

Reflection

Christ set us free for freedom; so stand firm and do not submit again to the yoke of slavery. Brothers and Sisters, you were called for freedom. But do not use this freedom as an opportunity for taking advantage of each other; rather, serve one another in love. For the whole law is fulfilled in one statement, namely, "you shall love your neighbor as yourself." But if you go on biting and devouring one another, beware that you are not consumed by one another. I say, then: live by the Spirit and you will certainly not take advantage of anyone. *Adapted from Paul's Letter to the Galatians 5:1, 13-16*

From The Servant's Quarters

♦ "What did I ever do to deserve this?" Do you ever find those words on your lips when some difficulty comes your way, sickness, a loss, or some tragic event? It seems to be a natural reaction many of us have. Such sentiments have their roots in ancient days. During the time of the Bible people thought sickness, or a handicap, or some sad and painful event happened because someone had sinned, either the person themselves, or perhaps their parents.



♦ Today's Scripture passage presents us with Jesus dispelling such a notion. The question is put to Jesus, regarding the man born blind, "Rabbi, was it his sin or his parents' that caused him to be born blind." Simple and direct, Jesus responds, "Neither!" This is an opportunity to "let God's works show forth in him." Jesus brings light to this man's darkness. Jesus brings light into the world for those willing to see. Jesus IS the light of the world.

♦ Rather than rejoice and give thanks for this powerful work of God, many of the religious leaders criticize him and grumble, and find fault. They are "blinded" by their narrow understanding of the Sabbath observance. Because Jesus spat in the dirt, made mud, and applied it to the man's eyes, He broke the Sabbath! He did manual labor!

♦ Let's reflect on what we tend to grumble and gripe about. Are we blind to a bigger picture of discovering some aspect of the Divine at work among us? We can try to set aside our grumbling and place this refrain on our lips in prayer: *Lord, I am blind. The road I cannot find. Help me to know the way. Help me to know YOUR way.*

♦ A good antidote for the poison of "finding fault" is cultivating a spirit of gratitude. One of the four signs of a Christian fully engaged in living the faith is being a grateful person. Fr. Solanus Casey, a Capuchin-Franciscan who died in the 1950's, is in the process of being formally canonized a saint in our church. One of his favorite phrases of encouragement to people was, "Thank God ahead of time." That's what he would do in his prayer. After pouring out whatever he

brought before the Lord, he would express gratitude. Fr. Solanus testified that even when a person would not receive what they were asking for, they did receive something from God, perhaps some new strength or inner peace to cope with a challenging aspect of life.

A message from Pope Francis: "Not infrequently, the arrival of migrants, displaced persons, asylum-seekers and refugees gives rise to suspicion and hostility. There is a fear that society will become less secure, that identity and culture will be lost, that competition for jobs will become stiffer and even that criminal activity will increase. ... A change of attitude towards migrants and refugees is needed on the part of everyone, moving away from attitudes of defensiveness and fear, indifference and marginalization—all typical of a throwaway culture—towards attitudes based on a culture of encounter, the only culture capable of building a better, more just and fraternal world."

U.S. Catholic Bishops Celebrate Mass of Repentance on the Border

The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops Committee on Migration, joined by bishops on the border, will travel to Nogales, AZ, March 30-April 1 to tour the U.S. Mexico border and celebrate a Mass of Repentance at 11 am CT, on April 1 on behalf of the close to 6,000 migrants who have died in the U.S. desert since 1998. The purpose of the trip is to highlight the human suffering caused by a broken immigration system, an aspect of the national immigration debate which is often ignored. The trip follows the example of Pope Francis, who, in his first trip outside of Rome, traveled to the Italian island of Lampedusa to remember African migrants who died attempting to reach Europe. During that trip, Pope Francis spoke about the "globalization of indifference" toward migrants and decried the "throwaway culture" that disposes of human beings in the pursuit of wealth. **"What we fail to remember in this debate is the human aspect of immigration – that immigration is primarily about human beings, not economic or social issues. Those who have died-and those deported each day – have the same value and innate God-given dignity as all persons, yet we ignore their suffering and their deaths."** Bishop Eusebio Elizondo of Seattle.

What is an Archdiocesan Synod?

A Synod, simply put, is an assembly where the faithful deliberate on the pastoral needs of the diocese. A diocesan synod is called by the bishop, where he gathers together ordained and lay leaders from throughout the diocese.

The Archdiocese of Milwaukee Synod will bring together people from the entire Catholic community to discuss archdiocesan and parish pastoral priorities for the Church of southeastern Wisconsin. The Synod and the sessions leading up to it should be a wonderful and exciting spirit-led process that will give the archdiocese a clearer direction of priorities for the next 10 years.


