FROM THE SERVANT'S QUARTERS

❖ I used to be a great fan of the Sunday morning worship service on TV with Dr. Schuller and The Hour of Power, coming from Garden Grove, California. The Scriptures this weekend remind me of one of his 'catchy' sayings, "Tough times don't last. Tough people do!" (You may be aware that his ministry fell on tough times. They had to "downsize" by selling the Crystal Cathedral to the Catholic Diocese of Orange California!)

❖ In today's first reading Jeremiah the prophet is rewarded for speaking the Word of God by being thrown into a cistern! At least it was empty. Loyal followers we able to pull him out of the mud.



❖ The words of Jesus in today's gospel remind his followers that not everyone will love them. It's a reminder that all are at different points of the journey of life. Some have little openness to the compassionate and reconciling message of Jesus. And so he says he is eager to fan a purifying fire on this earth.

❖ Might we think of this "fire" as the Holy Spirit? The manifestation of the presence of the Spirit at Pentecost was the vision of tongues of fire. We can ask ourselves what are our 'tough times?' How might these be a type of purifying fire to make us more into the image and likeness of God?

❖ Speaking of "fire!" I'd like to introduce you to a new book from our very own Bishop Richard Sklba. The title is "Fire Starters!" The book provides an insightful commentary on all of the Bible readings we use at daily Mass. We have a two year cycle of readings, so it is a rather thick book.

❖ When Bishop Sklba was "Father Sklba" he was my Scripture professor at St. Francis Seminary. He was a wonderful teacher in helping us to access the living word of God. I hope you can get your own copy. It is available from Liturgical Press, www.litpress.org

❖ I also discovered an electronic version available from Amazon for my Kindle.

❖ Do you have any garden produce to share? Feel free to bring it to share with fellow parishioners. Baskets are available at the kitchenette in the gathering space.

❖ I'm very grateful for the many prayers, cards, and good wishes as I inch closer to Social Security! Thanks for helping me to feel at home here.

After holding our first Elizabeth Ministry meeting last week, we are ready to begin the work needed to get it started here at St. James. For those of you who are unfamiliar with the Elizabeth Ministry but may want to help out, let me share a bit about it with you.

The ministry was started by a family life minister named Jeannie Hannemann along with Rev. Kurt Gessner, Capuchin. She was working at a parish in the Diocese of Green Bay. Jeannie felt that there was a definite need for parishes to reach out to women and their families by offering encouragement and support. As Jeannie states in her leader's manual book, "the ministry is based on the story of the visitation of Mary and Elizabeth, a profound scriptural example of sharing faith. The sanctity of life and power of the Spirit is revealed in the common sharing of these two women. Throughout the generations women have repeated this story. Elizabeth ministry carries on this tradition of maternal mentoring. Following the example of Mary and Elizabeth, the Elizabeth ministers visit and share the sacredness of life."



If this sounds like a ministry you would like to be involved with please join us for our second meeting on **August 21st at 6:30 pm in the St. James community center.** We have chosen three areas of involvement we will be working on first at this next meeting: busy bags, new Mom and baby visits and our bulletin board for this ministry. Fields of Hope & Dreams Community Gardens

Farmers and gardeners try to plan their planting and harvesting around the weather and rely on a number of sources from *The Farmer's Almanac* to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (i.e. NOAA) to NASA. Just think of the differences in weather we've experienced these past two years. Last year was hot and dry – good for our tomatoes and peppers, while this year is cool and moist – good for spinach and lettuce. Our gardeners are wondering what the weather will be next year.

We may be in the process of experiencing another weather change which will conclude around December. The reason for this change is the sun's magnetic fields will be reversing in the next four or five months. This process "will have ripple effects throughout the solar system" according to NASA. The sun's North Pole has already changed its sign from negative to positive according to Todd Hoeksema, a physicist at Stanford University. The sun's South Pole will also change its sign soon and the reversal of magnetic fields will "signal the midpoint of Solar Cycle 24" according to Hoeksema. It seems we've recorded 23 prior Solar Cycles and we experience approximately one every 11 years which happens naturally according to SPACE.com. "The sun's polar magnetic fields weaken, go to zero, and then emerge again with the opposite polarity.

The shift reportedly changes weather patterns but also provides extra protection for us from dangerous cosmic rays. This current change is reportedly the weakest in 100 years according to SPACE.com. All our gardeners want to know is what the weather will be next year so we can plan our seed purchases. PREYING UPON THE PRAYING

Occasionally a panhandler may approach parishioners asking for money. This may be especially uncomfortable for parishioners if this occurs on a weekend before or after Masses. St. James parishioners are known for their generosity and often wish to respond with a cash donation. However, this is not recommended for one's personal safety or for the overall welfare of the one asking for assistance.

The Sussex Food Pantry and the parish St. Vincent de Paul Society are supported by the donations of parishioners and are the designated ways to respond to people requesting assistance. If approached by a panhandler one may respond by saying something like, "I have donated to St. Vincent de Paul or to the Food Pantry so that they are equipped to help you. Please contact them." Do not engage in a debate or attempt to analyze the request. You may give the requestor a bulletin with the telephone numbers (St. Vincent de Paul is contacted through the parish number.) Giving this information is the best response as both of these groups are equipped to deal not only with the immediate need but with any underlying or larger issues by making the appropriate referrals. If you ever feel threatened by anyone begging for money please immediately contact someone nearby such as an usher.

The Gospel demands that we respond to the needs of the poor and we are able to do that through our donations to Sussex Outreach (Food Pantry) and St. Vincent de Paul. Thus, a referral to these groups is not a refusal to help but in essence is an act of charity as those requesting assistance may obtain the proper response and have access to a range of services through the generosity of this community. Thank you for your generous donations to St. Vincent de Paul and the Sussex Food Pantry.
