Operation Backpack





There will be a collection bin at church until **August 16th**. Suggested items include:

(If you prefer, we will also accept gift cards to stores that sell school supplies. We will use them to purchase additional supplies.)



We are, again, accepting cash donations. This money will be given to Sussex Outreach Services for distribution throughout the year to families that have difficulty affording field trips or other special school expenses.

From The Servant's Quarters

• When I plan a vacation, I usually try to make sure I can commune with a big body of water in some way. Normally that would be one of our oceans! Last week I settled for the Gulf of Mexico! That can pass for an ocean! There's something about a great expanse of water that draws me out of myself. The roar of the waves is soothing. The sun setting at the end of the day gives a splash of color, unique each evening.



• I spent last week at Clearwater Beach, Florida. I experienced more water than I bargained for! It rained almost constantly every day. The locals told me that they were up to 22 days of that weather pattern. Then I learned it was also hurricane season! So my week away provided me with a unique water experience that I'm still trying to appreciate! One morning I looked up and there was a reassuring rainbow, reminding me of God's covenant with us.

• When I vacation, I usually ask myself, "Is this a place I'd like to live in retirement?" Clearwater Beach is on the list, but perhaps not on the top!

• And speaking of water! I returned to discover water issues here at the parish! You might be aware that we have huge vats of water in the mezzanine over the church sanctuary for the fire sprinkling system. One of them is leaking!

• Also, the rectory is rather old, I think from the 1940's. We discovered growing water damage from a slow leak from one of the upstairs bathrooms. We're in the midst of addressing both these situations.

• And you probably don't want to visit the rectory basement, the portion under the historic chapel. Bats have found that to be a cozy home to inhabit. Don't worry, Knights of Columbus, your portion of the basement is sealed off from bat heaven.

• If you take a closer look at the parking lot around the church, you will notice the need for major work and resealing. Ah, the joys of good old summer time and the continual needs of maintaining a big plant.

• I'm sharing this with you with the hopes that it will inspire some additional donations to address these needed repairs. Maybe you can squeeze out a few dollars for St. James Parish before all the back to school expenses kick in. We have 2,000 registered household which means about 6,000 people! If everyone gave just a little, or just a little more, we'd be in great shape.

• Volunteers are one of our greatest resources. The gardens, potted plants, and flower beds around the property are the best they've looked in many years.

Thanks so much to all who are making our outdoor environment so welcoming and beautiful.

• And in the name of all of us, thanks to everyone who made this year's celebration of "Mass on the Grass" such a memorable and uplifting experience. It was a great way to praise The Almighty for the gift of James the Apostle.

• A visitor to Israel attended a concert at the Moscovitz Auditorium, and was inspired with the architecture and acoustics. He asked the guide, "Is this named after Chaim Moscovitz, the famous scholar?" "No. Its named after Sam Moscovitz." "I never heard of him. What did he write?" "A check!"

Parish Nurse Position

St. James Parish, Menomonee Falls is seeking a professional, experienced faith filled person to fulfill the role of Parish Nurse. The Parish Nurse works closely with the pastoral staff and volunteers to provide a healing ministry within the parish community to foster and nurture the holistic health of its members and neighbors, focusing on Mind, Body and Spirit. The Parish Nurse is the Coordinator of Health Ministry and serves as educator, counselor, referral agent and advocate based on the needs of the parishioners.

Qualified candidates must be a graduate of an accredited school or college of nursing with 3 to 5 years of nursing experience, hold an active Wisconsin RN license, have parish nurse certification or be willing to work towards certification (parish will reimburse 50% of tuition cost) and have a valid driver's license. A BSN is helpful, but not required. Applicants must be a practicing Roman Catholic and have a familiarity and understanding of Catholic traditions and practices.

FIELDS OF HOPE & DREAMS And HOLY GROUND GARDENS

The community garden volunteers had a couple of “road trip” events. Instead of taking all of our vegetables to the Cooperating Churches of Sussex’s (CCOS) food pantry, some of our vegetables were taken to low to moderate income apartment complexes for direct donations to area residents.



These were community building events within Sussex (a mini “fair” if you will) sponsored by the University of Wisconsin-Extension. A free picnic was the main draw. We brought bags of fresh vegetables to hand out. Sussex Outreach

Services (SOS) was there explaining the services they provide, along with a Food Nutritionist to help educate residents about the benefits of healthy eating. Community Memorial Hospital brought produce from their community garden to hand out and the Waukesha County Police brought a squad car and drug sniffing dog to introduce themselves in a friendly, non-threatening manner. The Sussex Volunteer Fire Department brought an ambulance, all to educate residents about the community services available to them. Kids loved the picnic, climbing in the ambulance, and petting the police dog.

There were over 50 people at the first event. Many young parents in their “twenties” with many kids under the age of 10 running around with a Pinata breaking contest at the end. The second event was equally attended, although the majority of residents at the second event were elderly and/or had disabilities. The same group of “exhibitors” were at the second event, and the same services were explained and vegetables were handed out along with a free picnic. Of course, we were recruiting volunteers to help in our gardens and we will have a couple of teenage youth to help out, who have to fulfill community service hours. We’ll have to supervise them and track their hours to report their progress. We’ve done this before with a couple of youth and it’s worked out well for both the youth and our gardens.

We’re helping fulfill the “community” mission of our community gardens in a different or wider context of community within our Sussex Hamilton School District – the area serviced by St. James and the CCOS food pantry. STEPPING ON

St. James parish is sponsoring a falls prevention class that is given by the Aging and Disability Resource Center of Waukesha County beginning the 23rd of September through the 4th of November, every Wednesday from 10 am- 12 pm in our cafeteria. The class is called, **Stepping On**, and is a 7 week program perfect for adults who have fallen in the past year or for those who have a “healthy respect” for the consequences of a fall.

This highly interactive workshop covers exercises to improve strength and balance. Participants are empowered to take an active role in fall prevention. Weekly topics explore the role that vision, medications, sleep, home hazards and footwear play in falls prevention. Simple balance and strengthening exercises are taught as well.

Catholics Returning Home ~ Do you know someone who has left the Church? Most of us do not have to look very far to find non-practicing Catholics in our circle of family and friends. Many of us are concerned about these loved ones; however, we don’t know how to help them. Obviously, most of them are searching, but how can we help them find their way home?

As baptized, practicing Catholics we have a precious gift of faith and love from the Lord that needs to be shared with our non-practicing brothers and sisters. First, we need to pray for them. Secondly, we need to extend a personal invitation to them to come home to the Catholic Church. Most non-practicing Catholics are waiting for an invitation to return. Many mistakenly think they are excommunicated and are not welcome to return for a variety of reasons.

Many non-practicing Catholics carry a tremendous amount of guilt and misinformation about the Church so they are afraid of approaching the Church for fear of being rejected. You can make a tremendous difference in someone’s life simply by reaching out to them and telling them that we miss them and would like for them to come back home to our Church family.
