It is time for us to donate food for the St. Ben's Meal Program this **Wednesday, June 17th**.

St James' role in this ministry is to supplement a meatloaf & mashed potatoes & gravy dinner (supplied by Good Shepherd & St Mary's). We need parishioners to bring salads, fruits & vegetables of any kind & meat or seafood casseroles/pastas. Desserts are okay but they need to be fresh. There is sufficient bread & rolls already provided. Our efforts either supplement the meatloaf dinner or provide an alternative for the homeless & poor.

You do not have to sign up to be a part of this ministry, all we ask is that your donations be at St. James in the upstairs kitchen (counters or refrigerators) before 4:00 pm as **our last driver leaves promptly at 4:00**. We Need your Help to Help Us Grow!!

For the past 5 years, St. James Parish has offered electronic funds transfer (EFT) for those parishioners who wanted to have their monthly contributions withdrawn from their checking or savings accounts . Currently, we have 90 families who use this option every month which provides \$9,337.00 income automatically every month! The bank charges are 25 cents per transaction or \$22.00 a month. (There will be no changes for those of you already using this option.) The Finance Council has been exploring and discussing additional “**Online Giving**” options available to parishioners.

A “**NEW**” option being considered is the use of monthly payments through the 4 Major Credit Card companies; i.e. VISA, MasterCard, American Express and Discover. Again this is a convenient way to ensure your monthly contributions will be received without interruption. However, there are some monthly costs involved for the parish. There is a standard **\$40.00 monthly fee and a \$0.45 + 2.75% charge per transaction fee**. This is where we need your help. Since there is a charge to provide this service, we are wondering if our parishioners are interested in this option.

### **FIELDS OF HOPE & DREAMS And HOLY GROUND GARDEN**

Confused with your garden this spring? You're not alone. Many parishioners are asking each other and our volunteers: "how's your garden doing?" We had a couple days of warm temperatures around our plant sale, then temperatures dropped and we had rain. The soil has not warmed sufficiently for some of the seeds that were planted in the ground to complete their germination process. At St. James' community gardens we have had spotty germination patterns too. So we've been replanting empty spaces.

Now gardeners are wondering: "Do I continue to plant cooler weather crops because of the cooler spring temperatures or will it start to turn hot where these crops will stall out and not produce? Or do I plant tomato and peppers which is what's been done in the past even though the air and soil temperatures haven't warmed enough?" St. James' Holy Ground garden, where the tomato and peppers are planted have shown some stress with the cooler temperatures and the wind whipping the plants around hasn't helped. Volunteers are comparing notes from their own home gardens to gain some insights into what to plan for.

When you have to look 45 to 60 days out for seed germination or plant maturing times, everyone needs as much help as they can get. Weather forecasters are predicting that 2015 could be the new hottest year on record. El Nino might push global temperatures towards unprecedented warmth say NOAA – National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration. So, accordingly we should all stick to our planting plans to plant the hot weather crops and plan to water - a lot. That is, if you believe the weather forecasters.

#### **Feast of the Sacred Heart**
