Operation Backpack





Why Do We Use Two Different Scripture Books At Mass?

You might have noticed that lately we are carrying in a different looking book at the beginning of the mass. This highly decorated book is called the "Book of the Gospels" and contains only the four Gospels and no other readings.

In the early church, the Old Testament Readings were bound in a separate book which was used by the Lector; the Gospels in another book which was used by the deacon, and a third book, the Sacramentary, which contains all the prayers for the mass was for the Priest/Bishop.

A separate Book of the Gospels is mentioned in documents of the eighth century describing the entrance rite and carrying in the Book of the Gospels, so somewhere in the history of the church, after the eighth century, all the scripture readings were combined into one book, often times also called the Missal, while the Sacramentary remained separate.

After Vatican II, around 1969, the next revision of the General Instructions to the Roman Missal (GIRMS) referred to using a separate Book of the Gospels. (Although none was available until the 1970's). This is why the practice of carrying in the Lectionary began in many parishes, as they substituted the Lectionary for the Book of the Gospels. This practice, in fact, was never really authorized and is contrary to the more ancient custom of carrying the special "icon" of Christ, the book of His words, namely the Book of the Gospels, in liturgical processions.

The Book of the Gospels has a long history in the ordination rites for Bishops and Deacons. In the Bishop's rite the Book is presented to him to illustrate that the faithful preaching of the Word of God is among his principle duties. In the Deacon's rite, the presentation of the Book of the Gospels to the Deacon, symbolizes the office of the Deacon to proclaim the Gospel in liturgical celebrations and to preach the faith of the Church in word and deed. (The actual words are – "Receive the Gospel of Christ whose herald you now are, Believe what you read, Teach what you believe, and Practice what you teach.")

You probably have noticed that during the entrance procession, the Book of the Gospels is placed on a special table in front of the altar. This is to show the unity of the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

The NEW Book of the Gospels, which we have recently purchased, was designed by Laura James and is decorated with the utmost care with Ethiopian icons on the cover, representing the four gospel writers;

The Lion representing Mark because he begins with John the Baptist crying out in the desert, the abode of the wild beasts; Ox / Calf representing Luke because he begins with the Jewish priest Zechariah in the temple where such animals were sacrificed; Human faced Figure representing Matthew because he begins with

the genealogy of Jesus; Eagle representing John because of the soaring flight of the first words of his gospel: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God....". These icons depict the rich diversity of the church's members, as well as many of the important gospel stories.

The Parish Nurse works closely with the pastoral staff and volunteers to provide a healing ministry within the parish community to foster and nurture the holistic health of its members and neighbors, focusing on Mind, Body and Spirit. The Parish Nurse is the Coordinator of Health Ministry and serves as educator, counselor, referral agent and advocate based on the needs of the parishioners.

Qualified candidates must be a graduate of an accredited school or college of nursing with 3 to 5 years of nursing experience, hold an active Wisconsin RN license, have or be in the process of acquiring parish nurse certification and have a valid driver's license. And HOLY GROUND GARDEN

Is your home garden exploding with vegetables like our community gardens? The past rains and warming temperatures have caused growth spurts in almost all of our vegetables in all three gardens. The one thing missing from our donations to the Co-operating Churches of Sussex's (CCOS) food pantry has been excess produce brought to church by parish members from their abundance from home gardens.

We've usually promoted this program in early spring as our "Plant An Extra Row" in your gardens for the food pantry. In past years we've had parishioners stop by church while we've been harvesting to bring extra produce to combine with our harvest for delivery to the CCOS food pantry. With these ideal temperatures for vegetables, there must be excess. If you find your garden with excess, please don't let it go to waste and end up in the compost pile. You've put too much work and effort into it to let that happen.

Our volunteer gardeners are working in the community gardens every Saturday morning (weather permitting) from 8:00 to 11:00 a.m. If you have excess vegetables from your abundance, don't let it go to waste, donate it to the CCOS food pantry instead. And if Saturday mornings aren't convenient, you can drop your excess off directly at the CCOS food pantry when they are open. Just check their hours of operation, or call them at (262) 246-9860 to arrange a drop off time.
