We are most grateful to our Christian Formation leaders, catechists, and various helpers who have helped to prepare the children and families for this very special occasion.



▪ We also had a Spirit-filled celebration Sunday afternoon as Bishop Don Hying confirmed 101 young people from Good Shepherd and St. Agnes as well as our own parish. My hope and prayer is that our young people can continue to find in the Spirit of Jesus their traveling companion as they navigate the issues of high school and their futures. I'm very inspired by the many adults of our faith community who have helped to mentor our youth, giving them a taste of the various ministries and outreach efforts of the parish.

May is the month of Our Lady. Let's join in honoring Mary by praying the rosary daily, or even a decade a day.





### Fields of Hope & Dreams Community Gardens

Will it ever warm up this spring and stay warm? Those are the questions being asked by many people this spring. So our community gardens will be planted a little later this spring. In the meantime, we've been busy putting in two new mushroom beds (i.e. Winecap, Grey Dove Oyster) and preparing for fruit trees.



A parishioner donated three fruit trees (i.e. peach, pear, plum) to add to our two existing apple trees. St. James will soon have its own little orchard on the property to go along with our vegetable gardens. We've checked with the lawn mowing crew for locations to plant the fruit trees. These locations were presented to our Building and Grounds committee to decide on and okay within our parish's overall landscape plan before they will present these locations to our Parish Council for final approval. If all goes well we'll have the three trees planted within a week. Fresh picked fruit will be a nice addition to our donations of vegetables to the Cooperating Churches of Sussex's (CCOS) food pantry. Please keep in mind our upcoming **Plant Sale** to be held after each mass on the weekend of **May 17<sup>th</sup>/18<sup>th</sup>**. This sale helps support our gardens while building a closer community within our parish. Last winter several new parishioners stepped forward to help germinate seeds and grow small starter plants for this sale. Parish involvement continues to grow with our garden initiative and the fun community it's building.

**TRUSTEE-SECRETARY  
POSITION DESCRIPTION**

The secretary is responsible for corporate record keeping at the parish other than financial records, such as corporate minutes, documents, notices and correspondence. One of the major responsibilities of the trustee-secretary is to ensure that parish records are kept on parish grounds in an easily accessible and orderly fashion. The trustee-secretary is responsible for maintaining records of all real property, property tax exemption, the parish inventory and the parish census. Although it is not required, the trustee-secretary could be an ex-officio member of the Personnel Committee or the Parish Planning Committee.
