SYNOD 2014 – A New Pentecost

Like Abraham, the prophets and the disciples before us, we are called and sent. We are called by God in our Baptism, confirmed in the Holy Spirit, and in community by one another. By the Great Commandment Jesus sends us. "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy

Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you;" [Matt 28:19-20]. In our daily lives God continues to call and send us.

How can we more intentionally answer that call? How can we the Church, the people of God become dynamic disciples of intention? How can we experience a new Pentecost, a new regeneration of our faith and sharing of that faith? These questions were at the core of Synod 2014. Through personal preparation, prayer and small group discussion, delegates from over 200 parishes and religious organizations gathered to discern the priorities of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee for the next decade.

At the Synod initiatives that were generated from the parish gatherings in fall and honed at district meetings in February were discerned and voted on by delegates from every parish – by us the Church, the people of God. And the Holy Spirit was definitely among us. I was impressed by the preparation of the delegates, their seriousness of responsibility for the process, their love of God and especially their concern for the direction of God's Church in greater Milwaukee. I was also impressed by Archbishop Listecki's commitment to carrying out the resulting direction voted on by the people and the transparency of the process.

A quick synopsis of the resulting priorities that emerged from the Synod are at www.archmil.org under Synod 2014. Clearly we are not done yet. The Synod is only the beginning. A means of setting our direction on The Way. In September Archbishop Listecki will be delivering a letter that will chart our course of direction to fulfill the intent of the priorities voted on at the Synod.

I thank you for blessing me with the opportunity to represent St. James this past weekend. Thank you for your prayers and good wishes as I was called and sent forth. It was and is a responsibility I took and continue to take very seriously through prayer and listening to all of you. Come Holy Spirit as we gather the nations together in peace, as one people united in God.

FIELDS OF HOPE & DREAMS COMMUNITY GARDENS

Our community gardens continue to inspire other churches to start community gardens. There is another St. James church located in Franklin, that wants to start a community garden on their property and grow vegetables to donate to food pantries around Franklin. They want to tour our gardens and ask questions as to how to go about starting a community garden and what challenges they may face. Another church in Oconomowoc also asked to meet with our volunteers. They want to start a community garden at their church. When called to schedule an appointment to meet and tour our gardens, the first question they're asked is: "Do you have the support of your community/parish?" The biggest blessing of our community gardens and what keeps our gardens going is the caring, sharing, volunteering and support of our parish. Without "YOU", our garden initiative would cease within months.

Another call came from a young adult who grew up in Sussex and attended St. James school, when we still had a school. He had since moved on, graduated from college and was now employed around the Sussex community. He lives in an apartment, but wants to have a garden. He somehow found out about St. James' community gardens, but quickly learned that we donate all our produce to the Cooperating Churches of Sussex's (CCOS) food pantry. He was looking for a community garden where he could have his own small garden plot to grow food for his own needs. This was one concept we considered when we first started our community garden. One of our volunteers found a community garden that could accommodate his need, but it's not as convenient for him.

Recently, we had two parishioners offer to help us expand the fruit section of our gardens. One is donating blackberry seeds and wants us to start growing blackberries and the other parishioner is subdividing her home rhubarb, so we can start growing rhubarb to donate to the food pantry. Both would be nice additions, since they continue to produce year after year with little to no care or tending other than harvesting when they're ready.

Last week we planted our two beds of mushrooms. One with Winecap mushrooms and the other bed with Grey Dove Oyster mushrooms. They won't start to produce until fall, but this will also be a nice addition, since a lot of food pantry clients are offered spaghetti sauce and noodles at the pantry. The mushrooms will help enhance this type of meal. The next thing our volunteers are considering is asparagus beds, but this won't happen until next year, and with asparagus, it will be a three year waiting period until our first harvest of asparagus. 
6th Grade through Confirmation Catechists WANTED!
