

From The Servant's Quarters

• This weekend we celebrate what traditionally was called "Corpus Christi," The Body of Christ. Some years ago there was a separate day to focus on the "Blood of Christ." In the revision of the Church calendar the two celebrations are now one, *The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.*

▪ I think it's helpful to begin the summer season with a focus on the Eucharist. When we celebrate Holy Thursday there is so much going on during Holy Week, the leisure now it's good to have to delve more deeply into the Eucharist itself.



▪ What an ingenious way for the Lord to reassure us that He is with us always. Eating and sharing meals are at the heart of being human. So is the Risen Lord! We inherit a very beautiful spirituality from our Jewish sisters and brothers. When they celebrate the Passover Meal, they are not just remembering a past saving deed by God. The Almighty continues to lift them up in loving support in the here and now as they *remember* His saving activity in the past.

▪ The same is true for us whenever we celebrate the Eucharist. The Lord strengthens us, sustains us, refreshes us in the here and now, drawing us into a fuller experience of God's sovereign action in human history. We participate in making that happen! *We are what we eat!* We become Christ's body and blood for others, individually and communally. We are a part of satisfying the world's deepest hungers and deepest thirsts.

▪ Soon we'll be experiencing a new hymn by my favorite Irish composer, Fr. Liam Lawton, *Christ Has No Body Now But Yours*, no hands, no feet on earth but yours. These words come from a prayer by St. Teresa of Avila. Go to YouTube and enjoy several versions of this powerful Eucharistic prayer.

▪ You may recall I celebrated St. Patrick Day this year by receiving a new left shoulder. June 30th

I'll receive a new right shoulder. I looked on the calendar to see which saint we celebrate that day: **The First Martyrs of the Holy Roman Church!** "It's been nice knowing you!"

▪ *A grandmother was going to church one Sunday when she got a call from her daughter. The daughter said she and her husband were going on a five-day holiday trip, and asked grandma whether her three little grandchildren could stay with her while they were gone. Grandma was so delighted that she put five dollars in the collection basket at church and thanked the Lord. The Sunday after the grandchildren had returned home, grandma put \$20 in the collection basket!*
