

As we come to the end of another year, we at CCRI (Catholic Church Reform International) extend our warmest thanks for your support. During this special time of year when we gather with family and loved ones, let us not forget those in need of our support. So many lives will be impacted by whatever reforms come as a result of Pope Francis and his year of mercy. Let us join together to pray for a genuine "year of mercy" that results in a church that shows compassion and acceptance of all regardless of past failures or chosen lifestyles.

In the coming year, let us continue to work together toward those changes that will bring our Church into one that truly reflects what Jesus envisioned:

- that divorced and remarried men and women will be welcomed to the Eucharistic table;
- that women begin to be treated with dignity and given equal access to service roles in the Church;

Is laughter the best medicine? While it may not be true of every ailment, research is showing that laughter is an important part of your health and well-being. Laughter is being said to provide many health benefits. It has physical benefits, your heart rate and oxygen consumption increase, multiple muscles are worked and calories are burned. Laughter decreases stress hormones, and can increase immunity defense, and may even increase pain tolerance. Finding humor in stressful situations can help you to cope with a negative situation in a more positive way. Humor and laughter can help ease tension in group situations, and can increase your likeability, which can help you to avoid isolation and loneliness.

Some people find humor and laughter a little more easily than others. Taking life seriously can be a noble quality, but it's OK to take your mind off the world from time to time. Spend time with those who make you laugh; some health clubs are now offering laughter therapy or laughter yoga. Always be mindful of what isn't funny; don't take shots at others to get a laugh, which may fuel anger rather than replace it.


