

### FIELD OF HOPE & DREAMS And HOLY GROUND GARDEN

Our community gardens normally overwhelm the Cooperating Churches of Sussex’s (CCOS) food pantry in August with tomatoes, peppers, cucumbers, zucchini and beets. This last Saturday (i.e. July 4<sup>th</sup> weekend) the food pantry was closed due to the holiday, so we harvested on Wednesday and Friday. Due to the cooler temperatures our cool weather crops became overwhelming. They were ready to harvest and some were starting to bolt.

Thanks to the many volunteers who helped in the kitchen. On Friday, we harvested and cleaned so much lettuce, spinach, kale, Swiss chard and carrots (beautiful carrots) that we had to hold over some of the produce until next week.

The CCOS food pantry has limited refrigeration space, so we filled their refrigerators and saved the rest of our harvest in our kitchen refrigerators here at church. If the CCOS food pantry can’t take our abundance we’ll split it and donate to the Menomonee Falls food pantry. This is what was planned when we expanded with the new Holy Ground garden, but we didn’t expect the abundance to happen until the tomatoes and peppers kicked in later this summer.

What’s that saying in Luke 10:2 or Matthew 9:35 *And he said to them, “The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few. Therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest.* Well, we were very thankful for the volunteers who came, but we could use more help, especially in the kitchen when the harvest starts to peak later this summer. ### VBS Everest is Under Construction...

We are preparing for Vacation Bible School, which will take place August 3<sup>rd</sup>-7<sup>th</sup>.

Here are some supplies we need for our expedition...

- Clean, empty water or soda bottles – 16 oz and 2-liter size
- Toilet paper rolls
- Batting/stuffing or fake snow
- Snowflake decorations of any kind
- Old sheets – white or light colors
- Large sheets of Styrofoam or big pieces – leftovers from packaging are great!!!
- Wooden crates
- White plastic tablecloths
- Red, Orange & Yellow tissue paper
- Pool Noodles
- Splash balls
- Washi tape – any colors or patterns
- Snowflake stickers or foam shapes

**A Note from the Parish Nurse, Pam Dennis:**

Now that we are in full swing with our summer activities, I thought I'd share some information with you on Lyme Disease. If you are on a hiking path, in a park, on a bike trail, camping in the woods, on a golf course or even gardening in your own backyard – you are at risk. It is caused by a tick bite and if left untreated or misdiagnosed, the disease can result in painful and crippling arthritic conditions, nerve damage, brain disorders, heart malfunctions and sometimes death.



The disease develops from the often unnoticed bite of an infected deer tick. Cases have been reported in 43 states, although most have occurred in California, Massachusetts, Connecticut, Minnesota, New York, New Jersey, Rhode Island and yes, Wisconsin according to the National Lyme Borrelia foundation. Lyme disease is treatable with antibiotics, and complete recovery is likely when the illness is discovered early. With proper precautions, Lyme disease is preventable. Tick season is from April through October although peak season is May through July.

Lyme disease can cause the same complications in both adults and children. Because the children spend more time playing outside during the summer, however, they are at greater risk. Even your pets are susceptible to Lyme disease.

The most obvious symptom in animals is unexplained sudden onset of lameness. According to the Center for Disease Control (CDC), there is no evidence that infected animals can transfer Lyme disease to humans, although an infected tick might take a leap from a dog's or cat's fur and latch onto a human for a meal. It is very important to inspect yourself for ticks and to inspect your children after being outdoors where ticks live. When I was a Navy nurse with the Marines, we would inspect every Marine after coming in from field exercises as a precaution ... all 350 of them!

Remember a tick that is still moving has not fed. Remove it immediately. According to the National Lyme Borrelia foundation, it may take 8 – 12 hours of feeding time before enough bacteria is transmitted to cause Lyme disease. Use a forceps or tweezers to remove the tick, grasp the tick close to the skin by its mouth (the part that is in the skin) and pull the tick steadily outward. It is important to avoid the bloated part of the tick, it can push the bacteria inward. After removing the tick you should disinfect with rubbing alcohol or povidone iodine. Check the bite for 30 days. The first sign of infection is a bull's eye shaped circular rash with a clear center. You can also exhibit signs of fatigue, stiff neck and flu-like symptoms such as headache, chills, fever and muscle aches.

Now that you have some information on Lyme Disease, you can go ahead and enjoy the beautiful Wisconsin outdoors armed with how to be safe along the way. Enjoy these lazy days of summer!
