Next week the parish “will return to its regular programming” as Fr. Mike resumes his weekly “Servant’s Quarters” column in this space. On this weekend before Thanksgiving, on behalf of the entire parish I would like to express deep appreciation especially to the ordained ministers who provided sacramental ministries during the past four months.

Special thanks to Fr. Jerry Hudziak who “stepped it up a notch or two.” Fr. Jerry has been with us for eight years as a helpout priest. He is retired, a “senior priest” of the Archdiocese. As such, he is not assigned to a parish by the Archbishop the way a pastor is. In a comparable sense, Fr. Jerry “freelances” as he picks and chooses where to help out and when he wants to help out. That’s the freedom afforded by being retired! But Fr. Jerry is always willing to minister. Often when Fr. Jerry has only one Mass here at St. James he will also have another Mass at another parish or at the convent for the Schools Sisters of St. Francis. Jerry has come to be one of the family here at St. James but we should never take his availability to be with us for granted. He travels a fairly good distance to get here and we owe him a big debt. Deacon Mike Rooney also stepped up to provide additional help by taking some of the wedding services Fr. Mike had been scheduled to do. This meant additional time spent in meeting with the couples to do the planning and conducting the rehearsals. Deacon Mike also did some funeral services without a Mass and he has also done a few baptisms. Our mutual friend, Deacon Ralph Kornburger, was also called into service to do two weddings during this time. Deacons are not employed by the parish. They do not receive a salary for their ministry. They are generous servants. Thank you, Deacon Mike and Deacon Ralph.

Other Senior Priests have led us in prayer and inspired us with the word. Thank you to Fr. Peter Drenzek, Fr. Dennis Witz, and Fr. Dick Robinson who have all assisted us. St. James has every reason to be grateful and to give special thank this Thanksgiving. FIELDS OF HOPE & DREAMS AND HOLY GROUND GARDENS

Yes, you read that title correctly – Holy Ground garden. Our first community garden was named *Field of Dreams*. Our second garden was named *Field of Hope* and our newest (i.e. third) garden was named *Holy Ground* garden after a runoff vote of our volunteers. The *Holy Ground* garden name was actually submitted by Father Mike by email from Pennsylvania. It was added to the 13 other suggested names, which were voted on. The Holy Ground garden name tied with another name, so we had a runoff vote between the two and *Holy Ground* garden won. I hope Father Mike will be pleasantly surprised when he learns of the news.

The name is fitting because the new garden resides over what we refer to as the “holy hole”. This is where the Sacramentum or the sink which is used to wash out the communal cups and bowls drains into the soil. After Eucharist, we can't wash any small traces of sacramental wine or bread (the body of Christ) down a sewer drain. That would be like washing Jesus down the sewer. It has to return to the earth. So there is a special sink called the Sacramentum, with a special drain that drains down into the earth instead of a sewer. For the last couple of years, that drain froze during winter, so it had to be reconstructed, which led to all the shrubbery being cleared out for the construction. Once the shrubbery was cleared we had a slope of dirt that was quickly turning into a weed patch. The garden volunteers asked if we could turn it into a new (i.e. third) garden. The idea was put before Terri Weber our Business Administrator and the Building & Grounds Committee, where it was approved.

A retaining wall plan was submitted to level the space for the garden and a budget of building supplies was submitted and reviewed by Terri Weber and John Swanson, one of our Trustees. Construction materials were purchased and parish volunteers recruited. After several volunteer Saturdays, and some help during the week by Bill Spankowski, the new garden was close to completion. It then turned cold and volunteers decided to wait until spring to finish the construction, which includes attaching the top cap stone to the wall, finishing the stone steps and adding additional compost/soil to more completely level the garden's surface before spring planting. The *Holy Ground* garden has a south facing without any shade from nearby trees so hot crops will probably be planted in the new garden space such as tomatoes and peppers.

Our garden volunteer planning committee will meet after the holidays to start planning crop rotations from last year, compatible plantings and determine what else is needed for our sixth season of gardening. Thank you for your interest in our community garden initiative and for supporting the Cooperating Churches of Sussex's (CCOS) food pantry. Please keep your donations coming.
