

“With all due respect...”

When someone begins with that opening phrase many times what follows lacks true respect. In fact, what follows is sometimes filled with rudeness and crudeness. This Labor Day weekend often marks the beginning of intense campaigning for the fall elections and in the debates and rhetoric to come the phrase “with all due respect” will be uttered. But will there be “all due respect?” The topic of “labor” itself this weekend may raise a number of issues with opinions being voiced on both sides.

Minimum wage: “\$15 an hour to be served a ham-burger?!” “Try and raise a family on \$9 an hour!”

Unions: “They provide protection, safety, and security.” “They’re the ones that destroyed our jobs by demanding excessive wages!”

The poor: “They’re lazy.” “They’re looking for life-sustaining jobs, transportation to get to work, assistance with child care, etc.”

Taxes: “Lower them; raise them.” “Create jobs; inhibit opportunities for growth.”

The list goes on and on. The question is, can we enter into civil and respectful dialogue? Dialogue begins when one has an open mind and a willingness to hear the other side. Introductory statements such as: “Tell me, why do we have this...” Or “Explain to me...” are good introductions. Seeking clarification with an open mind and a willingness to at least hear the opposing side is foundational.

My return to an administrative position has reminded me of the different ways people express their opinions. There is 1) the “Explain to me...” approach. This approach is greatly appreciated and begins fruitful dialogue. However, tone of voice and the addition of adjectives can change the basis for making this a positive experience. “EXPLAIN to me WHY in the world we are doing this dumb thing...” is not conducive for beginning respectful dialogue.

2) The next approach is respectful but does not want to hear anything about the other side of the issue. This approach simply but respectfully states, “Here is my opinion on this issue” or “This is what I think.” Thank you.

3) The third approach might politely be called “the dump.” Some of the characteristics of this approach often include a raised voice, pointed finger, and some vulgar language. It lacks respect, charity, and civility. It is rarely open to dialogue and generally does not have any inclination to hear the other side. In this approach there is no other side.

It seems like almost any topic or issue can generate an opposing opinion. Even in today’s Gospel, Jesus’ announcement of his suffering and death elicits a rebuke from Peter. Perhaps if Peter had used the first approach, “Explain to me...” he might not have been severely reprimanded by the Lord.

In human relationships, marriage, family, community, work, the parish, and in the world let us pray for the ability to engage in dialogue “with all due respect.” Thank you to those of you who do. It is appreciated. Enjoy the Labor Day holiday!

Evangelization: The faithful discern marriage and family priorities

In the background paper, *“Marriage and Family as the Effective Sign of Christ in the World,”* author Lydia LoCoco, MTS, director, The Nazareth Project, Archdiocese of Milwaukee’s John Paul II Center, says, “Few dispute that there have been seismic changes in

the cultural realities facing married couples and families. When asked, many couples can point to many positive realities that help them to live out God’s plan for their marriage. These changes range from a greater attention to the quality of interpersonal relationships in marriage, a stronger promotion of the dignity of women, and the realization of the Church’s mission proper to the family and to its responsibility in helping to build a more just society. “Many of these couples would also point out the negative cultural realities, which make living out a marriage that is faithful and fruitful difficult, and at times seemingly impossible. Some see a culture that is overtly ‘hostile’ to marriage and family life, and which cultivates a frenetic ‘busyness’ that is seemingly inescapable, and which is detrimental to raising a holy and happy family. Other threats to marriage and family life exist, such as the rampant and pervasive pornographic elements in our society that has grown exponentially and which is now brought directly into homes through the Internet.”

Below are the top two priorities in Marriage and Family voted on at the Synod.

First Priority – 30% – Building Catholic Families Campaign
Implement a “Building Catholic Families” campaign that includes practical, user-friendly strategies for families to strength and practice their Catholic identity in a culture of “busyness” and family disintegration.

Second Priority – 18% – Support for Engaged and Married
Implement new, creative and effective strategies that provide support at the parish and archdiocesan levels for engaged and married couples.

Other areas of marriage and family such as formation on the human person, evangelization on annulments and marriage definition initiatives were discussed and discerned, and will be taken into consideration as Archbishop Listecki creates his Synodal Declaration. The next key mission area to be featured will be Stewardship – the seventh of eight areas discerned at the Synod. On September 14, Archbishop Listecki will issue a Synodal Declaration, which will include the priorities set for the Archdiocese for the next 10-15 years. The information from the Synod will assist Archbishop Listecki in his discernment process in creating this Declaration.

A Note from the Parish Nurse, Pam Dennis:

We are fortunate to be able to host a great nutrition and activity program here at St. James sponsored by the Aging and Disability Resource Center of Waukesha County and Mount Mary College. The program is called, **“Eat Better & Move More”**. It is for adults age 60 and over and will be held every Tuesday from September 16th through November 18th (no class on Election day, November 4th) from 1:30 pm – 3:30 pm in our **cafeteria**.

What will you be doing, you probably are thinking? You will have your fitness level assessed before and after the program to see how you have improved, you will learn new nutrition information each week to improve your eating habits, receive a step counter to track your steps each week and take part in exercises to improve your stamina, flexibility, strength and balance. There will be weekly prizes and gifts along with a \$10 gift card for perfect attendance! Come and join the fun. Pre-registration is required for participation. You can register by calling or e-mailing Pam, the parish nurse. **A \$15 suggested donation is to offset equipment cost.**

The new mushroom beds surprised all of us this past weekend. We've been checking each Saturday morning, but forgot one week. The next Saturday we had huge mushrooms. One top was as big as your face. Several other tops were big enough to cover a slice of bread for a mushroom sandwich. The Co-operating Churches of Sussex's (CCOS) food pantry wasn't sure about taking these huge mushrooms because they didn't know if clients would know what to do with them. We'll be more vigilant from now on to catch them when they're a reasonable size for cooking with spaghetti sauces, lasagnas, or soups. Great comfort foods in the cooler fall weather.



Last weekend was our biggest donation of tomatoes this season. Vines are starting to wither as the climate changes and humidity/disease contribute to fall's deterioration. We continue to prune and clear infected leaves and branches to keep disease spores out of our beds. A couple of beds of lettuce have also been cleared. The lettuce was tasting bitter, but we had a good run with lettuce this year. As you can tell the gardens are starting to wind down as fall approaches and the diminishing daylight hours prohibits us from doing any more succession planting.

This season wasn't as productive as some in the past, but still very productive. As every gardener knows, each and every season is different and comes with its own challenges.
