Human Sex Trafficking - Be Informed

As Deacon Steve shared with us this past weekend, all 72 counties in the state of Wisconsin have experienced human sex trafficking. When looking hard enough, sex trafficking was found in Hartford, Hartland and Delafield. In short, it is *in our backyard!*

This past weekend we launched the parish-wide book read: **In Our Backyard by Nita Belles.** Over 60 parishioners purchased the book. It invites the reader in to the lives of human trafficking victims, survivors and the traffickers themselves with true stories. These stories not only inform the reader, but also take them quickly through a well-documented crash course about human trafficking--better described as modern-day slavery--in the United States. A quick read which includes study questions for small groups, **In Our Backyard** could change your life and save lives around you.

We will have opportunities for group discussion on **November 15** between Masses and several more discussion opportunities during that week. The book can be purchased on line and in Kindle. Look for more information on times for the discussion groups and calls to action for opportunities to take stand against this most horrific crisis.




Messages from our PA



- In previous columns, I have mentioned that I would be focusing upon the ministry of Evangelization. That focus is actually the #1 priority on my job description: "Facilitates, coordinates and implements the **Evangelization efforts** in the parish". In order to fulfill that mission, **I am looking for help.** If you would be interested in helping to **plan and strategize a comprehensive plan of Evangelization** for our parish, I invite you to join the **New Evangelization Team, or, the "NET"**. I envision this team taking responsibility for a wide spectrum of evangelization efforts, which will include promoting a better understanding of what evangelization truly is and how each of us can become evangelizers in our daily lives, increasing Mass attendance, encouraging non-active parishioners to become more engaged, welcoming new parishioners, implementing the archdiocesan synod priorities, and promoting our parish and its ministries in the community. Please join me in this venture and let's see how the Holy Spirit lights a fire in our hearts...
- More specific to the Evangelization efforts, I met with parishioner Bob Schuelke last week, and he shared with me some wonderful resources to **initiate a ministry for welcoming and actively engaging new members of the parish.** If that particular way of reaching out to new parishioners interests you, please let me know. We will need people to coordinate and guide this ministry, as well as people to do the actual phone calling, visiting, and serving as companions for new families/members.
- Still focusing upon the area of Evangelization, I know that a few years ago the parish gave out copies of Matthew Kelly's **The Four Signs of a DYNAMIC CATHOLIC.** The subtitle of the book is: "**How Engaging 1% Of Catholics Could Change The World**". At a staff meeting back in September, that premise was proposed by Director of Adult and Family Formation Sue Devine-Simon as a way for our parish to begin reversing the trend of lower Mass attendance. We have roughly 6,000 parishioners in our parish, with approximately 1300 currently attending the four weekend Masses. 1% of the remaining 4700 would be only 47 people! **I propose that we, as a parish, adopt the goal of increasing our average weekend Mass attendance up to 1400 by Christmas time. Invite someone you know who hasn't been attending Mass frequently to attend with you. Celebrate and give thanks for the dying and rising of Jesus together!** I believe we can attain that goal, and then we can set another goal after that...
