

That is a very big "Thank-you" for helping to make this year's plant sale our most successful ever. It was successful in terms of donated plants; it was successful in terms of community building; and it was very successful in terms of monetary donations...we collected more than \$1,900!

Now we were only joking when we told people that the plants were available for a minimum donation of \$100, but an extremely generous parishioner donated just that... she gave us a one hundred dollar bill and left with one tomato plant. We are very appreciative, and understand that not everyone can be that generous, but it is certainly inspirational.

That pretty much completes stage one--growing the seedlings. Stage two is underway. Just about all of our transplants have been put in the ground so they can spread their roots and become the plants they were meant to be. Some of them were planted during a break between some heavy rainstorms, but they are planted. Now we water them and nurture them and soon we will be harvesting food for the pantry.

Just to repeat, on behalf of the plants, the gardeners and the people we will help feed this summer...THANK-YOU.

I am grateful that Henry gave me this opportunity to see inside the lives of those who come to believe in Christ in the most challenging environment of countries that are being increasingly dominated by Islamic fundamentalism and Sharia law. The book is published by Revell and co-authored by Brother Andrew & Al Janssen. A note from Parish Nurse, Brigitte Glinski

Strawberries, blueberries, and raspberries are among the most delicious foods out there. And luckily these delicious foods are also among the healthiest. Although berries do vary in terms of nutrition, they all generally contain healthy levels of fiber, vitamins and minerals, and other bioactive compounds. A high fiber diet can help to improve cholesterol levels and lower blood sugar levels, and because of their low glycemic load, they do not bump up your blood sugar too high after eating them. Berries have vitamins such as vitamin A, several B vitamins, and vitamins C and K. They also contain potassium, magnesium, calcium and iron. The bioactive compounds found in berries have been shown to have anti-cancer and anti-inflammatory effects, as well as protect nerve cells and the brain, help fight infection and boost the immune system.

So sit down and enjoy a large bowl of strawberries, raspberries, or blueberries. There isn't one best berry, they are all equally nutritious. If you are feeling adventurous, and want to do something good for your health, try one of the many berry varieties out there: acai berries, boysenberries, cloudberrries, cranberries, elderberries, gooseberries, lingonberries, and wolf-berries, also known as goji berries.
