The Christmas Giving Tree, located in the Gathering Area beginning this weekend, is filled with gift tags with donation requests from the following organizations. Select a gift tag of your choosing and the organization's desired donation will be listed on the tag. **All donations are to be returned to St. James and placed under the Giving Tree no later than December 7th.** Your donations mean so much to the recipients and organizations, so please consider supporting the Christmas Giving Tree. Here are the organization highlights:

Sussex Outreach Services: The Sussex Outreach Services organization holds an annual Christmas Gift program, where area parents of children in need are allowed to select one gift of their choice. Your donation of an unwrapped toy, game, or clothing item will ensure that all children connected with the SOS program will be able to receive a gift.

St. Vincent de Paul Society of St. James: This St James Parish based group responds to parish needs in many ways, but most frequently in emergency situations that include power shut offs or imminent evictions. Please donate Cash (checks payable to St. Vincent de Paul Society), gift cards to Pick 'n Save or Gas Station gift cards, which are especially needed this year. These donations will assist individuals or families in our parish area who have come upon extremely difficult times.

Interfaith: This faith-based Waukesha County non-profit organization runs a Holiday Gift Program which provides a gift envelope of items to low-income homebound seniors and adults with disabilities. PEW VIEW

As I was reflecting on this Sunday’s Scriptures and preparing to write this column a “People you may know” message came up on my Facebook page. One of the pictures was that of an old flame from 45 years ago! When I saw what appeared to be a current picture of this person verse 30 from Chapter 31 of today’s first reading from the Book of Proverbs struck me: “Charm is deceptive and beauty fleeting.” Since my wife knows this old flame I showed her the picture and immediately declared truthfully, “I made the better choice.” My wife did not hesitate in reminding me, “I know you did!”

Proverbs begins, “When one finds a worthy wife...” As I near the end of my four month temporary tenure as parish director this reading affords an opportunity to reflect on the other important person involved in my ministry -- my wife, Betty. Many families experience the quick “call to duty” required of a parent and the adjustments that have to be made in family life. However, my brief foray back into parish directing was made much easier because Betty was highly supportive and understanding of this ministry. She possesses the qualities of the worthy wife described in Proverbs 31. Her value is far beyond pearls. She is a jewel and I am indeed blessed (I did make the right choice) and because of that I have been able to serve St. James in this extended ministry.

At the parish town hall meetings I described the position of a parish director as being similar to that of a “lay pastor.” During these past months a few people suggested that I should have been a priest. In other words perhaps they see that a married priest could be a possibility. We already have married clergy in our parish. Both Deacon Mike Rooney and Deacon Bob Wodushek are ordained and are married. I’m sure that both of these men would affirm the “value beyond pearls” of their wives. Betty Rooney and Kathy Wodushek are women who exemplify the characteristics of the “worthy wife” found in Proverbs 31.

As I stated at the parish town hall meetings, by 2020 there will be 126 diocesan priests in Parish Ministry in the Milwaukee Archdiocese and it is estimated that of these 26 will be over the age of 68. Thus there will only be about 100 “working age” priests in the Milwaukee Archdiocese for approximately 200 parishes. Celibacy is certainly a charism and can be valuable to priesthood but perhaps now is the time to reconsider this prerequisite to priestly ordination. Marriage is also a charism and does not appear to be incompatible with successful ministry.

Thanks not only to the worthy wives but also worthy husbands who support their spouses in our formal ministries right here at St. James. To paraphrase the conclusion of Proverbs, “Give them a reward for their labors and let their works praise them at the city gates.”
