From The Servant's Quarters

•We come to the grand finale of the Easter Season: 50 days to bask in the light of the Risen Lord. 50 days to unpack what it means to die with Christ so as to rise with Christ, not just when we physically breathe our last, but as we draw in our life breath every day.

•For that matter we need to include all of our government and civil officials. How frustrating it is to see the lack of compromise among our leaders. They need to put the Common Good ahead of personal agendas and ambitions.

Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful. Kindle within us the fire of your love. Send forth your spirit and we shall be recreated. Together we shall renew the face of the earth!

•Congratulations to our newly confirmed youth. We are encouraged and inspired by all the preparations you have done to open your hearts to the movement and gifts of the Holy Spirit. Your various mission projects and service within the parish, especially

at Mass really means a lot to us. We pledge to you that St. James will be the vibrant faith community you need to see you through the challenges and joys of life. Blessings and Peace to all of you and to all who have helped you to prepare for this milestone in your life.

Parish Trustee Position Opening

Wisconsin Law requires that every parish have two trustees, each serving a two year term. Trustees must be parish members, practicing Catholics and at least 25 years of age. The position of **Trustee-Secretary** for St. James Parish becomes available this year. Fr. Mike has nominated Paul Stevens for the position. Additional interested candidates must submit to the Parish Office a written nomination form signed by 10 or more registered parish members. Nomination forms are available by calling Terri Weber in the Parish Office (262)253-2259 or by e-mail webert@archmil.org. All nomination forms must be received in the Parish Office by 12:00 Noon, Friday, May 13. Elections will take place the weekend of May 28 & 29.

TRUSTEE-SECRETARY POSITION DESCRIPTION

The secretary is responsible for corporate record keeping at the parish other than financial records, such as corporate minutes, documents, notices and correspondence. One of the major responsibilities of the trustee-secretary is to ensure that parish records are kept on parish grounds in an easily accessible and orderly fashion. The trustee-secretary is responsible for maintaining records of all real property, property tax exemption, the parish inventory and the parish census. Although it is not required, the trustee-secretary could be an ex-officio member of the Personnel Committee or the Parish Planning Committee.





Just Do It- The Holy Spirit

Baby steps! That is the term we use to describe how an infant tentatively takes its first wavering steps, unsure of what will happen, often falling and getting back up, unsure if walking is really better than the safer option of crawling. I answered a request by Fr. Joe back in the early 90's when we joined the parish to help teach baptism preparation classes- a baby step. I have no specific theology training but took a leap, and started teaching the baptism preparation classes- and in doing so learned in the process.

Fast forward to going on my first mission trip, which led to coordinating the mission trip one year and now I am preparing to going on my 9th trip. These have formed my faith and formed lasting relationships with other adult leaders and the youth. This led to a couple of terms on parish council, co-teaching high school Christian formation, being on Health Ministry Committee- the Holy Spirit took my baby steps and now I consider myself comfortably walking with Our Lord. There is so much to be gained by working alongside other faithful, helping those who need help, reaching out beyond our comfort zone. It's soul satisfying- better than time watching TV, or on Facebook or surfing the internet.

Hello, I'm Emma Woelfel, a junior at Hamilton High School. I'm 16 years old and a proud member of the St. James community. **By the time that you are reading this, I will have been recently confirmed.** These are a couple key things I have learned during my faith journey that I want to share.

For the past two years, I have taught 1st grade in the Christian Formation program with my dad on Sunday mornings and this has really taught me a lot about my faith. Children have a different perspective on things that I would never think of, which has really helped me find out more about my faith. During one class, while we were talking about the Parable of the Prodigal Son, one of the kids asked me where the mother is in the story. St. James Community Gardens

Whether the weather is ready or not....the plant sale is almost here! Next weekend, **May 21 and 22 we will be on the church patio** marketing marigolds and hawking hostas; peddling peppers and clearing out cucumbers; transacting for tomatoes and cashing in on cabbage. And that's just for starters.



So if your gardens or containers need some plants...stop by. We have various veggies and bountiful blossoms that just might be perfect for you. (Special shout out to the Merton Girl Scouts who helped plant 10 flats of marigolds.)

If your garden has too many plants (hostas, irises, day lilies) or your indoor pots are too crowded (aloe vera, dieffenbachia) separate the plants, repot them or keep the root balls moist with wet newspaper in a labeled plastic bag and bring them over. If you can, drop the plants off between 9 am and noon on Saturday the 21st, that will give us time to set them up properly. But if you want to save yourself a trip and drop them off before you go to mass, that will work as well. We'll be glad to help those plants find a new home.

All the plants are available for a donation. And we do hope you will be generous with your donations. Although we have willing volunteers and free sunlight, like everyone else we need to pay for seeds, fencing, watering systems and other supplies to keep the gardens producing. In fact, if you simply want to support a good cause and make a donation...please do. We won't make you take a plant home with you if you don't want one.

Stop by, say 'hi', ask questions, make suggestions. We are looking forward to meeting the many parishioners who keep supporting us with donations, encouragement and prayers. Did we mention there is a **plant sale coming up May 21 and 22?**
