- The Synod of Bishops discussing the needs of families in the world today has begun. Pope Francis barely caught his breath from his USA visit and now he is hosting representatives from around the world. You may recall that the initial meeting was a couple of years ago. In the meantime there's been an attempt for broad consultation from Catholics around the world to discover how best to minister to families.



- I joined a clergy group a few years ago, The Association of United States Catholic Priests. I learned recently that our group sent a delegation to Rome to have input for the Synod on the Family. *The survey results were hand delivered in April to the Vatican and also sent to all U.S. bishops on May 1. The priests expressed their support for the sacramental realities of marriage and family and suggested positive ways to demonstrate that "no one is beyond the mercy of God."*

- If you would like to keep tabs on the Synod news, there are a number of web sites you can visit: ncronline.org; NEWS.VA; chnonline.org; These are but a few possible sources to consult regarding the Synod during the month of October.

- We continue our focus of reverencing and respecting all life, as we welcome Deacon Steve and the Franciscan Peacemakers. The soap sale they are conducting helps to support their most important street ministry. In the coming weeks we are also encouraging book discussion groups, using the book, *In Our Backyard*. Many of us find it surprising that the trafficking of people for sex and for work happens all around us. It is especially prominent when there is a major sporting event or convention. The book increases our awareness of this high degree of human misery and suggests ways to help people become free of this exploitation. If you can't join a group, still read the book. It's also available electronically. I have it on my Kindle.

- The participation of our young people at the Sunday afternoon 5:30 Mass is truly inspiring. Our adult mentors are doing an excellent job in initiating the youth to take an active role in the liturgy. This is not just a "youth Mass." It is a parish Mass and all are welcome to participate. You are also wel-

come to request a particular Mass intention for these Masses. Just contact Diana in the parish office.

- The Scriptures this weekend call us to a life of Wisdom. The Lord empowers us to "give our all" in participating in God's sovereign influence breaking into the human condition.

**FIELDS OF HOPE & DREAMS  
And HOLY GROUND GARDEN**

Our community gardens are winding down for the season. There will only be a couple more weeks of clearing out decaying plant matter in raised beds to get the gardens ready for winter. Historically, our area experiences its first frost in mid-October, so we're busy getting as much produce out of the gardens before then.

There are some exception though. Our never ending kale will continue to produce well into fall, even after a frost. We've been harvesting kale all summer long, and it's provided a decorative front cover to our Holy Ground garden too. And some of our root crops will actually get sweeter with a frost due to being underground. The frost chemically changes the sugars in the crops.

Our garden volunteers deserve a well needed break. Many of them have been contributing since January when we start germinating seeds indoor for our annual spring plant sale. Our last remaining function of the season is our pot luck dinner. Garden volunteers come to celebrate the end of another (i.e. 6<sup>th</sup>) season gardening and of helping clients of the Cooperating Churches of Sussex's (CCOS) food pantry. We share how the season progressed and changed from previous seasons.

Many stories will be shared along with some great home grown vegetable casseroles and dishes to pass brought from home gardens and kitchens. ## Human Sex Trafficking - Be Informed

Although slavery is commonly thought to be a thing of the past, human trafficking still exists today throughout the United States and globally when traffickers use force, fraud, or coercion to control other people for the purpose of engaging in commercial sex or forcing them to provide labor services against their will. Traffickers use violence, threats, deception, debt bondage, and other manipulative tactics to trap victims in horrific situations every day in America. All trafficking victims share one essential experience – the loss of freedom.

This weekend will be the launch of a parish-wide book read: **In Our Backyard by Nita Belles**. This book invites the reader in to the lives of human trafficking victims, survivors and the traffickers themselves with true stories. These stories not only inform the reader, but also take them quickly through a well-documented crash course about human trafficking--better described as modern-day slavery--in the United States. A quick read which includes study questions for small groups, **In Our Backyard** could change your life and save lives around you. We will have opportunities for group discussion on November 15th between Masses and several more discussion opportunities during that week. The book will be available for sale today at the soap sales table and can be purchased online and in Kindle. Look for more information on this most important topic.
