“Every Life is Worth Living” Reflections for Respect Life Month, October 2015

My dear friends in Christ:

One of the deepest desires of the human heart is to discover our identity. So often, as a society and as individuals, we identify ourselves by what we do. We base our worth on how productive we are at work or at home, and we determine our lives to be more or less good depending on the degree of independence or pleasure. We may even begin to believe that if our lives, or those of others, don't “measure up” to a certain standard, they are somehow less valuable or less worth living.

Respect Life Month is a fitting time to reflect on the truth of who we are. Our worth is based not on our skills or levels of productivity. Rather, we discover our worth when we discover our true identity found in the unchangeable, permanent fact that we are created in God's image and likeness and called to an eternal destiny with him.

Because of this, absolutely nothing can diminish our God-given dignity, and therefore, nothing can diminish the immeasurable worth of our lives. Others may fail to respect that dignity—may even try to undermine it—but in doing so, they only distance themselves from God's loving embrace. Human dignity is forever.

Whether it lasts for a brief moment or for a hundred years, each of our lives is a good and perfect gift. At every stage and in every circumstance, we are held in existence by God's love.

An elderly man whose health is quickly deteriorating; an unborn baby girl whose diagnosis indicates she may not live long; a little boy with Down syndrome; a mother facing terminal cancer—each may have great difficulties and need our assistance, but each of their lives is worth living.

When we encounter the suffering of another, let us reach out and embrace them in love, allowing God to work through us. This might mean slowing down and taking the time to listen. It might mean providing respite care or preparing meals for a family facing serious illness. It might mean simply being present and available. And of course, it always means prayer--bringing their needs before the Father and asking him to work in their lives.

Experiencing suffering—or watching another suffer—is one of the hardest human experiences. Fear of the unknown can lead us into the temptation of taking control in ways that offend our dignity and disregard the reverence due to each person.

But we are not alone. Christ experienced suffering more deeply than we can comprehend, and our own suffering can be meaningful when we unite it with his. Especially in the midst of trials, we are invited to hold fast to the hope of the Resurrection. God is with us every step of the way, giving us the grace we need.

In times of suffering, let us have the courage to accept help that others genuinely want to give, and give the help that others need. We were made to love and be loved; we are meant to depend on one another, serving each other in humility and walking together in times of suffering. Our relationships are meant to help us grow in perfect love.

Let us learn to let go of our own standards of perfection and instead learn more deeply how to live according to God's standards. He does not call us to perfect efficiency or material success; he calls us to self-sacrificial love. He invites us to embrace each life for as long as it is given—our own lives and the lives of those he has placed in our paths. Every life is worth living.

“Each year hundreds of millions of tons of waste are generated, much of it non-biodegradable, highly toxic and radioactive... The earth, our home, is beginning to look more and more like an immense pile of filth.” “These problems are closely linked to a throwaway culture which affects the excluded just as it quickly reduces things to rubbish.” [21]

“We have not yet managed to adopt a circular model of production capable of preserving resources for present and future generations, while limiting as much as possible the use of non-renewable resources, moderating their consumption, maximizing their efficient use, reusing and recycling them.” [22]

What is the concern with consumption and waste?

Americans make up 3% of the world’s population, yet we produce 35% of the world’s garbage and spend more on garbage bags than 90 other nations spend on everything.

Human Sex Trafficking - Be Informed

Residents of Walworth County were shocked in January of this year when a couple was arrested for allegedly holding a runaway 16-year-old Waukesha girl in a Janesville home and prostituting her to men they solicited on the internet. More than 200 victims have been identified across half of Wisconsin’s counties. This horrific tragedy is happening in our very own communities.

Deacon Steve Przedpelski, Executive Director of Franciscan Peacemakers, will be preaching at all the Masses on **October 10th and 11th**. He is in the front lines dealing with sex trafficking victims every day. This is an important awareness as a part of October being **Respect Life Month** respecting the dignity and rights of the human person of all ages..

Deacon Steve’s refection will launch a parish-wide book read: **In Our Backyard** by Nita Belles. This book invites the reader into the lives of human trafficking victims, survivors and the traffickers themselves with true stories. These stories not only inform the reader, but also take them quickly through a well-documented crash course about human trafficking--better described as modern-day slavery--in the United States. A quick read which includes study questions for small groups. **In Our Backyard** could change your life and save lives around you.

We will have opportunities for group discussion on **November 15 between Masses** and several more discussion opportunities during that week. **The book will be available for sale at the soap sales table on October 10-11** and can be purchased on line and in Kindle. Look for more information on this most important topic.

SOS FUTURE PLANNERS NEEDED

You may be aware that our SOS Food pantry and offices will be located in a new facility as part of the Sussex Village Civic Campus. At this point we anticipate moving in within about a year. If you have ever built a house you know there are things you find out you need after the fact; curtains, garbage cans, door stops, etc. If you have a good eye for those kinds of things SOS needs your input!

The plan is to first inventory what furniture and articles we currently have (tables, display racks, waste baskets, desks, etc). Second, based on what we have, try to determine what we might need in the new facility and third, determine what items, if any, that SOS currently uses might need to be replaced.



Other volunteers have had or are caring for aging ailing family members or friends. And yes, some volunteers have experienced a death or two of parents. They’ve found compassion, caring and sharing cohorts to help them through these difficult time.

The fall season is representative of the decaying (i.e. illnesses) and death we experience on life’s journey. In the gardens, we’re witnessing vines shriveling, leaves turning brown and falling to the ground. Volunteers optimistically see progress in this process of closing down of the gardens. We clean up our raised beds as we prepare for fall. The decaying plant matter will serve as enriching compost next spring for the soil.

The companionship and sharing of experiences by volunteers helps some recollect past memories and reflect on their many blessings. Volunteers help one another to move on through life’s more challenging or difficult times. These shared experiences help each of us enrich our lives as we help one another in times of change. Recently I've spoken with several people who have said they'd like to become more intentional about sharing our faith as Catholics.
