Reflection

"Love becomes the criterion for the definitive decision about a human life's worth or lack thereof ... Jesus identifies himself with those in need. Love of God and love of neighbor have become one: in the least of the brethren we find Jesus himself, and in Jesus we find God." (Pope Benedict XVI, *God is Love*, 2006)

There may be many ways to express our generosity, but they are all interconnected and flow from one heart. Is God calling you to live more generously?

From The Servant's Quarters

❖ Do you know what the "sin" of the desert is? To know where the water is and not tell anyone! It's a matter of life and death. In the desert, no water, no life!

❖ Jesus is catching his breath at the well when a woman from Samaria approaches. She knows where the water is. She is about to discover another source of living water that will never fail her: the Lord Jesus. Ignoring the protocol of not talking with an unaccompanied woman, Jesus enters into dialog with her. Would you call that prayer? I would. In the course of their exchange Jesus draws her into seeing who she really is. He offers her the life-giving waters of himself.



❖ The next chapter of our Lenten book reminds us that a Catholic fully alive continues to learn about the Catholic faith. In our culture today we have so many ways to do that, it may seem overwhelming. The internet puts a wealth of information about our church, the Scriptures, and spirituality at our fingertips.

❖ For those who do not use the internet, we have many fine resources available in the Great Room of the church. Various types of books and an assortment of periodicals can be borrowed there. Our local Catholic newspaper, the Catholic Herald, helps us keep in touch the church around the world as well as how our faith is lived in southeastern Wisconsin. When you are done with your copy, drop it off in the Great Room to share with others. Matthew Kelly suggests making a commitment to reading five pages a day about our faith. It's a small step but in the course of a year, we would learn a lot about ourselves, about the Lord, and how to live the faith. Such a practice is a way of "going to the well" daily for refreshment and life-giving "hydration."

❖ You might think the Samaritan woman read the Four Signs of a Dynamic Catholic! Her initial response to the refreshing encounter with Jesus prompted her to "evangelize!" She ran back home and told everyone about Jesus. "Come and see someone who told me everything I ever did! Could this not be the Messiah?"

❖ Though she may have committed other sins, the Samaritan woman did not commit the "sin" of the desert! She knew where the life-giving spiritual well was and brought her neighbors to Jesus.

❖ Prayer draws us to this Well. Spiritual reading draws us to this Well. We are refreshed and energized this Lent by Jesus. We can't keep it to ourselves. We feel compelled to share the waters of life with others as we continue to make our way through the "desert" of this world.


FISH FRY at St. Bernadettes
