

COMPLAINERS, THIS ONE'S FOR YOU!

"...the Hellenists complained because their widows were being neglected in the daily distribution." (Acts 6:1) Thus begins the first reading for this Sunday's Liturgy. The Church sometimes needs complainers. The Greek widows were being discriminated against and were not receiving their daily portion of sustenance. So the Greek Christians rightfully complained to the Apostles, the first bishops!

Responding to the human needs of the growing number of disciples was overwhelming for the Apostles. They needed help. And so they requested that the community select seven reputable men who would be "ordained" to help the Apostles. Thus begins the order of the diaconate. Without the complaining of the Greeks there might not be a Deacon Mike Rooney or Deacon Bob Wodushek in our parish today. Sometimes the Church needs complainers.

It should be noted though that Biblical complaining is not the same as whining, bellyaching, grouching or gossiping about people in the community. Acts 6 narrates a serious problem of human concern that was being neglected by the Apostles. The complaining of the Greeks was a cry for the bishops to fulfill their duty to care for the widows.

In our time some people still seem unaware of the potential spiritual neglect caused by the shortage of priests. It is often only in time of critical need such as requesting a priest to anoint a dying relative that people are confronted with the harsh reality that none is available. At such times people feel abandoned by the Church. They may even say that they have been neglected. Such feelings often lead to anger and resentment with complaints that are usually misdirected and simply uncharitable.

There is a priest shortage. It's real. Just this month nine priests in the archdiocese were appointed to pastor two or more parishes at one time. As this trend rapidly accelerates the number of Sunday Masses and other sacramental celebrations will be reduced. Like the Hellenists in today's reading people might rightly feel neglected.

But there are solutions. Recently Bishop Erwin Krautler of Brazil met with Pope Francis and reported that his diocese had only 27 priests for 700,000 Catholics and that Mass was simply not available to many people. The Holy Father acknowledged the concern and spoke of a diocese in Mexico where many parishes had only a deacon and no priests. Francis wondered aloud how long this could go on. Bishop Krautler boldly raised the possibility of ordaining married men. Pope Francis listened and said he would encourage national bishops' conferences to address the issue, seek solutions, and submit them to Rome. In other words, the Pope appeared open to the possibility of ordaining married priests but he wants to hear the idea from the local bishops.

And who will the local bishops hear from? One lesson from Acts 6 is that sometimes the Church needs complainers. Perhaps Archbishop ListECKI and Bishop Hying may need to hear from you.

St. James' Weekly Tithes (Outreach)

Since the 1980's St. James has distributed a portion of its weekly income as a tithe for various outreach programs and organizations. This past week \$425 was donated to:

Our Space—in Milwaukee. Helps low income disabled mentally ill adults through education, support and job readiness skills.

Our latest report on the progress of the Catholic Stewardship Appeal for the Archdiocese indicates that our parish is at 73 % of our parish goal. Thanks so much to all 236 of you who have responded. Did you know that we have 2,000 households? We've contributed \$32, 017 of our parish goal of \$44,000. I bet we can make that! Last year was the first time in recent memory that St. James actually went over the parish goal. The entire goal is \$7.65 million. To date \$4.6 million has been raised from 23,621 donors. Archbishop ListECKI has gone to great lengths to assure us that this money is used for the operating expenses of the archdiocese throughout the year. In no way does it come into play with the bankruptcy proceedings. - I'm thanking you ahead of time for helping us to make our goal!

Parish Trustee Position Opening

Wisconsin Law requires that every parish have two trustees, each serving a two year term. Trustees must be parish members, practicing Catholics and at least 25 years of age. The position of **Trustee-Secretary** for St. James Parish becomes available this year. Interested candidates must submit to the Parish Office a written nomination form signed by 10 or more registered parish members. Nomination forms are available by calling Terri Weber in the Parish Office (262)253-2259 or by e-mail webert@archmil.org. All nomination forms must be received in the Parish Office by 12:00 Noon, Monday, June 2. Elections will take place the weekend **June 14 & 15, 2014**.

TRUSTEE-SECRETARY POSITION DESCRIPTION

The secretary is responsible for corporate record keeping at the parish other than financial records, such as corporate minutes, documents, notices and correspondence. One of the major responsibilities of the trustee-secretary is to ensure that parish records are kept on parish grounds in an easily accessible and orderly fashion. The trustee-secretary is responsible for maintaining records of all real property, property tax exemption, the parish inventory and the parish census. Although it is not required, the trustee-secretary could be an ex-officio member of the Personnel Committee or the Parish Planning Committee.

Plant sale this weekend after each mass - in case you didn't see the signs as you entered the church or noticed the plants displayed under the front entrance's carport. This is the only fund raiser the community gardeners do to provide us with the funds we need for the entire year. Our gardeners have put a lot of hard work into preparing these plants; germinating seeds, babying small starter plants to what you will see, and transporting, organizing and displaying these plants here at church.

We have some parishioners who have requested certain varieties of tomatoes and peppers. Other parishioners come looking for a new variety for something different to experience. We offer both with our wide selection of plants, and our "expert" gardeners can steer you to the plants you'll be most happy growing. Some parishioners commented last year that they had the best luck with our plants when compared to the other plants they purchased elsewhere.

We love to hear the feedback, which helps us improve our offerings of plants the following year. So don't hold back – tell us what you experience in your home gardens as the season progresses. Reverse Collection to Support Sussex Food Pantry



Anointing of the Sick

The Church has always prayed for the sick to be freed from pain and restored to health. Its pastoral care has its roots in the healing ministry of Jesus. The Lord was always aware of suffering and pain and responded with compassion and healing. The early Church continued Christ's healing ministry. In the Epistle of St. James we read, "Is there anyone who is sick among you? Let him summon the Priests of the Church. They should pray over him and Anoint him with oil in the name of the Lord."

The Health Ministry of St. James will be holding Anointing of the Sick at **all three Masses on May 31st & June 1st**. Father Mike and Father Jerry will be the Priests administering this Sacrament. It has become our tradition here at St. James to Anoint at our Masses so that the whole church community may take part in the healing ministry. All are welcome to assist with the laying on of the hands as our parishioners are being Anointed.
