



• Though the Christmas Season officially ended last week with the celebration of the Baptism of the Lord, we observe one more manifestation of the presence of God, breaking into our human condition, the Wedding Feast at Cana. Once again we catch a glimpse of the humanness of Jesus. He seems reluctant to spring into action when Mother says to him, "They have no more wine." If I had responded to my mother the way Jesus did, I would have been in the doghouse for quite some time! "Woman, how does this concern of yours involve me?" Mary rises above what sounds like a curt remark. "Do whatever he tells you." What a woman of faith, and patience, prodding her Son to move forward with His mission.



• Beyond a peek at a mother-son relationship, the turning of water into wine is a manifestation of the in-breaking of the reign on God in this world. Not only is there great abundance, the quality of the wine is better than any previously served. If Frank Sinatra were performing at the wedding reception, he might have broken into his song, "The Best is Yet to Come!"

• In light of this special year of mercy, the great quantity and quality of the wine reminds us of God's overflowing compassion, love, and mercy.

• As we move further into the year 2016, we pray that all the world may experience the mercy of God, especially those barely eking out a living or trying to survive in violent environments. May God's Kingdom come on earth as it is in Heaven. May our lives be the choicest of wines, bringing refreshment and joy to others.



Organic Food – The Problem with Pesticides

"The entire material universe speaks of God's love, his boundless affection for us. Soil, water, mountains: everything is, as it were, a caress of God" [LS, 84].



USDA tests found a total 165 different pesticides on thousands of fruit and vegetables samples.

So what is the problem with pesticides on our food? They've been shown to adversely affect the nervous system, increase the risk of cancer, and are toxic to honey bees and other beneficial insects that pollinate our food. Check the display in the gathering space to find out what produce has been tested to have the most and least pesticide residue.

Matthew 25 Year of Mercy for Lent Holy Doors of Mercy

Jesus said "Truly, I am the door; if any one enters by me, he will be saved, and will go in and out and find pasture. I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly." John 10: 7-10



Many are the doors through which we pass in our lifetime. At birth, we emerged through a gateway to life and later, we entered the doorway to a new life at our baptism. We have stood on thresholds and looked forward, sometimes eagerly, sometimes with hesitation, at opportunities that lay before us. We all know that eventually we will pass through one final door, the gateway from this life to eternal life.

During the Year of Mercy, Pope Francis invites us to contemplate the notion of a Holy Door, "a *Door of Mercy* through which anyone who enters will experience the love of God who consoles, pardons, and instills hope."

We are sent forth to cross the thresholds of sacred doors beyond our church – doors where we encounter the face of God in the poor and marginalized, physically or spiritually. We are called to be witnesses to God's enduring love and limitless mercy through our own engagement with those who have not felt that love nor known that mercy from others.

This year during Lent, we will combine our Matthew 25 project with the Year of Mercy where "we will find the strength to embrace God's mercy and dedicate ourselves to being merciful with others as the Father has been with us."

Matthew 25 Year of Mercy begins on Ash Wednesday, Feb 10.

Messages from our PA



With the **Week of Prayer for Christian Unity** approaching on January 18-25th, I received some info from the Archdiocese about the ongoing dialogue between the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), of which Christ Our Savior Lutheran Church, from our Cooperating Churches of Sussex, is a member.

Drawing on 50 years of national and international dialogue, the USCCB and the ELCA published a unique ecumenical document last October 30th, titled ***Declaration on the Way: Church, Ministry and Eucharist***, that marks a pathway toward greater unity between Catholics and Lutherans.

At it's heart are **32 "Statements of Agreement" where Lutherans and Catholics already have points of convergence** on topics about church, ministry and Eucharist. The document also indicates differences that remain. The conclusion of the declaration invites the Vatican and the Lutheran World Federation to create a process and timetable for addressing the remaining issues. It also suggests that the expansion of opportunities for Lutherans and the Catholics to receive Holy Communion together would be a sign of the agreements already reached.

The declaration also urges Catholics and Lutherans at local levels to connect in **"a deeper commitment to Christ and greater engagement and collaboration with one another..."**
