From The Servant's Quarters

◆ *God did not make death, nor does he rejoice in the destruction of the living.* So begins our selection today from the Book of Wisdom, setting the stage for the healing stories in today's gospel. We can never hear this conviction often enough. Our tendency many times is to blame God for human tragedy. "Why is God doing this to me?" "Why doesn't God prevent this \_\_\_\_\_ (fill in the blank!) from happening?" What really troubles me is calling natural disasters 'an act of God!'

◆ As we wrestle with good and evil, life and death, Jesus and the Sacred Scriptures go to great length to assure us that our God is the God of life; the God of the living. We have to look somewhere else to try to discover where suffering, tragedy, and death-dealing events come from.

◆ If I might paraphrase the opening verse from Wisdom today, *God does not make "global warming!"* Pope Francis has just issued his most recent teaching, reminding us that global warming is by and large the result of human abuse of the environment. By now you have probably heard various "takes" on this encyclical from news commentators. The best approach would be to actually read his writing for yourself.



◆ You can access *Laudato Si: On Care For Our Common Home*, at the website [www.usccb.org](http://www.usccb.org) (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops).

◆ What I find inspiring are the opening words of his letter, "Laudato Si." These are the first words of the Canticle of Brother Sun, written by St. Francis of Assisi. Pope Francis is really attuned to his papal patron saint. Francis of Assisi has such a reverence for the created world that he called the various natural elements his "brother" and "sister."

This would be a good time and place to reprint the Canticle of Br. Sun.

Most high, all powerful, all good Lord!  
All praise is Yours, all glory, all honor, and all blessing.

To You, alone, Most High, do they belong.  
No mortal lips are worthy to pronounce Your name.

Be praised, my Lord, through all Your creatures,  
especially through my lord Brother Sun,  
who brings the day; and You give light through him.  
And he is beautiful and radiant in all his splendor!  
Of You, Most High, he bears the likeness.

Be praised, my Lord, through Sister Moon and the stars;  
in the heavens You have made them bright, precious and beautiful.

Be praised, my Lord, through Brothers Wind and Air,  
and clouds and storms, and all the weather,  
through which You give Your creatures sustenance.

Be praised, my Lord, through Sister Water;  
she is very useful, and humble, and precious, and pure.

Be praised, my Lord, through Brother Fire,  
through whom You brighten the night.  
He is beautiful and cheerful, and powerful and strong.

Be praised, my Lord, through our sister Mother Earth,  
who feeds us and rules us,  
and produces various fruits with colored flowers and herbs.

Be praised, my Lord, through those who forgive for love of You;  
through those who endure sickness and trial.

Happy those who endure in peace,  
or by You, Most High, they will be crowned.

Be praised, my Lord, through our sister Bodily Death,  
from whose embrace no living person can escape.  
Woe to those who die in mortal sin!  
Happy those she finds doing Your most holy will.  
The second death can do no harm to them.

Praise and bless my Lord, and give thanks,  
and serve Him with great humility.



### A Note from the Parish Nurse, Pam Dennis:

According to the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), high blood pressure caused or contributed to nearly 1,000 deaths a day in 2008. Lowering your blood pressure can help lower your risk for stroke and heart attack. Heart disease is one of the biggest silent killers on a global scale.



Having hypertension (or high blood pressure) means that the pressure to which your arteries pump blood from your heart to the rest of your organs and throughout your body is too great. This abnormal blood pressure is what puts stress on the heart and causes premature death.

High blood pressure is an issue if the systolic blood pressure (when your heart pumps) is over 140 and the diastolic blood pressure (when your heart relaxes) is over 90. One of the most dangerous aspects of hypertension is that you may not know that you have it. In fact, nearly one-third of people who have high blood pressure don't know it. The only way to know if your blood pressure is high is through regular checkups. This is especially important if you have a close relative who has high blood pressure.

If your blood pressure is extremely high, there may be certain symptoms to look out for, including: severe headache, fatigue or confusion, vision problems, chest pain, difficulty breathing, irregular heart beat, blood in urine and pounding in your chest, neck or ears.

One of the biggest culprits that causes hypertension is your salt intake. Many processed foods contain a high amount of sodium or salt. The foods to stay away from that are high in sodium are your canned soups and vegetables as well as most lunch meats. According to the American Heart Association, excessive levels of salt (or sodium intake of more than 1,500 milligrams per day) can lead to high blood pressure, diabetes, and cardiovascular diseases—regardless of age, current health condition, and family history. On average, Americans consume more than 3,400 mg of sodium per day (the amount contained in about 1 1/2 teaspoons of salt). As you can see, just looking at your daily salt intake and limiting it can help lower your blood pressure.

I also want to encourage all of you to take advantage of our monthly blood pressure screenings we hold after all three Masses here at St. James. We will be taking the months of July and August off but will resume the screenings the second weekend in September. It is a great preventative health care opportunity for all of our parishioners. If you should like your blood pressure taken during the summer months you are more than welcome to come to my office for a blood pressure check. I just ask that you call first so that I am in the office when you come.



## FIELDS OF HOPE & DREAMS And HOLY GROUND GARDEN

Garden volunteers hear many comments from parish members, which we appreciate. It demonstrates interest and concern of our garden initiatives and shows the parish at large is involved, even if they don't directly work in the gardens. We appreciate your thoughts, ideas, and comments. Keep them coming!



Here are some great ideas from Anne Hutchinson, one of our volunteers. *"When the rain stops, I'll have a lot of perennials to thin (and I'm sure other gardeners have the same on-going job.) I've been wondering if perhaps St. James might entertain the idea of a "holding plot." A place that we could transplant plants that need to be divided, to winter over and be sold the following year at the St. James plant sale. Or perhaps a place at St. James, where plants could be temporarily planted until someone who is building might want to make a donation and use them. Or perhaps, donating them for a confirmation or youth group project to be used for working with landscaping for organizations like Habitat for Humanity. What do you think? It's a shame to dispose of them and there are too many to give to neighbors."* So, St. James community - what do you think of Anne's suggestions? Sounds like we'll need another bed or holding plot. Let one of our garden volunteers know what you think when you see them at mass and if you have ideas, we'd love to hear about them.

All three gardens (i.e. Field of Dreams, Field of Hope and Holy Ground garden) are fully planted and starting to be harvested. The Cooperating Churches of Sussex's (CCOS) food pantry's clients are glad to once again receive fresh, home grown, chemically free vegetables that have been picked on Saturday mornings. Volunteers pick, wash, dry, bag in Ziploc bags, label, and document what we harvest each Saturday. We then put the vegetables in boxes and deliver it to the CCOCS food pantry before 10:30 a.m. when the pantry opens. Needless to say, our volunteers hustle to make the delivery time. And as the gardens start to produce more, we'll include a midweek (i.e. Wednesday) harvest and donation following the same routine. As the produce really ramps up, we like to see more volunteers step up.

Our volunteers normally work on Saturdays from 8:00 to 11:00 a.m. including cleanup. We have various jobs that include the kitchen work preparing the vegetables, after the harvesting and prior to our delivery to the food pantry. There is no commitment to each and every Saturday, and there is no commitment to stay the whole time. Volunteers come and go as their, or their children's schedules allow. And it's a great way to learn more about gardening from others, some Master Gardeners, others just with a lot of experience. We all share and learn from each other by comparing notes of what's going on in our own home gardens, along with sharing tips and tricks that save time and promote gardening.


