Preventing Child Abuse Is Everyone's Responsibility It is every adult's moral responsibility to protect possible victims by reporting the suspected abuse or neglect to the responsible authorities. Sexual abuse of minors is a pervasive societal problem, and only concerted and sustained efforts by all adults in every segment of society can help to protect children and youth. **To report suspected abuse of a minor, call your local authorities or Child Protective Services.**

Know Your Kids' School Parents and guardians have the primary responsibility for protecting their children from all potential harm. When choosing a nursery, daycare center, or school, parents should inspect the building and grounds to make sure there are no areas where children play or work that are “off limits” to parents. Such facilities should have a policy that welcomes parents to visit the center or school without prior appointment. Source: Philip J. Ensuring Your Child's School Is Safe Every teacher, coach, and volunteer who works with children in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee's parishes and schools must have a background check before he or she is permitted to work in any school- or parish-related job or activity that involves contact with children. But what about the children who attend non-Catholic private or public schools? Talk with school administrators and find out what steps they take to protect children from harm. Suggest that they review other abuse prevention programs to ensure that their policies and practices are up to date. And demand that all employees and volunteers who work in the school be properly screened, including background checks, before they are allowed to be near your children.

Keeping Your Child's Personal Information Personal If your children give out personal information over the Internet, not only is it easy to track, it's tough to completely remove. Emphasize to them how important it is that they keep personal information private. Make sure that they have a strong (ideally, alphanumeric) username and password that don't reveal anything personal. Encourage them not to give out their e-mail address, if they have one. If your children tell you that they have given out personal information online, contact your Internet service provider or the site where the information is posted to see what you can do to have it removed. Parents and Guardians: Get Involved Parents and guardians play a key role in the success of parish programs for young people. Parents and guardians who are involved in parish programs and events will be in the best position to protect their own children as well as all the children in the parish community. Involvement and communication are important factors in helping to ensure safe environments for all of our children.

- As an 18 year old novice with the Capuchin Franciscans, today's second reading (Revelations 21, 1-5) took on special meaning for me. Our novice master, Fr. Keith Clark took this text to form the basis of a very hope-filled and triumphant hymn entitled, *I Saw the New Jerusalem*.

- If you were at my Dad's funeral two years ago you heard our  choir perform the St. James debut of this hymn. If you come to my funeral, you'll hear it again!

- *I saw the New Jerusalem coming down from our God, adorned like a bride prepared to meet her husband!* I was asked to suggest a Scripture passage for the side of our most recent Columbarium in the parish cemetery. This refrain is what you will find engraved on it. (Here are the verses.)

*Every tear shall be wiped from your eyes,
and there will be no more sorrow!*

*I give the water of life to anyone who is thirsty!
By day the gates will never be closed, and there
will be no night there!*

*Very soon I will be with you to reward the
deserving!*

*I will be your God and you will be my people!
The Spirit and the Bride say: "Come! Let all who
hear say: "Come, Lord Jesus!"*

- This rousing hymn inspired a deep desire in me to enter into the Heavenly Kingdom. It was hard to imagine that I would probably need to go through a whole life time in this world before experiencing this fullness of life with our God!

- And yet here I am, 45 years later! I now understand a little bit more that we are a part of the in-breaking of this heavenly vision into the here and now! We will be prepared to enter the hereafter, whenever that might be for each of us, if we allow this hope and dynamism to be the driving force of our lives in this world.

- Hopefully the Easter Season is igniting the life of the Holy Spirit within us and among us. Our talents, personalities, resources, bodies, and spirits are all meant to be at the service of the Risen Lord establishing God's Sovereign action in the human condition. Can you feel the "burn?"

- I only need about \$400 more to send the spring tuition to the three Tanzanian children we are helping to educate. Thanks so much to the dozen or so people that have responded generously. A check can be made out to me. I wire the money from my personal checking account using Western Union.

- Our pastoral staff and pastoral council are very grateful for the 1,000 plus of you who responded to our survey regarding a summer Mass schedule. Because so many people take vacation and travel throughout the summer, attendance is often light at the weekend Masses. Our spirits are better nourished when the church is comfortably full. We are more energized. The majority of people who responded were open to one Mass Sunday mornings. The survey showed that the most favored time would be 9:00 am.

- We understand that there are many family routines that would need to be somewhat altered with such a summer change. So we believe we were led by the Holy Spirit to a trial compromise. The schedule will stay the same except for the month of July. During July there will be only one Mass on Sunday morning: 9:00 am. The exception is Mass on the Grass (July 24). The time for the one Mass that day will be 10:30 as in previous years. The Saturday afternoon 4:30 Mass will remain in place at all times. We pray that this will serve everyone well. We'll seek your feedback in the fall.

POSITION DESCRIPTION

The secretary is responsible for corporate record keeping at the parish other than financial records, such as corporate minutes, documents, notices and correspondence. One of the major responsibilities of the trustee-secretary is to ensure that parish records are kept on parish grounds in an easily accessible and orderly fashion. The trustee-secretary is responsible for maintaining records of all real property, property tax exemption, the parish inventory and the parish census. Although it is not required, the trustee-secretary could be an ex-officio member of the Personnel Committee or the Parish Planning Committee.

A note from Parish Nurse, Brigitte Glinski

Do you have old prescription drugs sitting around in your medicine cabinet? Are you unsure of where and how to safely dispose of those prescriptions? You are not alone.



It's not safe to hold onto the drugs, the abuse of prescription drugs is skyrocketing, particularly painkillers, among teenagers and young adults. Many teens think these drugs are safe to use because they have legitimate uses. These medications are just as dangerous and addicting as street narcotics and other illicit drugs. For the first time, there are as many new abusers, as young as 12 years old, of prescription drugs as marijuana.

You should not flush old prescription drugs, drugs cannot be filtered out of the public water supply; drugs have been detected in the drinking water supply of over 46 million Americans.

So what can you do with those drugs? There are yearly collections here in Waukesha County; the next collection is scheduled for April 30th from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. at Community Memorial Hospital.

Another option is to take your old prescriptions to one of three locations (drop boxes are located at: Waukesha County Sheriff Office, Pewaukee City Hall and the Village of Sussex). Simply black out your personal information, but leave the medication information visible on the bottle and drop it in the box. The drugs are then disposed of at a state licensed incinerator. If you cannot take your old prescription in right away, make sure to keep them out of sight and under lock and key.

St. James Community Gardens

Continuing last week's description of how seedlings grow...

The first leaves that you see from the seedlings are actually parts of the seed. These 'leaves' curl out and reach upward while the roots are busy reaching downward; so the plant is getting nourishment from both sides. When it has gathered enough energy from the sun and the soil, the plant sends out 'true leaves'. Unlike the first generic looking leaves, these leaves resemble the adult plant. The seedlings still need care...some of them start leaning toward their source of light, so gardeners rotate the plants to keep them growing straight. In order to help strengthen the stems, some gardeners periodically brush their hands gently over the plants causing them to bend ever so slightly. Other gardeners aim a gentle fan at the seedlings.



After a few weeks the seedlings resemble the adult plants they are becoming. Some grow straight up, others crawl around and tangle up in nearby plants. As one of our gardeners said, "The peppers are well behaved, but the tomatoes are always holding hands."

When the plants are a few inches tall, hardening off can begin. The plants are gradually exposed to outdoor sunlight and temperature a few hours at a time. After about a week of hardening, the plants are finally ready to face the world on their own. Come and 'adopt' your favorite plants at our **annual plant sale coming May 22/23.**
