can turn into cancer but through the screening of annual fecal occult blood tests and with periodic partial or full colon exams with a colonoscopy they can be caught early and treated. According to the Colon Cancer Alliance, leaders in the field have estimated that, with widespread adoption of these screening practices, as many as 30,000 lives could be saved each year.

Now I can agree with you that a colonoscopy is not at the top of my list of preventative health measures I like to get done! But the key word in that last sentence is: "preventative". It is your health and everyone needs to become their own advocate for maintaining good health. I had my first colonoscopy last year, two years late, and thankfully I got a clean bill of health. My gastro-intestinal physician even shared with me that, "I had a beautiful colon". I am not sure it is anything I would call beautiful unless I was in her profession! So, if you are 50 or older and have not had a colonoscopy please make this month of March the month that you schedule yourself for this life saving screening. And the good news is unless you have a significant family history or they see something with your colonoscopy, you don't have to get another one for ten years.

Fields of Hope & Dreams Community Gardens

Do you know that over the last couple of years our grass cutting crew was cutting grass in March? A quick glance around the church's landscape will tell you they *may* start cutting grass at the end of April or early May depending on our spring.

The snow and more importantly the frost beneath the snow is running deeper than past years. This may delay our garden volunteers with their outdoor spring planting because the soil needs to reach a certain temperature for seeds to germinate. This may shorten our growing season which could reduce food production for the Cooperating Churches of Sussex's (CCOS) food pantry or may cause volunteers to vary the types of vegetables we grow this year.

Every year and season is different with varying challenges, like the weather which seems to be getting more unpredictable. Our severe frost conditions may require unusual measures to help melt snow and raise soil temperatures. You may notice us starting to cover our raised beds with black plastic to help melt snow and warm soil temperatures. That is if we can locate the raised beds under the snow drifts. Pray for a warming trend and rising temperatures to help bring spring about soon.

In the meantime, our garden volunteers have begun to plant seeds in their homes for starter plants for our annual spring **Plant Sale**, to be held here at church on May 17th/18th that's a little over 60 days away. Those 60 days, is a good number for seeds to grow into plants for the plant sale. Please mark your calendars for the sale and help us, as you've done in the past, support St. James' garden project and the CCOS food pantry. - 1 The sacraments of initiation are highlighted in the waters of baptism (blue wave), encountering Jesus Christ in the Eucharist (wheat colored host) and receiving the Holy Spirit in confirmation (red flame and universal icon of the dove).
- 2 The tongues of fire and the descent of the Holy Spirit that filled the early Church at Pentecost are represented in the flame and dove. The archdiocesan Synod will take place on Pentecost weekend, June 7-8, 2014, as this is a time for openness to the Holy Spirit and an opportunity to "renew within us the 'fire' that burns" (Synod prayer).
- 3 The Cross of our salvation signifies that we are redeemed by the love of God the Father through the death and resurrection of Jesus and we are given the power of the Holy Spirit to proclaim Jesus's message and to "go and make disciples."
