

**PEW VIEW  
ROBIN WILLIAMS AND FR. MIKE**

The tragic death of comedian and actor, Robin Williams, this past week shocked many. Equally surprising was the discovery that Williams suffered from depression. News accounts emphasized that he recently suffered from “severe depression.” How could this man who epitomized laughter and joy be suffering the deep pain of depression? He was funny, spontaneous, witty, the master of improv. He brought tremendous happiness to others especially to sick and dying children where his character portrayal of Patch Adams became real.

He masked his pain well. Robin Williams’ illness was well hidden from our view. This is sometimes true with depression. Depression can lurk below the surface and dwell in the dark caverns of one’s being. Depression cannot be seen on an MRI or CAT scan. No x-ray will reveal a suspicious white spot. No biopsy would show a “depression cell.”

Not all depressions are well hidden. There sometimes are external signs, behaviors that might include mood swings, persistent unhappiness, eating disorders, sleep disorders, addictions, nervousness, anxiety – just to name a few.

I would highly recommend one look at the website from the National Institute of Mental Health <http://www.nimh.nih.gov/index.shtml>. It provides easy to understand and comprehensive information about depression. Please, read it. Talk to a medical professional about your health or seek advice if you are concerned about another person.

St. James Parish is no stranger to the topic of depression. Just two months ago Fr. Mike was directed by Archbishop Lis-tecki to pursue extensive treatment for his depression. It would be futile and unjust to attempt any comparisons other than to say that both Robin Williams and Fr. Mike suffered from depression. Fr. Mike’s letter informing the parish about his treatment for depression surprised many. Fr. Mike depressed? The priest who has the jovial appearance? The pastor who ends his weekly bulletin columns with a joke? Depressed? Hard to believe. Depression is real, it is an illness, and treatment is multifaceted. Medications might be used along with therapies, healthy diets, life-style changes, and counseling. The healing process takes hard work and time. Fr. Mike has been provided with a wonderful environment, resources, and the gift of time to assist in his healing. We continue to pray for his recovery.

The headlines and in-depth reporting of the suicide of Robin Williams gives everyone permission to speak about depression and the opportunity to develop a deeper understanding of this illness. In doing so perhaps we may come to understand ourselves better. Maybe we’ll become aware of possible warning signs in a loved one’s behaviors. We might be encouraged to seek treatment – for ourselves or for another. May some good come from this tragic death.

No witty one-liner from the late comic genius and no joke from the pastor who ends his columns with them would be appropriate here. Depression is not a laughing matter. It is an illness, a serious illness, and one that can sometimes be deadly. Treat it as such.

### **Evangelization: The faithful discern formation priorities**



In the background paper, "Formation for Discipleship," author Sandi Schmitt, D. Min. says, "Who we are as Catholics is at risk today as a growing number of adults reduce Catholic identity to a family tradition rather than as an interior disposition of discipleship that flows from a loving relationship with Christ and his Church. When Christian formation is viewed as a required hoop to jump through in order to obtain sacramental milestones, Catholic identity suffers. This distortion of Catholic identity is evident in the prevalent understanding of Confirmation as "graduation" from religious education.

"Intentional disciples never graduate from Christian formation. In fact, Blessed John Paul II states, 'the more we are formed... the more we feel the need to pursue and deepen formation' (CL, 63). Ongoing attentiveness and cooperation with the Holy Spirit are essential components of the journey towards Christian maturity."

Below are the top three priorities in Formation voted on at the Synod.

**First Priority – 26% – Universal Quality Faith Formation**  
Ensure that ALL parishes and schools in the archdiocese have access to excellent quality formation for children, youth and adults.

**Second Priority – 20% – Young Adult Opportunities**  
Offer meaningful, relevant, and compelling opportunities for young adults that relate faith to their life situations.

**Third Priority – 18% – Family Perspective Programs**  
Ensure that all programs of child and youth formation are shaped by a family perspective.

Other areas of formation such as technology, competencies and certification were discussed and discerned and will be taken into consideration as Archbishop ListECKI creates his Synodal Declaration. For more information, go to [www.archmil.org/Synod2014.htm](http://www.archmil.org/Synod2014.htm).

The next key mission area to be featured will be Catholic Social Teaching – the fifth of eight areas discerned at the Synod. On September 14, Archbishop ListECKI will issue a Synodal Declaration, which will include the priorities set for the Archdiocese for the next 10-15 years. The information from the Synod will assist Archbishop ListECKI in his discernment process in creating this Declaration.

We just celebrated the Assumption of the Virgin Mary, her reward for all her **YES** responses to God. We know that in good times and in bad Mary was a woman generous about doing what God requested. What a model for you and me! "Yes, Lord" is not an easy response. Generous, yes, but not easy. What are some of your big yeses? What blessings have they brought you....in time? And how about your **daily** yeses? You might think them insignificant, but to God every yes is **BIG** and **BLESSED**. Nothing is too insignificant in God's eyes! **FIELDS OF HOPE & DREAMS  
COMMUNITY GARDENS**

An opportunity has been presented to the volunteers to create another garden on St. James property. Some lower, older and unsightly shrubs were removed from the south end of the church building. This was done to help facilitate some outside plumbing work that had to be done. The land slopes away from the building which may require some sort of retaining wall or terrace to help transform it into a space suitable to garden. Volunteers have stepped forward to help with the construction. The question becomes: once constructed, would there be enough volunteers for the increased week to week gardening work?

Both Matthew and Luke's gospel quote the Lord as saying: "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; pray therefore the Lord of the harvest sends out laborers into the harvest." So before we expand our garden (i.e. harvests) – will you "be a laborer" (i.e. volunteer) to help garden? We are looking for additional volunteers before another space is turned into more vegetable gardens that would increase donations to the Cooperating Churches of Sussex's (CCOS) food pantry. In a prior passage Jesus states: "No one who puts his hand to the plow and looks back is fit for the kingdom of God." So, should our volunteers charge ahead with another vegetable garden and not look back, and hope and pray for the best or should we wait to see what garden "laborers" get sent to us before we expand?
