

We are John and Louise Vos, celebrating our 49th anniversary this year. We have four adult children and are proud grandparents of 5 grandchildren-ages 7 years to 9 months.

We first became involved at IHM in West Allis where Fr. Art Heinze was assigned over 45 years ago. We followed Fr. Art right to St. James. He retired and we loved St. James so much so we stayed! **We pass (3) Catholic Churches to attend St. James.**

We've chaired festivals, taught youth and teenagers religion, helping in various capacities at church. ***But the involvement that has nurtured our relationship with each other and God is working with engaged couples.*** We first started doing days for engaged at the Family Life Office in 1976. Then we designed a weekend retreat for the engaged at St. Frances monastery. The church then added to marriage preparation, the PMI, a tool for couples to take prior to marriage. Our home was the meeting place.

In 1991, we left the Waukesha area to move to Sacramento, CA. for a job. *We knew no one.* Our children were miserable, and so were we. We went to the Divine Savior Catholic Church. When we entered the church, we observed the pastor wearing a Packer stole. *"We are home!"*

We realized, at that point, the Holy Spirit was guiding us to continue our ministry. We were asked to join a team to give the first Catholic Engaged Encounter weekend in Orangevale, California. We were also asked to administer FOCCUS, an updated version of the PMI for engaged couples which led us to design a marriage preparation program at Divine Savior for the engaged.

As grandchildren arrived, we wanted to be closer. So, we moved back to the Milwaukee area and proposed starting Catholic Engaged Encounter to the Milwaukee Archdiocese as there was no weekend preparation program here. We were turned down until the Holy Spirit introduced us to Father David LaPlante who had done Catholic Engaged Encounter in the Omaha diocese.

In April 2012, we had our first Catholic Engaged Encounter at Schoenstat retreat Center with (8) couples attending. We continue administering FOCCUS, in our home, to those engaged at St. James.

Nothing can compare to being in a room full of love knowing that the ability to love someone can only be possible because of the unconditional love of God. ***We have been blessed!***

FIELDS OF HOPE & DREAMS
and HOLY GROUND GARDEN

A lot of happy people left St. James last weekend. Enthusiastic home gardeners carried boxes of vegetables and perennials home from our annual Plant Sale. Garden volunteers felt honored and proud as they witnessed plants (that they germinated) being selected to take home by other parish members. Stories were shared from last years successes of vegetables that were grown, cooked, shared and donated from the previous year's plant sale. And we had guests and families witness new adult members join our church as Confirmation was celebrated in the afternoon. What a wonderful blessed weekend.

Parish members donated \$1,628 for vegetables and plants. These funds will pay for this year's seeds, soil amendments, flats, trays, starter mixes, fertilizer and supplies. The remaining funds will help pay for the brick retaining wall, compost soil for fill; and the drip watering system and lumber for the raised bed frames (yet to be installed) in our new Holy Ground garden. Overall our church community was strengthened. We will be eating healthier home grown fresh fruits and vegetables, sharing our abundance with the Cooperating Churches of Sussex's (CCOS) food pantry, improving the church grounds and strengthening the relationships among our members as we work together.

Are we blessed? Most of our garden volunteers felt that way as we sat outside on the church patio waiting to help and advise parish members select plants before and after each mass, sharing stories of our lives, past plants sales, generous parish members (who shared some of their perennials from their homes), and church staff members who devote their precious time to help us carry out this event. "Thank You" seems insufficient, but it's the best that can be expressed in print. The feeling of joy and love that was felt during the weekend will be remembered and will carry us through another season of gardening. What a wonderful community we all enjoy here at St. James.
