

## From The Servant's Quarters

- The Easter Season draws us closer to the celebration of the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. Next weekend we celebrate the Ascension of the Lord to the Father's Right hand.  The Risen Lord promises not to leave us "orphans." Though he is no longer present as in a human way before the crucifixion, He now promises to journey through life with us through His Spirit.

- These Easter days are the prime time for celebrating Christian Initiation. Two weeks ago we baptized 9 infants. Part of the ritual says to the proud parents, "What do you ask of God's church." They answer, **Life in Christ!** The presider then challenges them. "You have asked to have your child baptized in Christ. Gina Gonzales gave \$300 in memory of her beloved brother Scotty Quattrochi who died a few weeks ago. Thank you so much.

### **Parish Trustee Position Opening**

Wisconsin Law requires that every parish have two trustees, each serving a two year term. Trustees must be parish members, practicing Catholics and at least 25 years of age. The position of **Trustee-Secretary** for St. James Parish becomes available this year. Fr. Mike has nominated Paul Stevens for the position. Additional interested candidates must submit to the Parish Office a written nomination form signed by 10 or more registered parish members. All nomination forms must be received in the Parish Office by 12:00 Noon, Friday, May 13. Elections will take place the weekend of May 28 & 29.

#### **TRUSTEE-SECRETARY POSITION DESCRIPTION**

The secretary is responsible for corporate record keeping at the parish other than financial records, such as corporate minutes, documents, notices and correspondence. One of the major responsibilities of the trustee-secretary is to ensure that parish records are kept on parish grounds in an easily accessible and orderly fashion. The trustee-secretary is responsible for maintaining records of all real property, property tax exemption, the parish inventory and the parish census. Although it is not required, the trustee-secretary could be an ex-officio member of the Personnel Committee or the Parish Planning Committee.

### A note from Brigitte Glinski, Parish Nurse

Portion sizes have gotten out of control, but there are some simple techniques that you can use to help train your brain to recognize healthy portion sizes. By using portion control as your primary healthy eating strategy, you can eat almost any food you want while keeping calories in check. If you eat healthy portions, you could reduce your calorie intake by almost one-third a day, which could lead to a one pound a week weight loss.

Following are some easy ways to control portion size.

- First, scoop and pour, pull out the measuring cups and spoons, you would be surprised to see what a real portion of your favorite cereal is as opposed to what you actually eat every day.
- When dining out, share your meal with a friend. Eat your own healthy starter, a soup or salad, and then split the entrée with someone, studies show that we are likely to eat more if the portion size is large.
- Make sure to watch portions of healthy food too, you know that nuts like almonds are healthy for you, but they are also high in calories. Often people underestimate how many calories there are in healthy foods.
- Eat filling foods, things like whole grains, beans, vegetables, and fruits can fill you up a lot longer than chips or cookies.
- Try to take smaller bites, research has found that those who take smaller bites will eat thirty percent less food than those taking large bites.
- Sometimes oversized portions can be helpful. Eat a large salad, load up on the veggies, but watch the extras: cheese, croutons and dressing can really increase your caloric intake.
- Eat your veggies family style, portion out carbs and protein, but put a large bowl of veggies on the table so you can help yourself to filling, low calorie side.

Trying these simple tricks will help to change your eating habits without too much effort, and may even help you to lose a few pounds.

## Laudato Si' On Care for Our Common Home Available Water

"Greater scarcity of water will lead to an increase in the cost of food and the various products which depend on its use. Some studies warn that an acute water shortage may occur within a few decades unless urgent action is taken." [LS 31]



Some chemicals commonly used on lawns and gardens have been associated with birth defects, mutations, adverse reproductive effects, and cancer in laboratory animals. Children before the age of five, infants, and fetuses may be especially vulnerable to the health effects of pesticides as their cells are normally reproducing most rapidly. **Teach your children to recognize pesticide application signs and to stay off lawns with these treatment signs.** Pick up a flyer on Alternative Lawn Care at the display in the gathering space.

## St. James Community Gardens

It may sound as if we're stating the obvious when we say, "The gardens keep growing." Of course they are growing...it's spring and the seeds have been planted; what would you expect? But the gardens are growing, or, perhaps expanding is a better word. Ray Gross, a St. James parishioner, has been working on an elevated garden bed to add to our various plots. We already have raised beds which are like garden boxes on the ground. Raised beds warm up earlier in spring and are generally easier to maintain than beds that are level with the ground. An elevated bed is different...it is completely off the ground, rather like a garden on a table.

The plan is that this elevated garden will be located on the patio and will be a place to grow herbs. (Did you know that pound for pound, herbs are some of the priciest produce to purchase at the store? That alone makes them a great addition to our food pantry donation.) The best part of the elevated garden is that it will open up volunteering to an additional group of parishioners. Because there will be no bending down required, this bed will be ideal for those who are finding themselves physically limited.

Our thanks go out to Ray for his vision and hard work. Watch for an herb bed coming to a church patio near you.
