

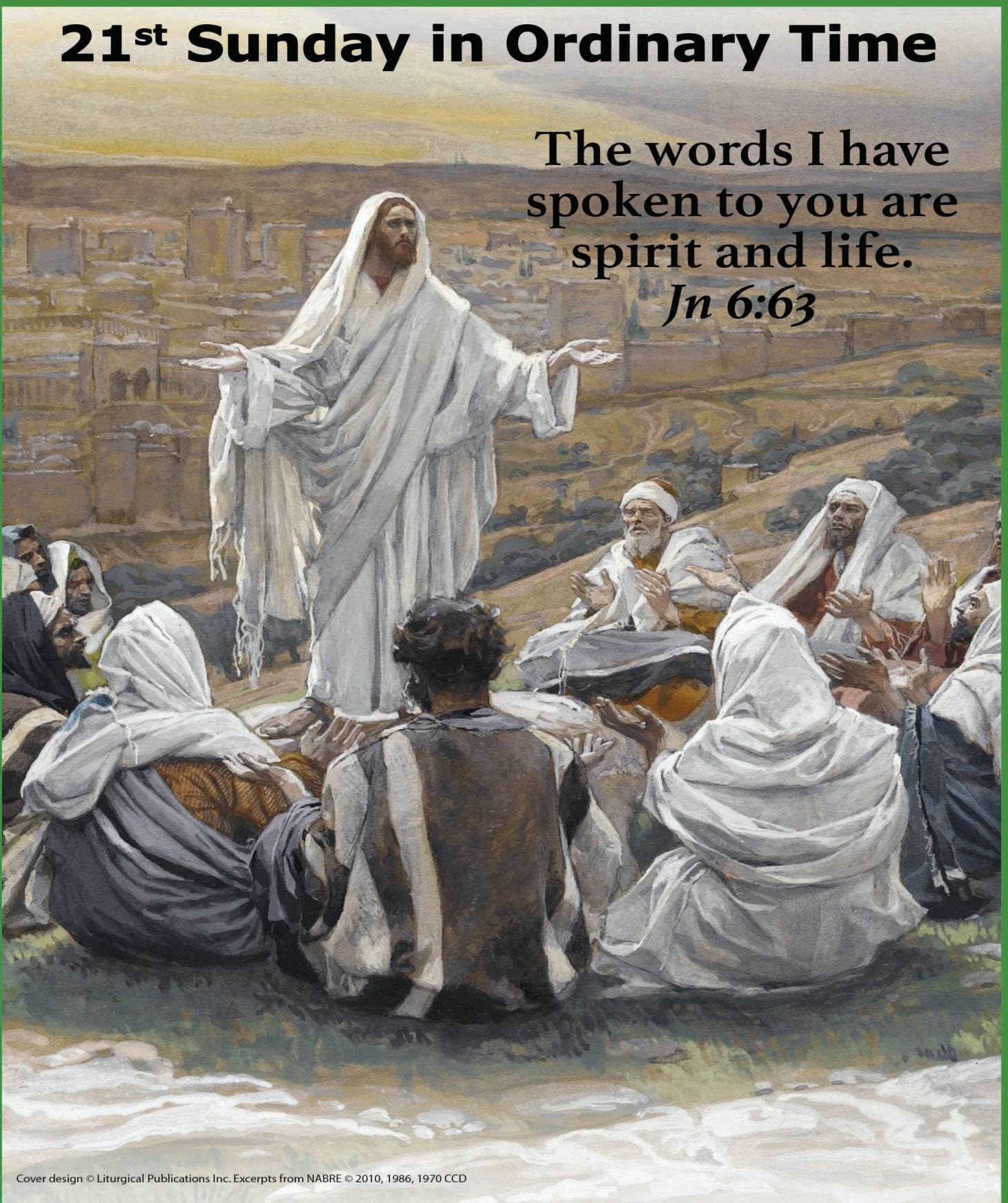

From The Servant's Quarters

- Comedians sometimes challenge us to think deeply - and find humor - in many of the "sayings" we take for granted in everyday life. I've often wondered about the expression of "having your cake and eating it!" It seems to me there's no point in having a cake if you're not going to eat it!
- Another one I think about when I put away my organic eggs from free-range chickens is "Don't put all your eggs in one basket!" I put all my eggs in one basket in the refrigerator! So far I have not had any ill effects from that. As some in the audience of Jesus find him too much to accept, and begin drifting away, Jesus says to his inner circle, "Do you also want to leave?" Peter, who often says foolish things, this time moves to the head of the class. Peter puts all his "eggs in one basket!" "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life."
- There's no greater or more fulfilling nourishment around, than the life, the teaching, the wisdom of Jesus. Those who drifted away were too stuck in their limited outlook on life. They didn't recognize the depth and scope of what Jesus was "serving up." They found him all too much.
- What a great reminder that the activity of God, revealed through Jesus, is full of surprises. Thus the call to humility, to openness, to an eagerness to experience the "more to come" which beckons us beyond our current perspective.
- So remember, if we put all our eggs in the basket of Jesus, as Peter does, The Lord just might take a few of them out to bake a cake! See, we CAN have our cake and eat it too!

STEPPING ON

St. James parish is sponsoring a falls prevention class that is given by the Aging and Disability Resource Center of Waukesha County beginning the 23rd of September through the 4th of November, every Wednesday from 10 am- 12 pm in our cafeteria. The class is called, **Stepping On**, and is a 7 week program perfect for adults who have fallen in the past year or for those who have a "healthy respect" for the consequences of a fall.

This highly interactive workshop covers exercises to improve strength and balance. Participants are empowered to take an active role in fall prevention. Weekly topics explore the role that vision, medications, sleep, home hazards and footwear play in falls prevention. Simple balance and strengthening exercises are taught as well.

FIELDS OF HOPE & DREAMS
And HOLY GROUND GARDEN

It's sad to report that these last two August weekends were our last of succession planting. This is late in the "normal" garden season for planting, but with the unusual weather, we thought we'd chance it. The 60 day germination period puts us into mid-October for harvesting these newly planted radishes, lettuce and transplanted broccoli plants. And of course our cold weather crops of kale, Swiss chard and our root crops will continue into fall too. Tomatoes are finally (although slowly) ripening, which is somewhat late in the season. We still need the sunny hot weather to help in the ripening process although (have you noticed) our daylight hours continue to shorten.

We've also been battling varmints. Earlier in the season, it was a woodchuck in the Field of Dreams garden. Lately it's been rabbits in the Field of Hope garden, and chipmunks or seven stripers in our Field of Hope and Holy Ground gardens. We've reinforced the outer Field of Hope fence and transplanted broccoli, which was eaten the next day. More broccoli was transplanted the following week and we put a fence around the inner raised bed frame. So we have a fence within a fence to help protect the plants. But, we're thankful, no problems with deer . . . yet. We might give God thanks for that, since our Holy Ground garden, although elevated, is mostly unprotected. Our star producers so far this year have been: lettuce, broccoli, kale, egg plants, carrots and beans. Next up will be our tomatoes, peppers, potatoes, beets and cucumbers. What a season this sixth year of community gardening has been. And we applaud parishioners who have been bringing in produce from their home gardens to add to ours. We saw some zucchini as big as baseball bats. The Cooperating Churches of Sussex's (CCOS) food pantry appreciates all of your donations.



This fall we hope to place wood chips/mulch in between the raised bed frames of our Holy Ground garden to inhibit weed growth. You might have noticed, we've already placed cardboard in the aisles to help control weeds before we mulch. Next spring, we'll bring in more compost/soil to fill the raised bed frames to the top, giving us fresh planting medium to start a new season of gardening. As gardeners, it seems you're always looking ahead and starting to optimistically plan for next year and what you can improve upon based upon what you've learned in the current season. And of course, we'll start planning our year-end harvest celebration with an evening dinner filled with home grown vegetables - dishes to pass and enjoy by other fellow community garden volunteers. If any or all of this sounds interesting, we're always looking for new volunteers to help us.
