From The Servant's Quarters

◆ I continue to hear from many of you that you are keeping me in prayer as I await surgery for my shoulder. With various types of treatment, I still have been unable to raise my platelet level high enough for surgery. My hematologist has referred me to a specialist at John Hopkins Medical Center in Baltimore, Maryland. I'll be flying out there for a few days this week, so will be unavailable Wednesday through Friday.



◆ A bonus of this rather unusual development is that I'll be able to visit a "classmate" who was my next door neighbor at the St. John Vianney Center last year. I'm sure it will be good for both of us to catch up a bit on life, now a year after the experience.

◆ The Scriptures this weekend speak of Wisdom. One strong Biblical tradition is that Jesus is the Wisdom of God in human flesh. The Bread of Life message merges this weekend with that tradition. Jesus who is "the living bread that came down from heaven" nourishes us with his Spirit of "wise living." The more we deepen in friendship with Jesus, the more we are influenced by his perspective for living in this world.

◆ And how blessed are we with such a wise and nourishing model of faith in Pope Francis. As a staff we are beginning to delve into his most recent teaching letter, "Laudato Si" "Praise be to You, my Lord." These are the beginning words of the creation poem from St. Francis of Assisi, The Canticle of the Creatures. We are reminded how all of creation is intimately interconnected. We are reminded of the great trust The Almighty has placed within us to be good caretakers of all the gifts of creation, most importantly, "the least" of our sisters and brothers.

◆ Francis of Assisi knew this from his own experience so much so that he called the animals and elements of the earth his "brothers and sisters." We can do much better in protecting our environment from abuse and destruction. There is no reason why anyone on this planet should be without adequate food, medical care and shelter. A wise person once said that a culture will be judged by how it treats "the least" of its members.

◆ As we familiarize ourselves with this wisdom teaching, we are called to judge and critique the many political voices that are turning up their volume, as the next election cycle is upon us. It's up to us,

animated by the wisdom spirit of Jesus, to bring the Word of God to bear on our human condition. The Almighty has given us this world as a most precious gift. I believe He expects us to hand it on in better condition to the next generation. Such a lifestyle will bring praise and honor to God. Such a lifestyle will bring us a depth of joy that we could never imagine.

St. James Parish, Menomonee Falls is seeking a professional, experienced faith filled person to fulfill the role of Parish Nurse. The Parish Nurse works closely with the pastoral staff and volunteers to provide a healing ministry within the parish community to foster and nurture the holistic health of its members and neighbors, focusing on Mind, Body and Spirit. The Parish Nurse is the Coordinator of Health Ministry and serves as educator, counselor, referral agent and advocate based on the needs of the parishioners.

Qualified candidates must be a graduate of an accredited school or college of nursing with 3 to 5 years of nursing experience, hold an active Wisconsin RN license, have parish nurse certification or be willing to work towards certification (parish will reimburse 50% of tuition cost) and have a valid driver's license. A BSN is helpful, but not required. Applicants must be a practicing Roman Catholic and have a familiarity and understanding of Catholic traditions and practices.



STEPPING ON

St. James parish is sponsoring a falls prevention class that is given by the Aging and Disability Resource Center of Waukesha County beginning the 23rd of September through the 4th of November, every Wednesday from 10 am-12 pm in our cafeteria. The class is called, **Stepping On**, and is a 7 week program perfect for adults who have fallen in the past year or for those who have a "healthy respect" for the consequences of a fall.

This highly interactive workshop covers exercises to improve strength and balance. Participants are empowered to take an active role in fall prevention. Weekly topics explore the role that vision, medications, sleep, home hazards and footwear play in falls prevention. Simple balance and strengthening exercises are taught as well.

News from Pastoral Associate Gerry Wolf

- I could use some help... I am looking for suggestions for a clever title for this column, which I plan on including in each week's bulletin. I was thinking of something like this: "News from the PA" (Public Address/Pastoral Associate play on words???) Let me know what you think or if you have another idea for me...
- Last year the Archdiocese of Milwaukee held a Synod (from the Greek, meaning "assembly" or "meeting"), with representatives from all parishes, religious orders, Catholic organizations, etc., to advise Archbishop Listecki in discerning priorities for our future. This year's focus is on **Evangelization and the Sunday Mass**. All parishes will be receiving teaching resources this fall, including some well-produced dvds. Check out my article in the upcoming September/October parish newsletter for more details about the Synod and this particular priority.
- My article will also have more info on the upcoming Jubilee Year of Mercy. Pope Francis announced this initiative earlier this year. The Year of Mercy will begin on December 8th of this year, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception, and run through the liturgical year until the Feast of Christ the King on November 20, 2016.
- Did you know that the John Paul II Center and Catholic Cemeteries of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee sponsor a monthly program for **anyone who has been affected by the death of a loved one**? It's called **Common Ground of Grief** and is presented by Patrick Dean, Director of Grief Education Services with Catholic Cemeteries. Sessions are held on the ***first Tuesday of the month from 11 am-12:30 pm and repeated at 5:30-7:00 pm at San Camillo, 10200 W Bluemound Road, Milwaukee***. The next session is on Tuesday, September 1st. For further information visit www.cemeteries.org or contact 414-438-4420, ext. 302 or patrickdean@griefwork.com.
- Last week I included an invitation to anyone curious about becoming Catholic to explore their questions in an "inquiry" group. There is a process dedicated to that purpose called the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA). The process will begin in mid-September with the possibility of celebrating sacraments at the next Easter Vigil on March 26th, 2016. If you or anyone you know may be interested, don't wait...take that next step and respond to Jesus' own invitation to "Come and follow me!"

"His response to the world around him was so much more than intellectual appreciation or economic calculus, for to him each and every creature was a sister united to him by bonds of affection." Francis endowed all of creation with a sense of dignity because he not only saw the world as an intimate reflection of the one Creator, but as a way to live "in harmony with God, with others, with nature and with himself." We, Pope Francis says, on the other hand "have come to see ourselves as her lords and masters, entitled to plunder her at will". "We have forgotten that we ourselves are dust of the earth."
