## *The Baptism of the Lord*



“I am baptizing you with water, but one mightier than I is coming. I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire.” - Lk 3:16bc

- Amazing! In just a couple of weeks Jesus has gone from infancy to a 30 year old, being baptized by John the Baptist! It must be the NaZareTh pill he took! (LIMITLESS!) This weekend officially ends the Christmas season as we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord and the beginning of the public ministry of Jesus.
- ➤ Why do you think Jesus wished to be baptized? This was a baptism of repentance and Jesus was without sin. I think it was his way of fully identifying with all of us, blazing our trail into the baptismal waters. One of the prayers for the day makes reference to the waters being made holy by the one baptized!
- ➤ I'm reading the book, *The Gospel of the Son* by Norman Mailer. It is a rewrite of the Gospels from the point of view of Jesus, speaking in the first person. One emphasis is the questioning and wondering Jesus went through, in much the same way you and I question and wonder as we navigate through life. Perhaps in his human condition it was very meaningful to Jesus to experience the affirmation of the Spirit and The Father, in proclaiming, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." Don't you and I also long for that powerful affirmation of our Heavenly Father? Let's renew our baptismal commitment today, with the expectation that we too will hear those loving words.
- ➤ One way to be open to the echo of these words is to spend time in silence, in prayer, in reflection. This coming week I will be making my annual retreat. I'll be under the direction of a Franciscan brother and musician you may have heard of: John Michael Talbot. Some years ago John Michael founded the ecumenical religious community known as Brothers and Sisters of Charity. His retreat work is one way they support their community and ministries.
- ➤ Next weekend you will be served by Fr. Ed Vella, a Redemptorist priest from Mother of Perpetual Help Retreat House in Oconomowoc. Fr. Ed will take the opportunity to share with you the many



ways available to you to grow spiritually through their retreat ministry.

- ➤ By now many of you are aware that Trish Anderson died shortly after Christmas. Trish has served our community as the case worker for our Sussex Outreach Services for many years. Because her son Nathan is out of the country, her funeral will be sometime in mid February. Please keep Trish and her family in your prayers.

## Messages from our PA



- I recently finished reading a book titled: Rome Sweet Home by Scott Hahn. It explains the story of how Scott, a former Presbyterian minister, was lead by the Holy Spirit to become a Catholic. Eventually, his wife and children also became Catholic as well. It's a fascinating story of a faith life in motion, spurred by the Holy Spirit, of a couple seeking the fullness of life in Christ, and how they found it in Catholicism. I was particularly struck by Scott's description of the Eucharist as he began to attend Mass to satisfy his curiosity: *"Day after day, witnessing the entire drama of the Mass, I saw the covenant renewed right before my eyes. I knew Christ wanted me to receive him in faith, not just spiritually in my heart, but physically as well: onto my tongue, down my throat and into my whole body and soul. This was what the Incarnation was all about. This was the gospel in its fullness."* **Let's pray that all Catholics, especially those who've grown up with the Eucharist all their lives but either have not yet truly understood the depth of its significance or have come to take it for granted, will experience a renewal of Christ's Real Presence every time we celebrate Eucharist.**

**Organic Food – The Problem with Pesticides**  
"Nature cannot be regarded as something separate from ourselves or as a mere setting in which we live. We are part of nature, included in it and thus in constant interaction with it" [LS, 139].



Nearly two thirds of produce samples tested by the USDA contained pesticide residues. So what is the problem with pesticides on our food? They've been shown to adversely affect the nervous system, increase the risk of cancer, and are toxic to honey bees and other beneficial insects that pollinate our food. Check the display in the gathering space to find out what produce has been tested to have the most and least pesticide residue.



**A note from Parish Nurse, Brigitte Glinski**

**Shingles**

If you have had Chicken Pox, you have already been exposed to the virus that causes Shingles. The virus lays dormant in nerve tissue and can be reactivated by stress, illness, or immune suppressing medications. When the virus reactivates it spreads along nerve pathways, causing painful blisters. There are some things you can do to reduce the chance of you getting shingles, or its severity if it does occur.

Symptoms of shingles include pain or discomfort along the nerve branch, followed by flu-like symptoms, and finally the blistering rash occurs. If you suspect you are experiencing shingles, see your doctor immediately. He can prescribe anti-viral medication that may shorten the course of illness.

It is best to try to prevent Shingles, if you know you have had chicken pox, talk with your doctor. The Centers for Disease Control recommends that most adults age 60 and over receive the shingles vaccine, Zostavax. Even if you have had shingles in the past, it can recur; the vaccine can help prevent a second outbreak. Make sure to be proactive and get the vaccine while you are healthy, it is a live vaccine and cannot be given to those with a weakened immune system. Only about 24 percent of adults age 60 and older have had the shingles vaccine, make sure you ask your doctor about it next time you visit.
