My dear friends in Christ:

Pope Francis has captivated the world with his humility, warmth and compassion for each person. Vivid account of his tenderness for “the least of these” – the elderly, the imprisoned, those with disfiguring disabilities, the unborn, and many more -- seize our attention. Why? At the heart of each of the interactions is a truth which resonates in our hearts, revealing to us something essential to understanding ourselves and our purpose.

We are loved.

We want to be part of a society that makes affirmation and protection of human rights its primary objective and its boast. Yet to women faced with an unexpected pregnancy, abortion is often presented as their only “choice.” Elderly members of our families fear they will become burdensome and seek physician assisted suicide. These tragedies go directly against respect for life, and they represent a direct threat to the entire culture of human rights.

What can be done to prevent this? We must draw closer to Jesus. We must ask the Lord for the grace to see ourselves and others as he sees us – as masterpieces of his creation. We must look at ourselves and others in light of this truth and treat all people with the reverence and respect which is due.

Are we moved by the suffering of those without shelter? Do we seek to alleviate the fear, confusion and panic that women facing unexpected pregnancies may be experiencing? Do our hearts ache for elderly patients in nursing homes who feel abandoned and unwanted, having no one to visit them?

Our mission is to show each person the love of Christ. We are continually given opportunities to do so in our interactions with the cashier at the grocery store, our spouse, children, friends and even the people we encounter in traffic. We may never know how much a simple gesture of compassion may affect someone’s life.

Let us take a moment to reflect on this year’s Respect Life theme, “Each of Us is a Masterpiece of God’s Creation.” Although we set aside October to particularly pray for respect for all human life, let us never cease this urgent work. Love and justice must motivate each of us to work for a transformation of our own hearts so that we can transform the world around us. This is the message of Pope Francis. May the Risen Lord put the Gospel of joy in our hearts so that we may bear witness to the greatest love story ever told.

**PEW VIEW
ATTENTION PARENTS, GRANDPARENTS,
TEACHERS!**

Don't miss the opportunity next weekend to help your child understand the Anointing of the Sick as we celebrate this sacrament at all Masses. Better than a textbook you have the opportunity to experience "the real thing." Here are a few "teaching" helps.

Ask your child to tell you a story of Jesus healing the sick (or tell them one yourself). Explain that the Church will do what Jesus did by helping people who are sick. (We may not experience a "cure" but we can ask for God's help for the sick.)

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is our special way of praying for sick people. (Have your child name the seven sacraments. Talk to your child about the sacraments they have received.)

Explain to your child that we pray for those who are sick in different ways. Perhaps your family prays for them at meal time or bedtime. We pray for them at Mass in the Prayers of the Faithful. Next weekend we will pray in a special way by laying hands on them as we pray. This action helps the person feel the power of the prayer. Demonstrate this to your children by laying hands on them as you pray a special prayer and invite them to do the same to you. At the Anointing of the Sick we will all pray silently.

The Anointing of the Sick uses oil. In the anointing some oil is rubbed on the forehead and on the hands of the sick person. Olive oil, just like the kind that is used on salads or for cooking, is used in this sacrament. But this is oil that has been blessed by the Archbishop during Holy Week.

Why do we use oil? We use oil products to make our skin feel better; to protect us from harmful rays of the sun; to soften our skin when it gets dry in winter; and so forth. The priest will anoint the forehead saying, "Through this holy anointing may the Lord in his love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit." We say, "Amen."

Then the priest anoints the upturned hands saying, "May the Lord who frees you from sin save you and raise you up." All respond, "Amen." The oil is not wiped off the skin but is rubbed into it as a sign of God's love soaking into us. Anoint your child's hand with olive oil as you say a prayer for them so that they can experience what the anointing is like.

Next week sit near a person being anointed. They'll have name tags and will be seated near the ends of the pews. Help your child to pray with the community for the sick. This is a teachable moment and you are in the best position to seize the moment and help them to understand this sacrament. Don't miss it! And remember to pray for the sick at your special family prayer time each day.

Anointing of the Sick

The Church has always prayed for the sick to be freed from pain and restored to health. Its pastoral care has its roots in the healing ministry of Jesus. The Lord was always aware of suffering and pain and responded with compassion and healing. The early Church continued Christ's healing ministry. In the Epistle of St. James we read, "Is there anyone who is sick among you? Let him summon the Priests of the Church. They should pray over him and Anoint him with oil in the name of the Lord."

The Health Ministry of St. James will be holding Anointing of the Sick at **all three Masses on October 11th & 12th**. We ask that if you would like to be Anointed that you sit toward the end of the pews and our health ministers will give you a name tag as you come into church to assist the Priests with knowing who is to be Anointed.

It has become our tradition here at St. James to Anoint at our Masses so that the whole church community may take part in the healing ministry. All are welcome to assist with the laying on of the hands as our parishioners are being Anointed.

A Note from the Parish Nurse, Pam Dennis:

It is that time of year again ... **flu shot time!** Influenza ("flu") is a contagious disease that spreads around the United States every winter, usually between October and May. Flu is caused by influenza viruses, and spread mainly by coughing, sneezing and close contact. Anyone can get the flu, but the risk of getting flu is highest among children.



Symptoms come on suddenly and may last several days. They can include: fever/chills, sore throat, muscle aches, cough, fatigue, headache and runny or stuffy nose. The flu can make some people sicker than others. These people include young children, people over 65 and older, pregnant women, and people with certain health conditions – such as heart, lung or kidney disease, nervous system disorders, or a weakened immune system. Flu vaccination is especially important for these people and anyone in close contact with them. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, each year thousands of people in the United States die from flu, and many are hospitalized. Flu vaccination is the best protection against flu and its complications.

The St. James Health Ministry will be holding flu shot administration in partner with the Sussex Shopko pharmacist and her staff on the **19th of October, from 8 am – 12: 30 pm in the Great Room.** The forms you need to fill out ahead of time will be out on a table these next two weeks in the gathering area. Shopko bills your insurance company using the forms you have filled out. Most insurance companies and Medicare cover the flu shot administration. All are welcome to take advantage of this preventative health care measure.

FIELDS OF HOPE & DREAMS

You may recall an old Tennessee Ernie Ford song "You load 16 tons, what do you get, another day older and deeper in debt". Well, last weekend volunteer gardeners, members of the Buildings & Grounds Committee and other generous parishioners nearly completed a retaining wall for our new (i.e. third) community garden. And guess what - we moved more than 16 tons. Each block in the wall weighs 77 pounds and gets filled with 50 pounds of stone after being set. There's also drainage stone that's 12 inch wide behind the wall and runs up the back side of the four foot high retaining wall followed by 16 yards of top soil to help level the surface.

We learn life by experiencing it. Individually none of us had completed this type of retaining wall before, but between our collective knowledge and a good instruction book, we did it. Take a look as you exit church on the south side of building. More important than building a wall was the building of community and the life lessons experienced. Working together (i.e. we had two adolescent boys, several teenage boys, several women and numerous men) we shared stories and experiences that will be remembered every time we drive by that wall. The mentoring and sharing by the adults was enriching, while the energy and enthusiasm of our youth helped make the project special. And the fall weather couldn't be beat. Challenges were solved, setbacks were overcome. The end result was not "deeper in debt" but richer in life's experience and enhanced by the community we developed. Not to mention the future produce that will be grown in the new garden to donate to clients of the Cooperating Churches of Sussex (CCOS) food pantry.

Thank you to the workers who helped. Thank you to the parishioner who stopped by to encourage and compliment us. And thank you to the women who brought brownies, soda, and water so we could continue to work. And finally thank you to volunteer gardeners who picked, washed and delivered produce from our other two gardens to the CCOS food pantry. 
