THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

Matthew 25 Year of Mercy

Pope Francis wants "Twenty-four Hours for the Lord," around-the-clock availability of the sacrament of reconciliation, implemented worldwide this Friday and Saturday. Celebrated with his oft-recommended "tenderness," the sacrament is "a source of true interior peace," says Francis, enabling people "to touch the grandeur of God's mercy with their own hands" (*Misericordiae Vultus*, 17).

In Luke's Gospel, Jesus warns us against judging others. Focus instead, Jesus says, on deepening—or restoring—our own relationship with God, for during this Lenten springtime that Master Gardener can use even life's manure (the parable's "fertilizer") to coax fresh fruit from a tree that seems hopelessly barren—us!

Parishes preparing catechumens may choose John's Gospel, which likewise cautions against judging. Imagine what the Samaritan woman's lifelong neighbors thought of her multiple relationships. But by discovering Jesus, then sharing her good news—and Jesus—with those very neighbors, she whom they had probably judged quite sinful became instead their evangelist and "missionary of mercy."

• "What did I ever do to deserve this?" My guess would be that many of us have said this at some point in our lives. When some difficulty or pain come our way it seems to be second nature to think that 'God is punishing me' for something.' Take a look at the Gospel for this Third Weekend of Lent. Jesus contradicts this instinct of ours. He asks, "Do you think the people who had a tower fall on them were any worse sinners than the others in Galilee who escaped this fate? No!" Jesus makes known to us an all-merciful Father who never wants anything bad to happen to His daughters and sons.



• We know inevitably in this world, bad things and tragedies do come our way. Sometimes we are responsible for this if the pain is the result of a poor decision we make. But, we can't always trace it back to our misuse of freedom. Jesus assures us that he is with us, helping us to bear our burdens.

• The prayer, "Footprints in the Sand" conveys this very dramatically. My Grandma Moran gave me this prayer many years ago, engraved on a music box that plays Amazing Grace. How about humming the tune to yourself, and pray this prayer to further absorb the healing presence of Christ during this special Year of Mercy.

• *One night a man had a dream. He dreamed he was walking along the beach with the Lord. Across the sky flashed scenes from his life. For each scene he noticed two sets of footprints in the sand. One belonging to him and the other one belonging to the Lord. When the last scene of his life flashed before him, he looked back at the footprints in the sand. He noticed that many times along the path of his life there was only one set of footprints. He also noticed that it happened at the very lowest and saddest times of his life. This really bothered him and he questioned the Lord about it. Lord you said that once I decided to follow you, you'd walk with me all the way. But I have noticed that during the most troublesome times in my life there is only one set of footprints. I don't understand why when I needed you most you would leave me. The Lord replied, my precious, precious child. I love you and I would never leave you. During your times of trial and suffering when you see only one set of footprints, it was then that I carried you.*

Easter Blessing of Food

The Easter blessing of food owes its origin to the fact that particular foods, namely, fresh meat and milk products, including eggs, were forbidden in the Middle Ages during the Lenten fast and abstinence. When the feast of Easter brought the rigorous fast to an end, and these foods were again allowed at table, the people showed their gratitude and joy by first taking the food to church for a blessing. Moreover, they hoped that the Church's blessing on such edibles would prove a remedy for whatever harmful effects the body might have suffered from a long period of self-denial. Today the Easter blessing of food is still celebrated in the Catholic Church.

The blessing also recognizes that food itself has an important place in the Resurrection story. Proving that He was truly risen, in Luke's Gospel, Jesus asked for something to eat. He also ate with the disciples on other occasions; and in Acts, St. Peter testified that they had eaten with the risen Lord.

Although many ethnic groups celebrate the blessing, each culture has made its own adaptations regarding the foods, prayers and ways to decorate the baskets.

Each food has a symbolic meaning. The meat is a sign of abundance and the symbol of the end of Lenten penance. The hard-boiled eggs symbolize the tomb and new life. Butter and cake in the shape of the lamb remind us that Jesus is the Lamb of God, sacrificed for humanity's sins. Salt may also be included because it is necessary to sustain life and a reminder to be the "salt of the earth". Candles in the basket acknowledge that Christ is the light of the world.

On Holy Saturday, March 26th, at 11:00 A.M., Deacon Mike will be blessing Easter baskets in the Chapel. (The original church.) If you wish, please join us in this celebration and start your own family tradition.

A Note from Parish Nurse, Brigitte Glinski

Some life events, the loss of a loved one, a serious injury or illness, or an emotional trauma, such as divorce, take a lot longer than expected to get over. You don't heal as you had wanted or expected, or you get stuck in a stage of grief, and continue to feel as if the loss had just happened. The good news is that there are some steps you can take to help move the process along.

- **Take a look at your fears.** What are the obstacles that are getting in your way of healing? If the crisis you are in is a long-term illness, or chronic condition, you may fear the loss of control, self-image, and independence. Are you afraid of abandonment by family and friends, or of isolation because of your limitations? Remember you are still you; you still have value and worth as a unique person, regardless of what you are able to do. Make sure to address all your fears, some you will need to live with, so you have to find a way to get them under control. Others can be alleviated just by talking through them with someone you trust.
- **Adjust your expectations.** Are you trying to be positive about your situation, or are you focusing on what you have lost? You can learn to be more realistic about goals in life, you should try to take this situation as a chance to change the way you see life. You may need to adjust to doing a little less, taking time for rest and reflection, and setting new priorities. This will allow you to discover what it is that is most treasured in your daily life.
- **Move from anger to acceptance.** Anger is a normal feeling at the time of a loss. The problem is when you hold onto anger; this can cause distress and anxiety, discouragement, and depression. Try to figure out what is causing your anger; is it with yourself, with God? Try work the anger off with physical exercise if possible, or talk with a trusted friend or family member. Remove the anger from your heart to make room for the peace and acceptance of healing to enter.
- **Seek spiritual healing.** Reflect on where God is during this difficult situation. It helps to remember that God is with you in this difficult time. Spend some time in quiet prayer and meditation to help remind you of His presence in your life.
- **Learn the value of patient waiting.** Healing means being able to live your life to the fullest capacity possible for you, given your current situation. You may feel some resentment and anger when accepting your situation, but you need to continue to acknowledge your feelings, express them, and then move on.

Although your life may not be the same after a loss or illness, it can be very good in a new way. Seek healing and it will be found.

Virtually every hobby or interest has its own vocabulary. Those words almost become a secret code used by the members of the group. If you are a serious cook you know about braising and basting. Football fans can talk intelligently about laterals and shotgun formations.

Gardeners are no different. We know the difference between annuals (plants which live only one year) and perennials (plants which live several years). We know that heirloom seeds have been saved and handed down from generation to generation and we understand that someone who is talking about tomato cultivars is talking about tomato plant varieties. We appreciate the fact that the chemical make up of the soil (acidic or alkaline) can affect how well our plants grow.

But that doesn't mean we are garden geeks who fill our conversations with obscure garden facts. Mostly we are a group of people who enjoy using our various talents to grow food for the benefit of others. As a group we learn from each other...how deeply to plant the seeds, when to prune and how to fertilize. If you are considering joining us, don't be intimidated, thinking that perhaps you don't know enough. Even the most knowledgeable among us admits to learning something new when we get together.

We are still looking for a few volunteers willing to nurture some seedlings indoors (supplies provided); consider joining us.

And keep in mind that you can practice growing plants in the comfort of your own patio containers or in a garden plot in your yard. We will have plants available at our **annual plant sale coming up near the end of May.** (The weekend of **May 21/22** to be exact.) Feel free to ask us about our tomato cultivars. :-)
