**PEW VIEW
MASS ON THE GRASS,
WHERE THE PAST IS PRESENT**

A written history of the St. James Historic Chapel, the original church of the parish, describes an unspecified period (probably in the 1800's) like this: *“Coming to Mass at what we call the Historic Chapel the farmers would unhitch their wagons and buggies and tether the animals. When Mass was over people would congregate in front of the chapel and get caught up on all the news. Inquiries would be made about a family not in attendance. Was someone sick? Did someone need help? These conversations would take place around the tree in front of the Chapel. The pioneers referred to this tree as the ‘Gathering Tree.’ It was common for families to spend an hour after Mass chatting before heading home for chores.”* Our annual Mass on the Grass is celebrated in front of the chapel and under the “Gathering Tree.”

Imagine what parish life was like in the 1800's. In its earliest years there wasn't an assigned pastor. We were a missionary parish relying upon visiting priests – Fr. Thomas Morrisey and Fr. Martin Kundig being two of the most notable. The history of the chapel describes what might have occurred on those occasional times when the priests did come. *“Mass would be said, confessions would be heard, marriages would be blessed and babies would be baptized and after a few days the priest would go off to his next mission.”*

Past meets present. Today, we do not have a priest pastor. Our 10:30 a.m. Mass on the Grass is being celebrated by a missionary priest, Fr. David Preuss, O.F.M Cap. Fr. David is the pastor of two central city parishes: St. Martin de Pores and St. Benedict's. St. Martin's is our “sister” parish, a relationship formed many years ago for cultural, educational, and spiritual enrichment.

I suspect many people have wrongfully viewed this relationship as a one-sided “us helping them” relationship. While St. Martin's may have had some great material needs there has always been much we have received spiritually and culturally from them. Their annual participation in our Mass on the Grass has always been enriching. However, today we become the grateful recipients as the “missionary” priest comes to us and celebrates Mass. Fr. Dave has come in the past to concelebrate our Mass. However, today he stands alone as Fr. Mike is on medical leave and Fr. Jerry is on vacation.

Thank you, Fr. Dave, and the members of the St. Martin's community for being with us. Thank you for making the journey from the central part of Milwaukee to the outskirts of Menomonee Falls, to this sacred parcel of land where for 167 years people hitched their wagons and buggies and came to pray and to linger under the Gathering Tree.

We are not far from our past as we celebrate Mass, share a picnic lunch, listen to the music, enjoy friendly conversations and then...it's time to hitch up the horses and get back to the chores! Happy feast day!

Catholic Identity: The faithful discern aspects of liturgy



In the background paper, "*Liturgy*," the author Rev. John Laurance, S.J., associate professor, theology at Marquette University, Milwaukee says, "Nor is the liturgy something totally separate from the rest of Christian life in this world. Just the opposite. As ritual, it is actually a more explicit and more intense participation in Christ's once-for-all self-offering: that mystery which is at the heart of all truly human life. By stylizing

elements taken from ordinary Christian living, distilling out the essence of true human life created and redeemed in Christ, the liturgy engages participants ever more fully in those very events in Christ's life through which God created and redeemed the world in the first place (cf. Col 1:15-20; Heb 1:3; John 1:1-5, 14). As St. Leo the Great so famously writes, "What was evident in the life of the Redeemer has passed over into the sacraments."

Below are the top two priorities in liturgy voted on at the Synod

First Priority – 34% – Mass Teaching Resources

Through new, high-engaging resources, make teaching about the Mass – its structure, symbolism and meaning – a top priority in all parish and school formation programs, children through adults.

Second Priority – 29% – Weekend Music, Message and Ministries

Direct our primary attention and strategic efforts to the weekend so that the music, message and ministries form a high-impact, integrated evangelizing message of Good News, especially to the lost and seekers.

Other areas of liturgy, including worship, use of technology, promotion of sacraments such as reconciliation were discerned and will be taken into consideration as Archbishop Listecki creates his Synodal Declaration. For more information, go to www.archmil.org/Synod2014.htm.

The next key mission area to be featured will be Cultural Diversity – the second of eight areas. On September 14, Archbishop Listecki will issue a Synodal Declaration, which will include the priorities set for the Archdiocese for the next 10-15 years. The information from the Synod will assist Archbishop Listecki in his discernment process in creating this Declaration.
