WHEREAS, Safe Environment Week is for every parish and school, as well as the entire faith community to focus, at the same time, on the importance of keeping our children and youth safe;

WHEREAS, child abuse and neglect are societal problems whose prevention depend on involvement among people throughout the faith community;

WHEREAS, our children are our most valuable resources and will shape the future of not only the Archdiocese of Milwaukee but also the entire Church;

WHEREAS, the theme for this years' Safe Environment Week will follow the Year of Mercy and we can share with children and youth the merciful love of the Father;

WHEREAS, promoting the Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy at home, at school and beyond are a way in which we can ensure an environment in which all are safe;

WHEREAS, we acknowledge that we must work together as a community to increase awareness about child abuse and neglect and work to promote the social and emotional well-being of children, youth and families in a safe, healthy and nurturing environment;

THEREFORE, I, Archbishop Jerome E. Listecki proclaim the week of April 17 - 23, 2016 as Safe Environment Week in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. I ask that all participate and acknowledge each other with the love and mercy of God the Father.

- Today's gospel selection from John contains one of my all time favorite quotes from Jesus, "Come, have breakfast!" We continue reading of the appearances of the Risen Lord to the disciples. The fishermen caught nothing all night. They hear a voice from the shore tell them to cast their net to the other side of the boat. There was such a haul, they could barely pull all the fish into the boat.



- The disciple "whom Jesus loved" - (what do you think that means?!) was the first to recognize that the voice on shore came from the Lord who had been crucified! Impetuous Peter jumps into the lake, eager to encounter Jesus.

- What a surprise Peter receives when Jesus asks him not once, but three times, "Do you love me?" Peter must have a short memory! Not too long before, during the crucifixion of Jesus, he denied even knowing Jesus. Now Jesus offers him just as many times to affirm his love.

- And how is Peter to affirm his love for Jesus? "Feed my lambs. Tend my sheep. Feed my sheep."

- We sometimes sing the song, "The God of Second Chances." What a powerful reminder that there are third and more chances to respond to the call of the Lord. As we enter more fully into the Easter Season, let's respond to the Lord's invitation to "have breakfast" with him, and take advantage of all the chances He issues us to demonstrate our love for him.

- I continue to collect tuition money for the three children in Tanzania that we are helping to achieve an education. Thanks to those who have generously responded. Parish Trustee Position Opening

Wisconsin Law requires that every parish have two trustees, each serving a two year term. Trustees must be parish members, practicing Catholics and at least 25 years of age. The position of **Trustee-Secretary** for St. James Parish becomes available this year. Fr. Mike has nominated Paul Stevens for the position. Additional interested candidates must submit to the Parish Office a written nomination form signed by 10 or more registered parish members. Nomination forms are available by calling Terri Weber in the Parish Office (262)253-2259 or by e-mail webert@archmil.org. All nomination forms must be received in the Parish Office by 12:00 Noon, Friday, May 13. Elections will take place the weekend of May 28 & 29.

TRUSTEE-SECRETARY POSITION DESCRIPTION

The secretary is responsible for corporate record keeping at the parish other than financial records, such as corporate minutes, documents, notices and correspondence. One of the major responsibilities of the trustee-secretary is to ensure that parish records are kept on parish grounds in an easily accessible and orderly fashion. The trustee-secretary is responsible for maintaining records of all real property, property tax exemption, the parish inventory and the parish census. Although it is not required, the trustee-secretary could be an ex-officio member of the Personnel Committee or the Parish Planning Committee.

St. James is committed to the faith development of all parish families and their children. State law bans electronics and appliances from landfills and incinerators due to the valuable materials that can be recycled and reused, including precious metals like gold and copper and hazardous materials such as lead, mercury, cadmium, chromium and chemical flame retardants that need to be disposed of properly. On Saturday, April 19 from 9:00 a.m. to noon, a one-day collection of electronics and appliances will be held in Hartland at 701 Progress Drive.

Items that will be collected for a cash only fee: television sets (\$20 each); Cathode Ray Tube computer monitors (\$5 each). Items collected at no fee: computers, other computer monitors, printers, keyboards, laptops, scanners, DVD players, VCRs, stereos, cell phones, telephones, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, refrigerators, microwaves, watercoolers, freezers, water heaters, washer/dryers, stoves, oven/ranges, dishwashers. **Want to recycle your CFL lightbulbs?** Place them in the basket next to the Lost and Found in the gathering space.

A note from Brigitte Glinski, Parish Nurse:

**Are you thinking about retiring?
Here's some food for thought.**

A recent analysis of data from the annual National Health Interview Survey found that working older adults were generally healthier than their retired or unemployed peers. The association between health and work remained strong, even after accounting for other health-related factors. The data they looked at came from over 83,000 Americans, over the age of 65, 87 percent of these adults did not work. Those who were still working primarily held white collar jobs. Compared with working seniors, those who did not work were three times as likely to report fair or poor health as their working counterparts. The non working group was more likely to need help with routine activities. Those who had worked white collar jobs were more likely to suffer from chronic illness, such as diabetes or high blood pressure, while those who had worked in blue collar jobs were less likely to have mobility issues.

Does this mean that working longer improves your health? It's hard to say, but keep in mind that a job you enjoy can challenge your mind, keep you active and connected with others, and provide a sense of purpose.
