### **A note from Brigitte Glinski, Parish Nurse**

As winter settles in around us, we need to make sure to avoid slips and falls, which can lead to injury. Following are some tips for walking in the snowy and icy conditions.

1. Wear boots, or overshoes, with soles that grip such as rubber.
2. Before getting out of your car, make sure to check the pavement, if it's icy, move your car to a different spot.
3. When exiting your car, brace yourself on the door and seat back for extra stability.
4. Don't walk with your hands in your pockets; you need your arms for balance.
5. Take short shuffling steps in icy spots.
6. Don't carry large or heavy things, such as purses or boxes that could cause you to lose your balance while walking.
7. Walk as flat-footed as possible.
8. Avoid walking on uneven surfaces, watch curbs for ice.
9. Do not walk distracted; do not dig in your pockets or purse, or use your mobile phone.

If you do fall, there are a few things you can do to try to reduce your potential injury. First, roll with the fall; try to fall backwards instead of forward. Second, as you fall, don't tense up, the more relaxed you are the less likely you are to get injured. Thirdly, if you are carrying a load, toss it; protect yourself, not your stuff.

While out walking this winter, make sure to use sidewalks, but if they are not clear, walk against traffic and as close to the curb as possible. Make sure to wear proper winter attire, but make sure that you have bright colors so that drivers can see you. Remember that motorists may not be able to stop at stop signs or lights if the road conditions are bad, make sure to check traffic before crossing streets.
