God's Call to Love and Respect Others

To know that we are children of God is to live in complete love with deep abiding security and the ability to dream, to sing, to create, to laugh, and to play without worry. It is a freedom to love—with full trust and confidence—the creatures whom God has sent to us in our world. As we grow older, we face a new reality. We cannot approach all God's creation with the same trust and confidence. We learn, through sometimes hurtful and damaging experiences, that some people reject the ability that God gave them to love and respect others—they ignore God's call to love and respect others.

Keeping God's Children Protected and Safe

To know that we are children of God is to live in complete love, with deep abiding security and the ability to dream, to sing, to create, to laugh, and to play without worry. As we grow older, we face a new reality—we cannot approach all God's creation with the same trust and confidence. We learn, through sometimes hurtful and damaging experiences, that some people reject the ability that God gave them to love and respect others—they ignore God's call. The Archdiocese of Milwaukee's program to safeguard children helps remind us of these very facts. With the help of this program, the faithful are guided and educated about the responsibility of how to keep God's children protected and safe.

Five Steps to Safer Environments

The Archdiocese of Milwaukee mandates that all people who work and volunteer with children and youth in our parishes and schools must undergo safe environment education. The education details five steps to prevent child sexual abuse: Know the warning signs of an inappropriate relationship with a child.

Know the warning signs!

Control access to children by carefully selecting the adults who work with children and youth.

Monitor all programs for the safety of children and youth.

Be aware of and sensitive to what is going on in the lives of children.

Communicate concerns to the appropriate person in authority.

• These weeks of Easter are meant to increase our ability to recognize and hear the Voice of the one who offers us eternal life. Have you been reading the book we gave as an Easter gift, "Rediscovering Jesus?" What a great hearing aid! We are surrounded by many voices in our culture and day to day lives. We need to make an effort to sift through them all to tune in to the Voice of the Good Shepherd. Sometimes the Lord speaks through the voices of those around us. We need the gift of discernment if we are to be "good sheep" that can tune into the Voice of the Shepherd.

• We have a great opportunity to help one another here the Voice. Various opportunities are now offered this spring to gather with fellow sheep to discuss our latest Matthew Kelly Book. If you can't participate in one of the organized groups, maybe you can form your own with your neighbors, or household, or some co-workers.

• The Scriptures this weekend mix the images of "lamb" and "shepherd." In some ways it may seem contradictory. The Lamb of God is the one slain in the process of offering the world the fullness of life. This slain and risen Lamb is also the shepherd leading the sheep! Perhaps what we can take away from this is that our Good Shepherd is also one of us in our human lives, in our sufferings, in our joys. That's how He leads us, in solidarity with us. He knows our human condition, from the inside out. What seems to be contradictory is actually a great mystery, a great consolation. Nothing in our human condition is foreign to the Lamb once slain, who is our Good Shepherd, helping us to navigate successfully through this life. He offers us a taste of the fullness of life here and now, that will spill over some day into eternity.

POSITION DESCRIPTION

The secretary is responsible for corporate record keeping at the parish other than financial records, such as corporate minutes, documents, notices and correspondence. One of the major responsibilities of the trustee-secretary is to ensure that parish records are kept on parish grounds in an easily accessible and orderly fashion. The trustee-secretary is responsible for maintaining records of all real property, property tax exemption, the parish inventory and the parish census. Although it is not required, the trustee-secretary could be an ex-officio member of the Personnel Committee or the Parish Planning Committee.

Messages from our PA



- At the Christian Formation GIFT program last Sunday, I was asked to address the following questions about religion and politics: "Why do politics always play a role in religion? Is that necessary? Do priests endorse candidates? Why or why not? How do we deal with Christianity in politics in the US? (e.g. racism/bigotry, Trump, Mexicans,...)" Without detailing my whole response, I want to make parishioners aware that there is a great little pamphlet published by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB). The pamphlet offers guidance to Catholics in the exercise of our rights and duties as citizens in our democracy. The pamphlet is titled ***Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship***, and is available from the USCCB website: www.usccb.org.
- This past Saturday, the staff and Pastoral Council of our parish participated in a joint retreat day to build our relationships and clarify our roles in working together to make St. James parish the best-version-of-itself that it can be. One priority that resurfaced during the day, and I'm sure is shared by most parishioners, is the need to **get more of our parishioners to attend Mass more often** as well as be more engaged in the life and activities of the parish. The parish has established a **New Evangelization Team – NET**, to formally address that priority among others. However, part of the discussion in my small group at the retreat raised the insight that ***the goal of getting more parishioners to attend Mass, in order to be successful, will have to be an effort that involves the whole parish, not just a committee, or staff, or council, but all of us working and ministering together, with a shared vision and purpose.***

St. James Community Gardens

The planning has started and the work has begun. Unlike the way some of us may have studied for tests by pulling an 'all nighter', you can't cheat with gardening. You have to meet the deadlines or you're dead in the water. We are now about 4 to 6 weeks out from the average last frost of the season and the seeds are already being started.

For those of you not playing along at home, here is what is happening. After seeds have been tucked into a specially formulated, moistened, growing medium at their appropriate depth, they are left to germinate. The trays of soil are put on warming mats which keep the soil between 70 and 85 degrees. It may take anywhere from 5 days to a couple of weeks for the plants to poke their leaves above ground. Once the plants have appeared, the mat is removed and the plants are exposed to light. Ideally they should get between 14 and 16 hours of light a day. Since that's not possible in Wisconsin at this time of year, many growers supplement the sunlight with artificial lights.



Are you getting the idea why some greenhouses are called nurseries? We'll take you through more of the process next week.
