# IN MEMORY *of* ME

*From The Servant's Quarters*

- Today we celebrate what many of us may remember from a bygone era, "Corpus Christi!" Translated from the Latin, this means The Body of Christ. In the renewal of our Church life, the separate celebration that focused on The Blood of Christ has now been connected with this solemnity.
- A few weeks ago we completed the Easter Season with the celebration of Pentecost - the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. Last week we delved the life of Our God - Son, and Holy Spirit.
- Now we allow the celebration of the Body and Blood of Christ to launch us into late spring and early summertime. (I finally took the snow brush out of my car!)
- During the summer months there are a number of Scriptures that help us to appreciate more how the Lord is our nourishment, our life-giving bread, that has come down from heaven. How ingenious for the Lord to use the experience of a meal to continue to reassure us that He is with us. He sustains us. He empowers us to be life-giving nourishment for others. "We become what we eat."
- Every so often a visitor will approach me in church and ask, "Where is the Blessed Sacrament?" I direct them to the beautiful Reservation Chapel with the Sanctuary Lamp, adjacent to the Reconciliation Chapel. What a fitting location for private prayer, for preserving the Eucharist to take to the sick, and to connect with etched story of the Prodigal Son - or the All Loving Father!
- In terms of our reverence for the Eucharist I would hope that whenever we walk past the Reservation Chapel, we pause to acknowledge the Lord's presence. For those still spry enough to get down on one knee - genuflection is appropriate. For the rest of us a slight bow expresses our faith.
- Because the Tabernacle is not "front and center" in the church, it is fitting to also bow to the Crucifix and the Altar before entering our pew for worship.
- As we gather around the Table of The Lord, we celebrate the presence of the Lord among us in the Scriptures and in the Breaking of the Bread. We are the family of God. We are a community of faith. We hope to also experience the presence of the Lord in one another as well. That's why it's so important that we do not sit alone in a corner of the church. We wouldn't think of eating Thanksgiving Dinner, alone, on a TV tray, separate from the rest of the family.



- That's the thinking behind closing off the far side sections of church for the summer. We want to experience as much "togetherness" as possible during the more "lean times" of summer church attendance. I hope you don't mind!
- (Maxwell asked me to include more letters from Dogs to God!)
- "Dear God: Why are there cars named after the jaguar, the cougar, the mustang, the colt, the stingray, and the rabbit, but not ONE named for a dog? How often do you see a cougar riding around? WE love a nice car ride!"
- "Dear God: Are there mailmen in heaven? If there are, will I have to apologize?"

There will be a bereavement companion ministry meeting in the **Great room on June 11th, Thursday, at 10:30 am** for anyone interested in learning more about this beautiful ministry. The goals of the Bereavement Companion program at St. James are to help one another to grieve, to be with one another in sorrow and to love one another as Christ loves us.

The program is based on a one-to-one mutually agreed upon relationship between the bereaved and a "grief Companion". The grief companion provides relevant reading material provided by St. James health ministry as well as information on our two support groups: the companions on the journey breakfasts and the bereavement fish fry. Contacts with the bereaved are via letter/cards, telephone calls or in person on a regular basis. The relationship with this person or family is throughout the first year helping them on their journey of grieving their loss. If so desired, the bereaved may ask for more personal support from our parish nurse, Pastoral Associate or our Priest, Father Mike.

We currently have 6 parishioners as well as myself who help with this ministry. Each minister takes anywhere from 1 – 3 people or families at a time. We are always in need of a few more parishioners to help out.
