

* *Rejoice in the Lord always! I shall say it again: rejoice! And how do we show our joy? Your kindness should be known to all.* That's a tall order! How can we be kind to those who are less than kind to us? During this Advent hopefully we are being transformed more into "Christ" so we can be loving to the "unlovable."



* In getting to know families, I like to look at the kids. Then look at the parents. Then look at the kids. And again the parents! I enjoy seeing the resemblances of kids to their parents.

* God is our Heavenly Parent. People should be able to experience us and catch a glimpse of the Almighty. I think that is exactly what Pope Francis is aiming for by launching us into this Jubilee Year of Mercy.

* First and foremost we need to acknowledge our need for God's Mercy. One way to do this is the celebration of the sacrament of reconciliation on Tuesday, December 15, 7:00 pm at St. Agnes in Butler. This will be our cluster communal celebration of penance. Hope you are able to participate.

* The question the crowds put to John the Baptist is apropos for us as well, "What are we to do?" If you have two coats, give one to someone who has none. The same with food! 

A Note from Parish Nurse, Brigitte Glinski

The holidays can be difficult when you have lost a loved one. Around every corner there is a painful reminder of them. Even years after their death, the holidays may still be a struggle. But there are things that you can do to help the holidays have new meaning.

You have to remember to be patient and realistic, we often times picture the holidays as we want them to be, not as how they will be. You have to remember that you are still grieving. Make sure to plan ahead so that you are not overwhelmed by holiday responsibilities, make lists and prioritize. Make sure to listen to your heart and know your limits. Be aware of your needs, and make sure to inform your loved ones. You do not have to accept every invitation, it is OK to say no, and make your yeses tentative. If you do not have the energy, remember it is fine to cancel, your loved ones will understand. Take care of yourself physically, make sure to eat well, do not try to numb your pain by overindulgence. Exercise is a good tool to elevate your mood, make the time for it. If holiday traditions are hard, adapt them. If you find that you are alone because of your loss, reach out to a soup kitchen, or a nursing home, you may find some companionship and bonding over shared loss. Don't deny yourself the tears, they can be healing. Remember that you will be unpacking memories as you unpack your holiday decorations. Try to remember all the joy that you had with your loved one at this time of the year. Advent is the season of light, so remember the light that your loved one has brought to your life.

As you move through your grief it will become easier to focus on your loved one's life, and not death, allowing you to heal.
