*From The Servant's Quarters*

◆ In the name of our entire faith community I say a very sincere **THANK YOU** to all who helped to make Holy Week and Easter a very inspiring, nourishing and joyful time. There are so many dimensions to these most solemn days of the year. We are very blessed to have many generous, talented, creative, and committed people serving us so we can better serve the community around us.



◆ These 50 days of the Easter Season focus us on fascinating Scriptures that express some initial experiences of the Risen Lord. Paying close attention to the details gives us a glimpse of what "risen life" is like.

◆ Did you notice that often the ones the Lord appears to do not initially recognize Him? There is some type of transformation that takes place after death. As the Risen One speaks their name, or breaks the bread, "their eyes are opened." There is a continuity of the identity of Jesus from before the crucifixion, and yet, it is a new and different presence.

◆ The Risen One no longer "comes and goes." All of a sudden He is present. We're told that the doors were locked at the place where the disciples are gathered. And then, Jesus came and stood in their midst. The Scriptures do NOT say that he passed through the locked doors. He's just "there!"

◆ And there is a reality to His presence that is different from a "ghost." Thomas can place his hands in the wounds of his hands and side. The Risen One meets the disciples at the seashore for a morning fish fry. He takes and eats. The risen life is a new and different presence, very unique compared to the presence prior to death. One has to read these Scriptures very carefully to catch what they ACTUALLY say and what they don't say.

◆ And isn't it reassuring to hear the Risen One say over and over again, "Do not be afraid. Fear not!" He is not out to "scare" us into being good. He breathes on us his Spirit, empowering us to live His life, each in the way God calls us to. His is a Spirit of peace, healing, and reconciliation. Good Pope Francis has been demonstrating this to us this entire first year of his pontificate.

◆ Hopefully our "notebook project" is helping us to breathe in the gifts of the Holy Spirit. Each week we

are invited to jot down one thing we can take from our celebration of the Mass that will help us to be a "better version" of our- selves in the coming week. I would find it inspiring to learn of what some of you are writing down. I'd be happy to share those insights with the rest of the parish in this column....anonymously of course! Drop me a line and share.

◆ And the little container we use to send Communion home is called a "pyx." If you no longer are using your pyx, please bring it back to church so others can use it.

◆ *What did the Easter Bunny say to the carrot? It's been nice gnawing you!*

**A Note from the Parish Nurse, Pam Dennis:**

Spring has finally sprung. Why not make this the spring where you take advantage of the nice weather and start a routine exercise program. The old adage of "use it or lose it" is really true. Walking is a great way to improve your cardiovascular system, in other words make your heart stronger, improve a person's attitude, increase muscle mass, joint strength and alleviate depression.

You can walk with a friend or listen to some nice music. Of course you need to start slowly and work your way up to a goal distance and time for walking. Make sure you have a water bottle to rehydrate, especially when the weather gets a little bit warmer. Remember to wear comfortable tennis shoes or whatever shoes you choose. We have some nice trails here in Waukesha county, such as the bug line trail. It is important to not walk alone if possible for your safety. For some people with arthritis, even the gentlest exercise such as walking can cause discomfort. For those people I say, "you may never be able to walk on water, but how about walking **in** water?"

A soothing alternative for those with arthritis is: aquatic exercise. The arthritis foundation and the YMCA co-sponsor water exercise programs. Our tri-county YMCA also has a Silver Sneakers program for the seniors offering many exercise classes. The Silver Sneakers program is free to those with Medicare supplemental insurance. They also offer discounted rates or scholarships for certain income levels. Lastly, the Tri-county YMCA does have a free 7 day trial for anyone interested in checking out all that they offer before actually becoming a member. So if inside sounds better to you than outside walking, the YMCA can be a great alternative.

Here at St. James we are beginning a walking program every Wednesday morning starting at 9 am. We will leave our parking lot and walk in the mobile park across the street. If fellowship while walking is what you need to get going on your exercise program come and join us! We will meet by the picnic table in front of the Community Center doors. Your health is important and you are your best advocate. Be proactive this spring and exercise for the health of it!

### **Fields of Hope & Dreams Community Gardens**



Our two new mushroom beds are set in place and ready to be planted, but we'll have to wait a bit. The beds are located on the far north west corner of St. James' property down from the Field of Dreams garden closer to the pond and set up against Willow Spring's chain link fence. Wood chips were laid down as an initial layer, followed by sawdust and a top layer of leaf/trig mulch to top them off. The mushroom spawn will arrive around the end of May. In the mean time we wait and let the beds "rot". That's right "rot". We will have to keep the beds wet to facilitate the decomposition process. As you know mushrooms are a fungus and fungus grows on rotting things. So the beds will have to sit and rot for awhile.

When the spawn arrives we'll spread it over the top of the beds and cover it with fine sawdust that we have stored in the church's garage. Bed #1 will grow Winecap mushrooms and bed #2 will grow Grey Dove Oyster mushrooms. Both mushrooms will be ready to harvest in fall. The Winecaps will be ready before the first frost, and the Grey Dove Oysters after the first frost which set them off. The last mushrooms are left in the beds so that spores fall from the mushrooms into the beds and replant themselves for the following year.

Both types of mushrooms enhance spaghetti and other boxed and canned foods which the Cooperating Churches of Sussex (CCOS) food pantry regularly receives. Next year's new beds are being planned for asparagus. Another perennial plant which once established requires tending and harvesting. But asparagus takes up to three years to establish itself, so we'll have to be even more patient. **Holy Thursday  
Foot Washing at  
Repairers of the Breach**

On Holy Thursday, parishioners from St James and Good Shepherd traveled down for the 6<sup>th</sup> annual foot washing of the poor and the homeless. This ceremony started with one person washing two people's feet. It has now grown into a joint effort between St James and God Shepherd. In addition to following the servant role of Jesus, St James takes down all of the Matthew 25 donations for the sick. This year there were 5 adults & two youth from St James and two adults from Good Shepherd. As usual, the ceremony was a moving experience for both sides of the feet being washed.

The ceremony starts with the Holy Thursday scripture being read to all present. Afterwards, the homeless are welcomed forward to have their feet washed. The parish servant reads another prayer explaining why we are following the example of Jesus. The feet are then washed in a special soap. The interaction between the people involved is always a unique experience and follows the lead of the homeless person covering whatever they want to talk about. Once the feet are washed and dried, a medicated foot ointment is applied and massaged into the feet. Finally a medicated foot powder is applied to both feet. The homeless person is then allowed to pick out a new pair of socks that fit their needs.

After an exchange of hugs there was also a small Easter Treat provided to each participant. Everyone agreed this was a perfect way to start Good Friday to Easter weekend.
