

"Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold I am with you always, until the end of the age." *Matthew 28:19-20*

From The Servant's Quarters

❖ The word "Lent" literally means "springtime." We've been journeying through this liturgical season for the most part in winter-like conditions! Hopefully our inner experience of the new life of spring has not been stunted by the hostile weather! We promised "**Lent 2014: A Lent like no other!**" I pray that this has been your experience in preparation for a fuller participation of the dying and rising of Christ this coming week.

❖ You might be aware that we have several "holydays" on our church calendar throughout the year. These are special days in celebration of various mysteries of our faith. I've always been puzzled. Why are not the Sacred Three Days (also known as the Sacred Triduum) of "holydays of obligation?" All other observances pale in comparison to Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil. Perhaps it's just presumed that everyone will participate in these liturgies because without this foundation of faith, none of the other "holydays" would be worth remembering!



❖ Where am I going with all this? I'd like you to encourage you to participate in the liturgies of the Sacred Triduum this week. If you have never participated in any of them, how about a first step? Pick ONE to attend this year.

❖ Thursday we recall the Lord's "mandate" (That's why some churches call this "Maundy Thursday.") **Do This in memory of me!** What is the "this?" Obviously there is reference to the consecration of the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ. But the "mandate" also refers to the Lord's washing of the feet of his disciples.

❖ Jesus tells us, "As I have done for you, so are you to do for one another." Jesus is the "suffering servant" of God. He empowers us to serve one another. It's that simple! And the food He gives us in the Eucharist strengthens us for a lifestyle of responding to the needs of others. That's why it's very fitting that the collection of Thursday goes to support our St. Vincent de Paul Society.

❖ What is so "good" about Good Friday? Jesus faces squarely all that works against our well-being: human suffering, selfishness, injustice, sin. In accepting the "cup" that is His to drink, Jesus conquers once and for all by death on the cross, all that works to separate us from the eternal love and eternal life of our God. Come, walk with the Lord. Become aware that the Lord walks with us in our difficulties, our suffering, our pain. As a people redeemed, we "Behold the wood of the cross, on which has hung our salvation. Come, let us worship." The collection on this day goes to support ministry in the homeland of Jesus.

❖ The Easter Vigil is the climax. We light the new Easter Fire in our beautiful new planter just off the edge of the church patio. We proclaim "Christ, our light!" "Thanks be to God." We bless the new Easter waters. We bless ourselves to be refreshed so as to live more fully **LIFE IN CHRIST!**



### Easter Blessing of Food

The Easter blessing of food owes its origin to the fact that particular foods, namely, fresh meat and milk products, including eggs, were forbidden in the Middle Ages during the Lenten fast and abstinence. When the feast of Easter brought the rigorous fast to an end, and these foods were again allowed at table, the people showed their gratitude and joy by first taking the food to church for a blessing. Moreover, they hoped that the Church's blessing on such edibles would prove a remedy for whatever harmful effects the body might have suffered from a long period of self-denial. Today the Easter blessing of food is still celebrated in the Catholic Church.

The blessing also recognizes that food itself has an important place in the Resurrection story. Proving that He was truly risen, in Luke's Gospel, Jesus asked for something to eat. He also ate with the disciples on other occasions; and in Acts, St. Peter testified that they had eaten with the risen Lord. Although many ethnic groups celebrate the blessing, each culture has made it's own adaptations regarding the foods, prayers and ways to decorate the baskets.

Each food has a symbolic meaning. The meat is a sign of abundance and the symbol of the end of Lenten penance. The hardboiled eggs symbolize the tomb and new life. Butter and cake in the shape of the lamb remind us that Jesus is the Lamb of God, sacrificed for humanity's sins. Salt may also be included because it is necessary to sustain life and a reminder to be the "salt of the earth". Candles in the basket acknowledge that Christ is the light of the world.

On Holy Saturday, April 19<sup>th</sup> at 11:00 A.M., Deacon Mike will be blessing Easter baskets in the Chapel. (The original church.) If you wish, please join us in this celebration and start your own family tradition.

**Inspire Others to Participate in Abuse Prevention**

You can help create a safer environment for children by inspiring others to participate in your community’s abuse prevention efforts. This could be as simple as identifying one person each week who hasn’t participated in your parish’s awareness sessions or other abuse prevention activities, and offering them information about how they can help. If you focus on the baby steps—in this case, identifying and inviting one person per week to get involved in preventing abuse—during the next 12 months you could realistically recruit more than four dozen people to your community’s abuse prevention efforts. Wow! That could have some real impact. But remember . . . baby steps. Otherwise, the long-term goal may become too overwhelming to keep you inspired.

**Five Steps to Safer Environments**

The Archdiocese of Milwaukee mandates that all people who work and volunteer with children and youth in our parishes and schools must undergo safe environment education. The education details five steps to prevent child sexual abuse: Know the warning signs of an inappropriate relationship with a child.

- Know the warning signs!
- Control access to children by carefully selecting the adults who work with children and youth.
- Monitor all programs for the safety of children and youth.
- Be aware of and sensitive to what is going on in the lives of children.
- Communicate concerns to the appropriate person in authority.
