• This weekend is our annual Town Hall Meeting. I hope many of you are able to come. There will be a financial report, some statistics regarding the sacramental life for the past year, and we will discuss the issue of a possible Summer Mass Schedule for next year. Feel free to bring up any other issues or questions you may have. New this year we are serving refreshments! We need to use up some "leftovers" from the Mass on the Grass!



• I met with Fr. Steve Capitelli, rector of St. Alban's Episcopal Church. In celebration of St. Francis of Assisi, Fr. Steve and I are going to offer together a blessing of the animals. Put on your calendar Saturday, October 3rd, at 11:00 am at the Lions Pavilion in Sussex Park. Bring your lovable pets.

• *The fruit of righteousness is sown in peace for those who cultivate peace.* What wise and consoling words we have this weekend from our patron, St. James. *Wisdom from above is first of all pure, then peaceable, gentle, compliant, full of mercy and good fruits.*

• Pope Francis is becoming known as the Pope of Mercy. He has declared a special year of mercy, beginning December 8th of this year. I'm eager to hear how he will convey this mercy this coming week as he visits the United States. We have a special invitation from Good Shepherd Parish to watch his address to Congress on Thursday with them. Further details are found elsewhere in this bulletin.

• In today's selection from the gospel of Mark, Jesus acknowledges that the just person often suffers at the hands of others for doing the right thing. The first reading from the Book of Wisdom recognizes that this is nothing new in the human condition. But we are assured that *if the just one be the son of God, God will defend him and deliver him from the hand of his foes.*

• Of course we see this fulfilled in the experience of Jesus. But when the author refers to "the son of God" I don't think it only applies to Jesus. Anyone who attempts to navigate life with Divine Direction is a son or daughter of God. We don't

have to look very far to discover how such people often pay a personal price for promoting what is in harmony with God's justice. The stories about "whistle blowers" we often hear is but one example.

• And I suspect not all who hear Pope Francis will welcome his challenging words with open hearts and open minds. Pope Francis has made it a regular practice to focus light on the many ways we fall short in caring for the needy and being good stewards of our "common home."

• We pray this week that we might be people of Wisdom, welcoming the challenging Word of God as our "GPS" for navigating this world.

FIELDS OF HOPE & DREAMS And HOLY GROUND GARDEN

Fall has officially arrived (i.e. Sept. 23) and with it our community gardens have started to wind down. We've cleared five raised beds in the Holy Ground garden mainly due to the disease that struck our tomatoes. There's still some tomatoes left along with an abundance of kale, peppers and egg plants. In the Field of Hope garden there's a couple of empty raised beds too, but we still have Swiss chard, cucumbers, beets and dill there. And in the Field of Dreams garden, we still have beans, beets, kohlrabi and kale left. Volunteers, God willing, will be harvesting vegetables for the next month or so depending upon the weather.



Once all of Holy Ground's raised beds are empty, we'll fill the aisles with bark mulch (i.e. wood chips) for weed control, like the other two gardens. And in Spring, we'll complete the filling of the raised bed frames with compost/top soil to further complete the garden, if a garden is ever complete. And we have a number of green tomatoes that we will be ripening indoors due to an early harvest because of the disease.

Overall, we are ahead of last year's donation to the Cooperating Churches of Sussex's (CCOS) food pantry, which was expected due to the addition of the Holy Ground garden, but that wasn't guaranteed. Many conditions effect production within a season, such as weather, and are beyond a gardeners' control. So we have to be thankful that once again we've been blessed with a good and an abundant harvest. Thank you again for supporting the CCOS food pantry, and our garden initiatives.
