**PEW VIEW  
WHOSE NAME IS NEXT?**

The chalice which Archbishop ListECKI will use at the Confirmation Liturgy this coming Tuesday has great historical meaning to St. James Parish. The chalice was bequeathed to St. James by Fr. Richard Walsh, one of three priest-sons of this parish. In his bequest letter, Fr. Walsh stated, "The chalice was originally given to Richard F. Salmon by his family on the occasion of his ordination to the priesthood in 1906." (Fr. Salmon was the first priest-son from St. James.)

Fr. Walsh continues in his bequest letter, "Father Salmon died, as I recall about 1936 or 37. I entered the seminary in 1937 at which time the brother, Robert, and Sister, Gert, of Father Salmon told me that if I were ordained I could have Father Salmon's chalice." Fr. Walsh received the gift when he was ordained a deacon on St. Patrick's Day in 1945.

On the occasion of Fr. Walsh's 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of his ordination to the priesthood he had the chalice and paten regilted. The paten was engraved with his name and ordination date along with the name of Fr. Salmon and his ordination date. The paten was secured to the bottom of the chalice.

Fr. Walsh goes on to explain that the Salmon family homestead was on the northwest corner of what is now Townline and Plainview while the Walsh homestead was at the northeast corner of Townline and Good Hope Roads. Fr. Walsh further wrote, "Because both the Salmon and Walsh families were original members of St. James the chalice may be of interest to the parish members. And, who knows, there might even be other priest-sons ---- or daughters (it surely wouldn't bother me) ---- whose name and ordination date could be engraved there on."

As we celebrate the sacrament of Confirmation this Tuesday and as we sing, "Lord, send forth your Spirit," let us pray that the Holy Spirit may be poured out not only on our confirmands but upon our whole Church. Who knows, there might be a name or two from those listed on the cover of our bulletin today (or anywhere else in our pews) yet to be engraved on our historic and sacred chalice!

Fr. Walsh has since died and is buried in St. James Cemetery as is Fr. Salmon. A third priest-son from our parish, Fr. John Schmitz, was ordained in 1952 and is retired but still an active priest in Ripon, Wisconsin.

Congratulations to our confirmands and thank you to their parents, sponsors, catechists, and all who have supported them and journeyed with them to this sacramental celebration.

"Lord, indeed, send out your Spirit...and renew the face of the earth!"

### God's Call to Love and Respect Others

To know that we are children of God is to live in complete love with deep abiding security and the ability to dream, to sing, to create, to laugh, and to play without worry. It is a freedom to love—with full trust and confidence—the creatures whom God has sent to us in our world. As we grow older, we face a new reality. We cannot approach all God's creation with the same trust and confidence. We learn, through sometimes hurtful and damaging experiences, that some people reject the ability that God gave them to love and respect others—they ignore God's call to love and respect others.

### Keeping God's Children Protected and Safe

To know that we are children of God is to live in complete love, with deep abiding security and the ability to dream, to sing, to create, to laugh, and to play without worry. As we grow older, we face a new reality—we cannot approach all God's creation with the same trust and confidence. We learn, through sometimes hurtful and damaging experiences, that some people reject the ability that God gave them to love and respect others—they ignore God's call. The Archdiocese of Milwaukee's program to safeguard children helps remind us of these very facts. With the help of this program, the faithful are guided and educated about the responsibility of how to keep God's children protected and safe.

### Inspire Others to Participate in Abuse Prevention

You can help create a safer environment for children by inspiring others to participate in your community's abuse prevention efforts. This could be as simple as identifying one person each week who hasn't participated in your parish's awareness sessions or other abuse prevention activities, and offering them information about how they can help. If you focus on the baby steps—in this case, identifying and inviting one person per week to get involved in preventing abuse—during the next 12 months you could realistically recruit more than four dozen people to your community's abuse prevention efforts. Wow! That could have some real impact. But remember . . . baby steps. Otherwise, the long-term goal may become too overwhelming to keep you inspired.

### Five Steps to Safer Environments

The Archdiocese of Milwaukee mandates that all people who work and volunteer with children and youth in our parishes and schools must undergo safe environment education. The education details five steps to prevent child sexual abuse: Know the warning signs of an inappropriate relationship with a child.

- Control access to children by carefully selecting the adults who work with children and youth.
- Monitor all programs for the safety of children and youth.
- Be aware of and sensitive to what is going on in the lives of children.
- Communicate concerns to the appropriate person in authority.

Most people in our jails and prisons suffer from mental health and/or addiction issues. Since 1990 the rate and cost of incarceration in WI has risen from \$200 million to \$1.3 billion – twice that of our neighbor MN with similar population - more than we spend on our University system. Incarceration of non-violent dependent individuals rather than treatment comes at a cost – in fact twice the cost of drug, alcohol, and mental health treatment. It also comes at a cost in our God given human dignity, broken families, broken communities and increased recidivism. ## Fields of Hope & Dreams Community Gardens

April 15<sup>th</sup> - Tax Day. Did you pay your taxes? Better yet did you plant your peas? An old wives' tale tells of men going to town to pay their taxes while women would go to the garden to plant their peas. Different parts of the country connect planting peas (and other cool weather crops) to holidays so they'll remember when to start planting. In Maine for example, they plant peas on Patriot's Day, or the third Monday in April, which commemorates the Battles of Lexington and Concord, the first battles of the American Revolutionary War. Many Irish swear by St. Patrick's Day or March 17<sup>th</sup>, celebrating the patron saint of Ireland as the day to plant peas. St. Patrick's Day may have worked last year when temperatures were warmer, but this year Tax Day seems more appropriate. Peas come in three separate varieties to suit your pleasures. They are: *Pisum sativum* **sweet peas** (inedible pod) and **snow peas** (edible flat pod with small peas inside) - think Stir Fry and then *Pisum macrocarpon* or **snap**

 **peas** (edible pod with full-sized peas inside). Snap peas have a hard time making it to the kitchen. They're so sweet they get consumed like berries on a bush while being picked. The vines are edible too once the peas are done. Just cut them up and add them to your salads. If you want peas before the Fourth of July (great for eating raw with dip or to add to a holiday picnic salad) you'll need to plant your peas soon. Plants start bearing about 65 to 70 days after direct seed sowing into the ground. They'll stop producing once temperatures exceed 75 degrees. You can begin planting peas, spinach, lettuce, onions, radishes and parsnips once ground temperatures reach 40 degrees. Our two gardens reached that temperature last week and continue to warm. With such a short growing season, think about a succession crop you'll want to plant in July when the peas are done. That way you'll produce more out of the garden space you have.
