

From The Servant's Quarters

• These Easter days we immerse ourselves into the gospel accounts of the resurrection appearances. We can glean some fascinating insights from these recorded experiences of the Risen Lord. There is a continuity of the identity of Jesus from before death to after death. It is still Jesus! But he is now present in a new and a different way. He no longer "comes and goes." All of the sudden he is "just present!" Some have mistakenly described this new way of being as Jesus "passing through locked doors." That's not quite accurate. We are told "the doors were locked." Jesus was simply present, and "stood in their midst."



• If I had been through all that the earthly Jesus endured, the first thing I would have said is, "Where were you guys? You all deserted me! You said you'd stand by me! You would die for me! You left me "holding the bag!"

• What does Jesus REALLY say? **PEACE BE WITH YOU!** The concern of the Risen Lord is totally for our own well-being. He breathes upon us and says, "Receive the Holy Spirit." He empowers us with the ability to bring healing and forgiveness to others. If Jesus can forgive after all he went through, don't you think we should embrace the same posture? There's no room in the Christian heart for holding a grudge, for seeking revenge.

• Some of us may know in a very pointed way how difficult this can be. Some of us may have experienced deep betrayal and abandonment and find it next to impossible to be reconciled. Only the Spirit of the Risen Lord can empower us to do what otherwise might be "humanly" impossible.

• We have these 50 days of Easter to allow the Lord to breathe His Spirit of healing, forgiveness, and reconciliation. When we gather to celebrate Pentecost Sunday in a few weeks, may our world be more reflective of the Light and the Spirit of the Risen Lord we celebrate this Easter.

• If you were at the 10:30 am Mass last Sunday you experienced a rather abrupt ending to the liturgy. I'm happy to report that the gentleman who collapsed is doing much better. He spent the afternoon at the hospital, and was home by evening. We continue prayers for his continued good health.

• Many thanks to all who helped to make Holy Week and Easter so beautiful and inspiring. It's a joy for me to experience the varied gifts and generous willingness

of so many to help build up the Spirit of St. James Parish.

• Pope John Paul II sometime ago made the Second Sunday of Easter "Divine Mercy Sunday." We open our hearts to God's healing this weekend as we celebrate the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. Our community prayers are with those living with the infirmities of aging, the pain of chronic conditions, and also mental and emotional stress. May Christ the Divine Healer sustain and comfort all those suffering among us.

FIELDS OF HOPE & DREAMS And HOLY GROUND GARDEN



Did you notice the moon last weekend? It provided light throughout our evening activities and added to our sacred Holy day celebrations. We had an opportunity to see a total lunar eclipse or "Blood Moon" on Holy Saturday. It's appearance on Passover was

somewhat prophetic, as we were retold of the night the Jews spread blood on their door posts and lentils before their exodus from Egypt. The "Blood Moon" started at 4:00 a.m. and total eclipse lasted 5 minutes around 6:22 a.m. Did you see it? Did the moon help prepare you for Easter?

Did you know some gardeners try to plant around moon cycles. The moon's influence over bodies of water is universally accepted - as in rising tides. If the moon really does exert a force causing tides to raises, the thinking is, it also raises groundwater, providing nutrient carrying water from the roots through the stem to the leaves. Tulane University in New Orleans studied seed absorption and germination rates during different lunar month times and found improvements not only in vegetables but in trees. The lunar month is divided into four quarters. During the first two quarters, beginning with the appearance of the new moon, the moon is waxing, or growing. This is the time to plant or transplant above ground crops. The third quarter, when the moon begins to wane, is the time to plant root crops. And don't plant anything during the last quarter, that's a barren time, best reserved for weeding and cultivating according to moon-planting sages. You can check the *Farmer's Almanac*, nightly news/weather or "Google" moon phases for more specifics of moon phases. Of course, these are some pretty broad timeframes and many other variables enter into a successful planting/garden. If any of you have any thoughts or experience with moon phase planting, let our garden volunteers know. We all try to learn from each other, which is what makes our community garden initiatives fun to belong to.

"ANNOUNCE THE RESURRECTION"

My favorite Easter story is Jesus appearing to Mary Magdalen. On her own, she goes to the tomb. When she runs into Jesus, she does not recognize him. Fran Ferder asks, "How often do we miss the revelation of the holy because ordinariness gets in the way? Our expectations prevent us from seeing beyond what is right before our eyes. What we see immediately before us is all we see...It is possible to live our entire lives in spiritual limbo between the sorrow we know and the risen life that we cannot possibly imagine. That is how it was for Mary of Magdala"

And then she hears her name: Mary! "A simple acknowledgment of her presence...**He says her name**. In naming Mary, he names every woman who has been left out, made anonymous, ignored. Then the most incredible thing happens: He tells her to "go to my brothers and say to them 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.' He commissioned her, **a woman**, to be the **first** to announce the resurrection. In a remarkable twist of patriarchal protocol, she a woman, will proclaim to the men." This narrative "conveys Mary of Magdala's importance in the early Christian community. She carries her newfound Easter faith to the disciples." To whom have you carried your Easter faith? "I have seen the Lord." Where have you seen the Lord?
