Please stop by and pick out your favorite vegetables or perennial plants or flowers from our assorted offerings and from other parish members who have donated plants. No prices are posted - free will donation accepted to help fund our community gardens - so please be generous.

In previous years, we have had parish members who have wanted the same variety of tomato plant that they purchased in previous years. Purchase them and then try something new in addition to stretch your tastes if you have the room. We're offering over 500 tomatoes (i.e. red, yellow, purple, and green) cherry; beefsteaks; romas; paste; and others and loads of pepper plants, herbs and flowers. If you are uncertain of what to pick - ask one of our volunteers. They may be able to recommend something. Also there are educational boards up to help you pick your plants.

If you've left church and are sitting at home reading this bulletin, please come back to the plant sale. We've had parish members who have had the best luck with our plants, because our volunteers have raised and nurtured these plants in their homes with tender loving care and concern, knowing where (i.e. their fellow parishioner) these plants end up. Our volunteers love to hear the stories of last year's successes and eating enjoyment. It's what encourages our volunteers each year. It also makes all their hard work suddenly feel worthwhile and fulfilling as we encourage people to eat more fresh home grown fruits and vegetables - for better health.



At Good Shepherd
