Matthew 25 Year of Mercy

On Ash Wednesday Pope Francis commissioned "Missionaries of Mercy," priest-confessors sent forth worldwide as "living signs of the Father's readiness to welcome those in search of [God's] pardon." In a way, though, Pope Francis challenges all of us to become "missionaries of mercy" (*Misericordiae Vultus*, 18) by living Lent in this *Jubilee Year of Mercy* "more intensely as a privileged moment to celebrate and experience God's mercy" (*MV*, 17). Francis bids us make the prophet Micah's words our own: "God . . . who does not persist in anger forever, but delights rather in clemency. You will cast into the depths of the sea all our sins" (Micah 7:18, 19). Having experienced God's mercy ourselves in the unconditional forgiveness of our sins, how eager we should be to invite others to know the peace of God's boundless mercy; perhaps even to experience, through our reaching out in gentle kindness and compassionate care, something of God's unconditional love for them.

• Remember the gift of the book *Four Signs of a Dynamic Catholic*? We'd like to provide another book as a gift to the entire parish, Rediscovering Jesus. We hope to give these out Easter Sunday. I'm hoping some of you may be interested in sponsoring this project financially. It looks like we would need about \$3,000 to make this happen. Anyone feel so moved to contribute in this way?

• Have a blessed and refreshing 40 days with Jesus and with fellow companions on the journey this new Lenten Season.

A Note from Parish Nurse, Brigitte Glinski

February is American Heart Month, blood pressure control is important to keep your heart healthy. If your blood pressure is high, it's up to you to manage and control it. Make sure that you engage your health care team, not just your cardiologist or primary care physician, talk to your pharmacist, nurses, and other specialist involved in your care about how to control your blood pressure. Discuss what you are already doing: exercise, diet changes, or taking prescribed medications. Make sure you are honest and realistic with yourself and your health care team about what changes you are ready to make, and those you are not quite ready for. Once you meet one goal, choose another and tackle that one.



If you are prescribed medications, make sure to follow the prescription instructions faithfully. Make a schedule that is easy to follow, and use a pillbox for every pill, or use a smart-phone "app" to remind you when you are due to take a pill.

Develop a plan to regularly check your blood pressure, either at home, or at the pharmacy. Blood pressure screening is offered the second weekend of the month after Mass at St. James. Make sure to track your results in a pocket log or diary.

Make healthy choices, exercise, choose fresh fruits, vegetables and whole grains over processed foods. Make sure to check labels for sodium, decreasing your sodium intake can help to lower your blood pressure. If you smoke, quit.

COMMUNITY GARDENS

It has been said that the longest journey begins with a single step. A gardener might rephrase that and say that 40 tomatoes begin with a single seed.

With that in mind, in order to get those 40 plus tomatoes (and other veggies) harvested before fall, we have to start planting our seeds soon. But since this is Wisconsin, we won't be planting them outdoors. Instead, some of the members of the garden group will be starting various seeds indoors to give them a strong start on the season. We can always use a few more volunteers who are willing to start some seeds. If you might be interested, here are the details:

You will be provided with seeds, trays, soil medium for the trays and a heating mat to put under the seeds. (It keeps the 'baby' plants cozy.) Your job is to put the soil medium in the trays, plant the seeds, water them as needed, provide 6-8 hours of (indoor) sunshine a day and plug in the heating mat.

The seeds need about 60 to 75 days before they are mature enough to be planted outside on their own which means we don't have a lot of time. We hope to start those seeds by March 1st so they are ready for the plant sale and for transplanting into one of the parish gardens.

If you are interested in starting some of those seeds on their journey, contact Paul Schneider using the information at the end of this article. Compensation includes watching those little seeds turn into leafy green plants as well as the opportunity to keep a few of those plants for your own containers or garden.

If tending little seeds is not your thing, you can still support the gardens by joining us at the **annual plant sale coming up on the weekend of May 21/22.** The seeds will be grown up by then, ready for their new homes.
